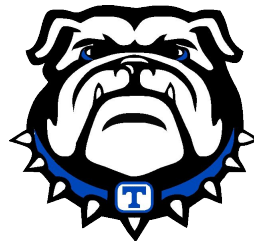
## **Classroom Visits and Volunteers**
