TTK and Kindergarten

Kindergarten News- Kindergarten students have completed Chapter 2 in math, where they practiced comparing and writing numbers from 0 to 5. They will soon begin working with numbers 6 through 9, focusing on counting and number formation.

In reading, students are continuing to build foundational pre-reading skills. They are practicing identifying the beginning, middle, and ending sounds in words (e.g., *fish* – /f/, /i/, /sh/). You can support this at home by asking your child to identify the first and last sounds in familiar words. We have also wrapped up our Nursery Rhymes unit and are beginning a new unit on Fables.

TK News- Transitional Kindergarten students are learning how to sort and classify objects based on different attributes. They are working with numbers 1 through 5 and developing early math skills through hands-on exploration.

Our "All About Me" unit has concluded, and before starting our "Families" unit, students are listening to classic tales. The first story in this series is *The Lion and the Mouse*. In writing, TK students are practicing prewriting strokes by using a variety of materials to make horizontal and vertical lines.

Whew! It has been a busy, full week in first and second grade!

We have been learning about weathering and erosion. Students did an activity investigating how rocks are weathered by water and then eroded downstream.

Students continue to learn about place value in math. First graders should understand the meaning of digits in the ones and tens place. Second graders should have an understanding of digits to 1,000.

Students wrote great narratives about a scarecrow. They used the writer's process and incorporated narrative writing components such as character, setting, and plot.
