Students are learning about the number 10. We spent a math class discovering ways to make ten using our Unifix cubes, counters, and crayons. Students are also working on comparing numbers using the terms greater, less, and same.

We continue to work on patterns. Students can identify simple patterns- ABC, ABBC, ABCCD and identify what comes next.

This week students learned about the letters i, o, g, and s. They practiced reading CVC words with the letters we have

already covered so far this year. They also learned the sight word 'the'. As we read the Scholastics reader, we practice recognizing the word 'the'. You can help with this as you read stories at home.




Third and Fourth Grade Classroom Ms. Turnquist

This week in science students tested the water of our turtle tank to see how compatible it would be for salmon. We tested turbidity, dissolved oxygen, pH, nitrates, and temperature. We learned that the high temperature of our tank caused an increase in the level of nitrates which is what caused the algae in the tank this in turn resulted in a high turbidity level that would make it hard for salmon to navigate. The temperature also causes the dissolved oxygen to be unreadable.

Students determined this would be bad for salmon as they breathe through their gills but it doesn't affect the turtle because they do not take their oxygen from the water.
