

DESE & RGSD WELCOME COMMUNITY FOR PUBLIC HEARING AT WESTVIEW MIDDLE

The Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education hosted a public hearing for Riverview Gardens School District on Tuesday, May 24.

At the hearing, Interim Superintendent Dr. Joylynn Pruitt-Adams gave an update on the state of the District. Discussion topics included: leadership; effective teaching and learning; collaborative climate and culture; data-based decision making; accessments aligned to Missouri Learning Standards; equity and access; and continuous improvement.



Community members, scholars, staff and other District stakeholders then participated in a community engagement activity that allowed attendees to discuss ways in which the District could improve and how resources could be utilized in order to regain full accreditation.

The meeting was well-attended. Several local elected officials were present and participated in the community engagement activity. Guests were also treated to a theatre performance by Westview Middle scholars.

HARSLEY & HOLT APPOINTED TO SPECIAL ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD

The Missouri State Board re-appointed three members and appointed two new members, to the Riverview Gardens School District's Special Administrative Board, setting a staggered final term of office for the five appointed members to expire no later than June 30, 2024, allowing for their transition off the SAB through local elections in April 2023 and 2024.

The three SAB members re-appointed today are Veronica Morrow-Reel, Reggie Jones, and Mary F. Oswald. The two new SAB members are Tommie Harsley III and Shannon Holt. Harsley and Holt will fill the SAB seats of Lynn Beckwith Jr. and Miranda Avant-Elliot.

Harsley is the pastor of Grace New Covenant Church in St. Louis. As a practicing attorney for more than 30 years, Harsley has devoted a significant portion of his career to advising and representing faith-based and charitable organizations.

Holt is a respected spiritual leader and a dedicated community spokesperson, who also serves as an Alderman in the City of Dellwood. Holt currently works as a teacher for the Special School District of St. Louis.

During the State Board meeting December 2021, the State Board approved Commissioner Vandeven's recommendation to begin a transition to return the district to local governance, which allowed voters to have the opportunity to elect two new members — Niketia Coleman and Wanda Lane — to the SAB in April 2022.

In 2020, we were forced to pivot to remote learning. In 2021, we pivoted to hybrid, only to pivot back to full in-person learning in 2022.

Having to deal with the challenges of being remote for a year-and-a-half and our own as well as our scholars' social, emotional, and mental health has been a challenge. Yet,here we are at the conclusion of the year still standing strong.

Most recently our board of education has sworn in two new board members. To those who came out to the state public hearing, hearing your comments and involvement truly meant more to us than you will know. We heard you on those things on how we can do better as a school district and how we can reach out to the community to make a difference to our scholars. The board also on Tuesday recently approved flex hours for this summer that will be an additional hour a day Monday through Thursday with the Central Office closing at noon on Friday. The board of education recently approved a pay increase for our summer school programs. If you are a teacher instead of \$25 an hour, we are offering \$50 an hour etc... Anyone who is hourly will have that hourly rate doubled. We want to celebrate our faculty and staff at the central office with food trucks, music, and games. We appreciate all the challenging work you have done this year. As the administrative team and SAB, we will continue to focus on how we can improve our salary to make it more competitive. This year we are reinstating honoring our retirees for the RGSD school district.

To our parents, thank you for entrusting your young scholars to us. know that we are doing our best to ensure that they are getting the best education possible while in a safe environment. I look forward to next year as we embark on a New View on the horizon.
