



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Letter from St. Thérèse to Fr. Belliere July 18, 1897 (Letter 258) - Part Two



J.M.J.T.—Jesus +

I would like to try to make you understand by a very simple comparison how much Jesus loves even imperfect souls who entrust themselves to Him: Suppose that a father has two mischievous and disobedient children, and that coming to punish them he sees one who trembles and goes away from him in terror, yet having in his heart the feeling that he deserves to be punished; and that his brother, on the contrary, throws himself into the father's arms saying that he regrets having hurt him, that he loves him and that, to prove it, he will be good from now on. Then this child asks his father to punish him with a kiss. I do not believe that the heart of the happy father can resist the filial confidence of his child whose sincerity and love he knows. He is not unaware, however, that his son will fall back into the same faults more than once, but he is ready to forgive him always, if his son still seizes his heart. I am not telling you anything about the first child, my dear little brother; you must understand if his father can love him so much and treat him with the same indulgence as the other...

But why talk to you about the life of trust and love? I explain myself so badly that I have to wait for Heaven to talk to you about this happy life. What I wanted to do today was console you. Ah! how happy I would be if you welcomed my death as Mother Agnes of Jesus does. You are probably unaware that she is twice my sister and that it was she who served as my mother in my childhood. Our good Mother was very afraid that her sensitive nature and her great affection for me would make my departure very bitter to her; the opposite happened. She speaks of my death as of a celebration and it is a great consolation for me. I beg you, my dear little brother, try like her to persuade yourself that instead of losing me you will find me, and that I will never leave you again.

Ask the same grace for the Mother whom you love and whom I love even more than you love her, since she is my visible Jesus. I would gladly give you what you ask for if I had not taken a vow of poverty, but because of it I cannot even have an image. It is our Mother alone who can satisfy you, and I know that she *will* satisfy your desires. Precisely, in view of my approaching death, my sister photographed me for the feast of our Mother. The novices exclaimed when they saw that I was looking a bit serious. It seems that I am usually more smiling; but believe, my little brother, that if my photograph does not smile at you, my soul will



not stop smiling at you when she will be near you.

Farewell, my dear and very beloved brother, believe that I will be your true little sister for all eternity.

Mission Appeal This Weekend



THIS WEEKEND, August 9 and 10, is the Annual Mission Co-Op Appeal. BISHOP AMALRAJ of the Diocese of Ootacamund in India (established in 1955 by Pope Pius XII) is here to speak at all this weekend's Masses.

A second collection will be taken for his Diocese.

The Diocese of Ootacamund is located in the mountainous region of Tamil Nadu, India. With a Catholic population of approximately 98,000 (five percent of the population), the Diocese is served by 150 priests, 415 religious, and serves 67 parishes, 226 mission stations, and 22 high schools. Two-thirds of the population is illiterate, and most families rely on daily-wage labor, earning about \$4 per day.

The Diocese is home to several indigenous tribes, who face barriers to education due to lack of proper roads. The Diocese has been blessed with a high number of vocations to the priesthood and religious life. However, limited resources make it challenging to support seminarians preparing for priesthood.

Funds raised through this appeal will be used specifically for the education of children in orphanages and the support of seminarians in the Diocese. The Bishop is grateful for your generosity and prayers.

The Assumption signifies that Mary, having completed her earthly mission, was honored by God with this extraordinary grace, serving as a sign of hope and the promise of eternal life for all faithful Christians. This event highlights the belief in the resurrection of the body and the eternal life promised to all who follow Christ.




The Relics of St. Thérèse of Lisieux Are Coming!

as opposed to love as self-fulfillment.


If we get love wrong, we get everything wrong because **God IS Love**. Without realizing it, we often try to live our Christianity without Christ, with just our human love and goodness.



DID YOU KNOW? Far-reaching effects of child abuse:

Children who suffer from sexual abuse run a greater risk of negative associated outcomes, not only with their mental health, but also suicidal tendencies, potential future abuse, more cognitive deficits, or lower educational interests and efforts. Abused children are also at higher risk for eating disorders, obesity, early onset of puberty, or chronic health issues. Ultimately, abuse has far-reaching consequences beyond childhood for many victims, and it is critical to act quickly to protect potential victims. It's important to remember that any intervention or supportive response from a safe adult can reduce the risk of many or all negative outcomes. 
