- 1. A separate statement must be made to the clerks of the several townships in which the district is in part situated, giving the number of children five years of age and under twenty years residing in that part of the district lying within their respective townships. Do not use additional blanks.
2. If there is not space on this page sufficient to contain the names of all the children in the district, write the remainder upon ordinary foolscap paper, properly ruled, and attach the same to this sheet.
3. The ages of the children must be given as they are on June 1, 1915. If a child removes from the district during the fifteen days preceding June 1, he should be enrolled in the district in which he is resident June 1.
