
PRINCIPAL/EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTION AND ACCOUNTABILITY

Greetings Knights Community Family,

I'm excited to share that our school team is working hard to help scholars achieve academically. We are specifically working on increasing the Lexile Levels of all scholars. We had our Reading Kickoff earlier this semester and every Pre-K – 5th grade scholar received a book. Our most recent Achieve 3000 school wide assembly was a success! Scholars were informed about the monthly celebrations we are going to have as an incentive when they read a minimum of (4) articles a month. We recognized 25 scholars who are College and Career Ready during our school wide assembly.

In an effort to keep our goal of increasing Lexile Levels, we are keeping scholar data front and center because we are focused and intentional about academic success. To that end, all scholars completed Universal Screeners to get their baseline data. The best part of this is that they now have Scholar Data Notebooks and they've been meeting with their teachers and our Data Coach to discuss their data. This allows scholars to be aware of how they are performing academically and to set goals for the next level.

We are now celebrating Pre-K Week (October 2-6, 2023) and the theme for the entire week is about reading. Community members, partners, high school scholars and other stakeholders have come to Stewart County Elementary School to read to our Pre-K scholars. Parents and guardians, we would like you to help write a new narrative about the Stewart County School District. I believe in our scholars and the dynamic team of educators serving in the district. I am asking you to continuously come to the building and get involved with our scholars' education. I am happy to say the 2023–2024 school year is off to a great start! My name is Ms. Alesha Allen, and I'm honored to be serving as the school district's Academic Coach and MTSS/RTI Coordinator. I want to take this opportunity to introduce myself and share an overview of the MTSS/ RTI implementation plan.

All of our scholars, regardless of need and achievement level, deserve to be supported academically and socially and to develop a sense of belonging and confidence. My job is to support staff and administration through the use of data in the process of identifying and supporting every scholar. The Stewart County School District (SCSD) strives to cultivate an empowering culture by providing scholars with research-based curriculum and interventions, rigorous and effective teaching, and early identification of academic and behavioral needs to ensure lifelong scholar success.

To achieve these goals, SCSD utilizes a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) that integrates a unified preventative response and service delivery model that recognizes the joint influence of academic, social, and behavioral functioning on educational performance. At its heart, MTSS is designed as a school improvement initiative to support better educational outcomes such as increasing graduation rates and ensuring that our scholars are college and career-ready. This process is structured to enable all students to learn and achieve high academic and behavioral standards while meeting individual student needs, consistent with the district's commitment to educational excellence.



MTSS is "the practice of providing high-quality instruction and interventions matched to student need, monitoring progress frequently to make decisions about changes in instruction or goals, and applying child response data to important educational decisions" (Batsche et al., 2005).

CHRIS USREY TECHNOLOGY DIRECTOR

The Technology Department at Stewart County Schools is excited to announce that we were able to receive the funding applied for last school year and have been able to install all new 75 inch interactive displays in all of our High School Classrooms and now the entire district has them in all classrooms. Also we were able to purchase new laptops for all of our Teachers and updated 24 computers in our elementary lab. Along with all the updates listed above we were able to take advantage of a Department of Education grant and used the funding to replace our aging WIFI infrastructure and purchased brand new ARUBA Wireless Access Points in every classroom and public areas including the media center, gyms, and cafeteria. This wireless upgrade will insure that Stewart County Schools can provide high quality internet access for all of our students, faculty, and staff for years to come.

Other items that we are looking at updating are our security cameras and internal network infrastructure and hopefully we will have those pieces in place before year's end but the teacher devices and interactive displays were our priority to make sure that classroom instruction and teacher needs were met first before focusing on other projects!

Prior to the beginning of the school year, our bus drivers and monitors completed their mandatory annual Safety Renewal Educational Program. This program consists of an annual physical from the Georgia Department of Education along with different guidelines and regulations for them to be qualified to drive the school bus. October 16th-20th, the Stewart County School District will give recognition and appreciation to the bus drivers for School Bus Safety Week and Bus Driver Appreciation Day. In addition, scholars will take part in emergency evacuation drills that consist of the reasons to evacuate, the type of ways to evacuate and instructions when evacuating the school bus. Our scholars are consistently learning how to behave at the bus stop, how to safely ride the school bus, and they are reminded daily of the school bus rules for their safety.

Stewart County School System offers a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) to all children, ages 3-21, who reside in Stewart County and who are identified as having a disability. The mission of Stewart County School System's Program for Exceptional Students is to graduate all scholars with disabilities by offering a challenging educational program. We are committed to increasing academic performance and preparing scholars for employment and independent living after graduating from high school.

Some of our high school scholars have recently started working directly with Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency. Participating scholars will receive pre-employment transition services which include: job exploration counseling, work-based learning experiences, workplace readiness training, and counseling on opportunities for enrollment in comprehensive transition or postsecondary educational programs.

Stewart County Schools has pushed towards making sure testing and universal screeners are completed in a timely manner. During this time scholars have completed the beginning of the year assessments in the following areas: Acadience (DIBELS), GKIDS Readiness Check, PALS, PPVT, and HMH Reading & Math Growth Measure. The district is better prepared to identify scholar needs and implement plans for improving academic achievement.

The district has a structured plan of implementing scholar data notebooks. Each scholar has their own personal notebook with data from tests, quizzes, and universal screeners. Scholars are having Data Talks with the Data Coach as well as their teachers. These in-depth conversations allow scholars to discuss their data and learn about their academic strengths and needs. In these conversations, scholars receive an eye-opening experience with the results from the universal screeners and are able to better understand how they can improve. Scholars have also set goals and strategies for attaining those goals. After the second round of screeners, scholars will have the opportunity to evaluate themselves academically and determine whether they have met their goals.

My role is to make sure that our scholars come to school every day and make sure that the social and emotional needs of our scholars are met. Social emotional learning (SEL) is the process by which people acquire, obtain, and execute the knowledge, attitudes, and skills that are needed to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve goals, demonstrate empathy, build and maintain happy and healthy relationships, and make sound choices.

Social emotional learning enables students to be more prepared for college and post-secondary workforce endeavors. Scholars who possess these skills are better able to resolve conflict, communicate, take on leadership roles, assume responsibility/accountability, are more able to manage time and stress, problem solve, have a more optimistic mindset, as well as are able to collaborate and work efficiently with others. This is critical to productivity and efficiency. Along with making sure their social and emotional needs are met, I also monitor school attendance and work with school administrators, students, parents, and the school support team with a focus on keeping scholars in school, improving scholar and school attendance rates and educating staff and families. I look forward to serving the scholars and parents of the Stewart County School District.
