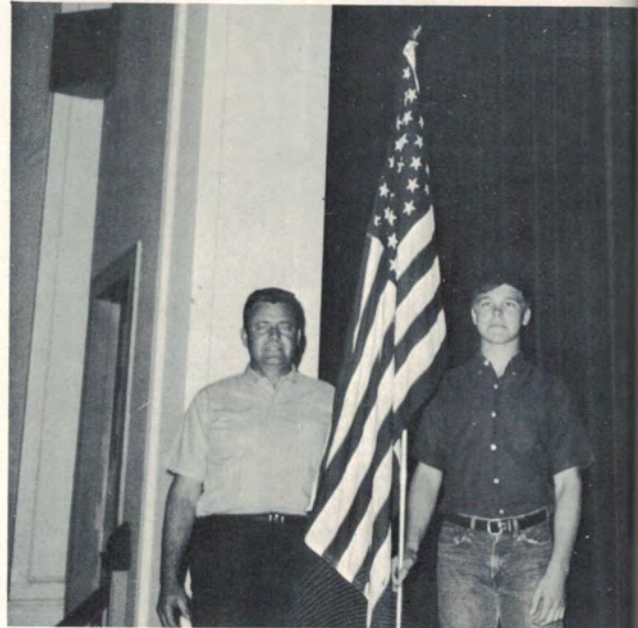

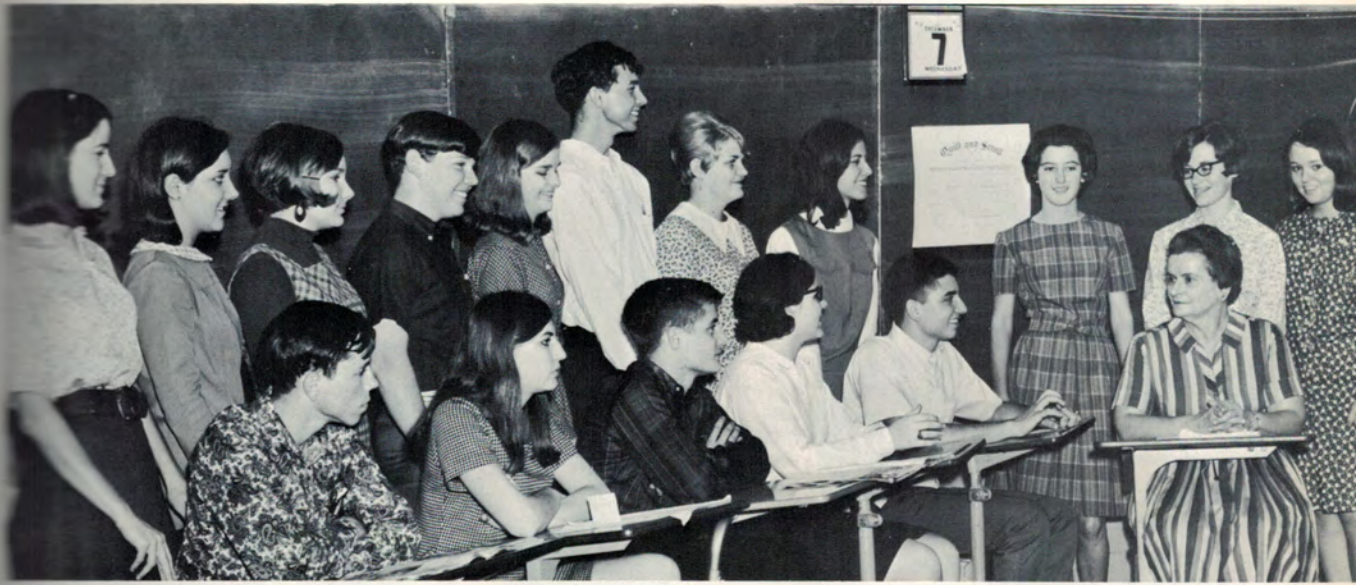

# People On Their Way

For the past five consecutive years, Bunkie High won first place at Central Louisiana Rally held at Louisiana College. This achievement was made through hard work and in the face of stiff competition. Each year the contestants became more apprehensive at the possibility of bowing out as the perennial first place winner. Even though we will continue to point with pride to our past record, dropping to fourth place in the literary division this year and last place in the speech and music division already has us thinking "Just wait until next year!"

## Bunkie High last in speech, music rally Saturday

Bunkie High School finished last in a four-school Class AA-A competition Saturday, in the speech and music competition of the 46th Cenla High School Rally held at Louisiana College.

Leesville High School finished with 31 points in music and 25 points in speech to win the AA-A category with a 56-point total. Rapides High, in its first year of competition, was second with 28 points and Marksville High had 25, with Bunkie High scoring 16.

Bunkie High was second in speech competition with 18 points behind Leesville, while Rapides had 11.

Andy O'Brien led Bunkie in the speech division, with two first places. He won the boys extemporaneous division and the boys interpretative reading. Also taking a first place for Bunkie was Susan Durham winning the girls extemporaneous speaking division.

Bunkie gained a superior rating in the music division, when freshman Hunter Nibert was rated superior in the boys solo, high voice. Candace Andrus took excellent in the girls solo, high voice division, and Bunkie's girls trio was the only Class AA-A group to get an excellent rating.

## BHS steps down as rally king

Bunkie High School's record of winning the Central Louisiana Literary Rally for five straight years was shattered last weekend, as the local school finished fourth in the field on the Louisiana College campus.

Bunkie's bid for a sixth straight crown failed Friday and Saturday in the 46th annual rally as Rapides High, in its first year of competition, finished first with 92 points. Leesville, with 86 points, was second in the Class A-AA division, Bunkie finished fourth and Marksville was fifth.

The local entry had no double winners but Hunter Nibert, who captured first place in Algebra I, also won first in the boy's high voice division of the music rally held at the same time. In all, Bunkie had five first place literary winners.

Two Bunkie High students won first place in French. Cornell Jeansonne won in French I and Donna Roy took the title in French II. Other first place winners were Sarah Tanner, first in Home Economics II, and Lorraine McDaniels, first place in geometry.

Andy O'Brien took second in American history and advanced math and Susan Tanner was second in Trigonometry and third in English IV.

Other Bunkie point-getters were Mary Ann Rabalais, third in general history; Alan Cawthon, third in English pronunciation; Sarah Reed, second in English II.

Glenda Baronne, third in spelling; Cathy Ducote, third in bookkeeping; Terry Partyka, third in general business; Sterling Bain, second in physics; Virginia Wright second in general mathematics; Phil Israel, second in Algebra II; and Susan Tanner, second in trigonometry.

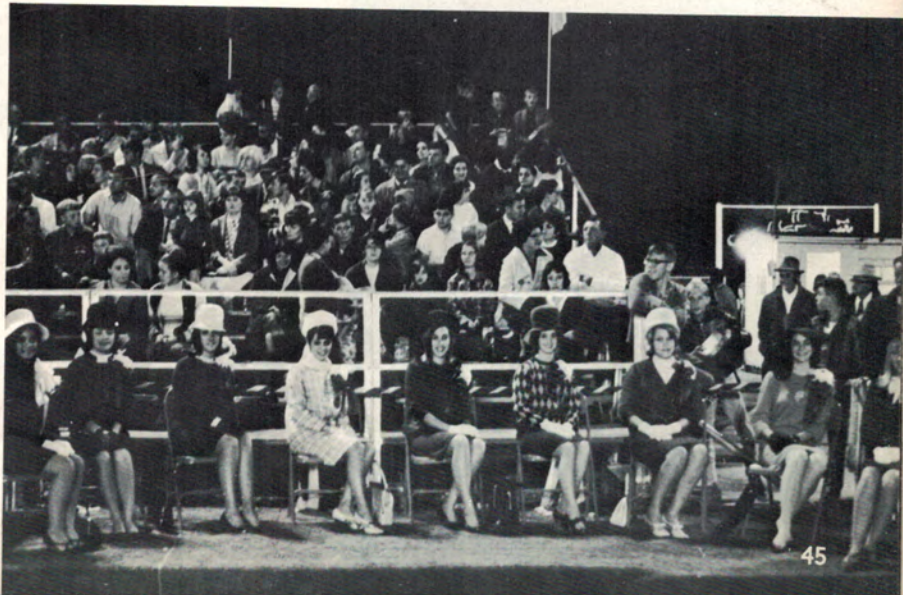
