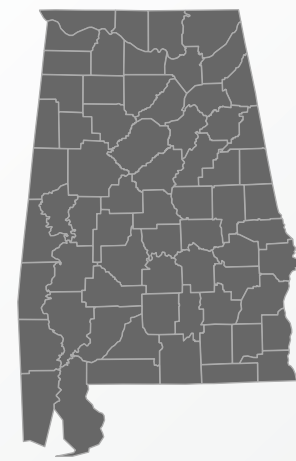

An economic boost similar to hosting the Super Bowl **20x**

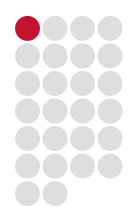

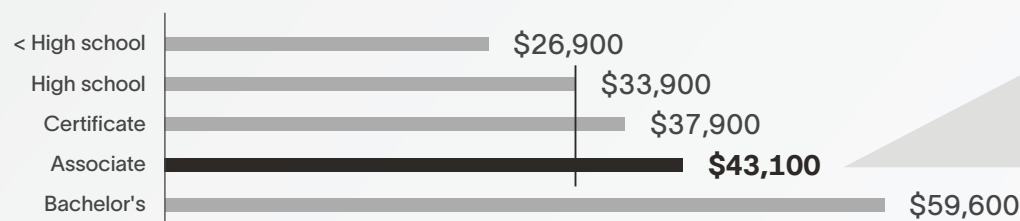

Investment analysis

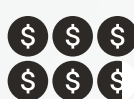


Average earnings by education level at career midpoint



The average associate degree graduate from ACCS will see an increase in earnings of **\$9,200** each year compared to someone with a high school diploma working in Alabama.

For every **\$1...**



Students gain **\$5.60** in lifetime earnings



Taxpayers gain **\$1.20** in added tax revenue and public sector savings



Society gains **\$6.50** in added income and social savings
