

List of Clubs at PVHS 2019-2018

Anime Club – Mr. Paulus – a club for the study and drawing of anime. Membership is open to all.

Asian-Pacific – Mr. Wolstenholm – a club for the study of Asian-Pacific culture and the dancing of native dances. Membership is open to all.

ASTRA – Ms. Walters – a community service club sponsored by ALTRUSA International. This club performs many different kinds of community service within our city. Membership is open to all.

AVID - Mr. Authier, Ms. Baastad, Mr. Dodson, Ms. Lopez, Mr. Wolstenholm, Mr. Ilac – Advancement Via Individual Determination – a club to support students with the determination to pursue education after high school. AVID is designed for those students who will be the first college attendees in their families, and who need the support to get there. Membership is by application.
