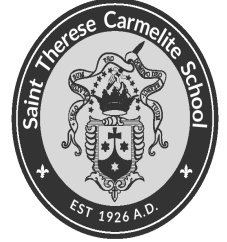

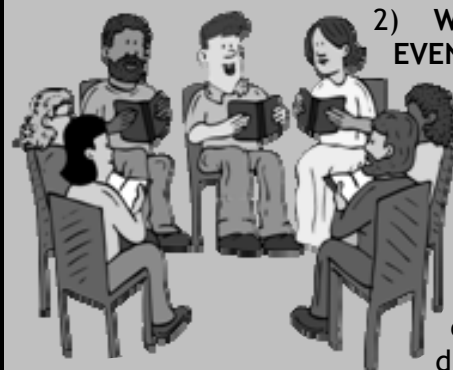

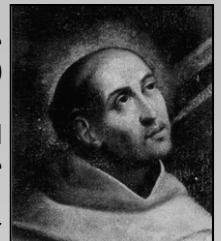
### REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS:
