

# Did you know that every Georgia student gets 30 hours to use towards Dual Enrollment?

*\*Academic Dual Enrollment (DE) is open to all 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who meet the requirements set by the college. 10<sup>th</sup> grade students can take CTAE Dual Enrollment and may qualify for academic Dual Enrollment if they have a 1200 SAT or a 26 ACT Score*

## Dual Enrollment Opportunities in Houston County:

**Houston County Career Academy (HCCA) ~** This is a county program that serves all high schools, transportation is provided, and there are limited slots. The HCCA offers specific technical programs through DE with Central GA Technical College (CGTC) and Middle GA State University (MGA) for students who qualify. To apply students must register during the advisement process and see their counselor. Students are selected based on criteria set forth by HCCA and availability in the program. Some of these programs are a two-year commitment and will require the use of *two* periods in the student's schedule each semester. These slots are competitive and not everyone is guaranteed a seat in the program.

**\*\*The Dual Enrollment hours needed vary by program (see back of page for hours each program utilizes). Some of these programs can also utilize HOPE Grant hours to complete the course once Dual Enrollment funding is exhausted.**

**On-Campus DE ~** Options for on campus DE opportunities.

- US History – Taught in 11<sup>th</sup> grade
  - HIST 2111 (fall)                      - HIST 2112 (spring)
  - \*Both are required if taking on the high school campus
- Dual Enrollment options in 12<sup>th</sup> grade
  - ENGL 1101 (fall)                      - ECON 1101
  - ENGL 1102 (spring)                      - SOCI 1101                      - MATH 1111 (College Alg.)

**\*\*Each of these courses uses 3 DE hrs.**

**Traditional DE ~** DE can be taken at several colleges in the state of GA, a full list of participating colleges and courses offered can be found on [GAFutures.org](http://GAFutures.org). Students are responsible for setting up a meeting with their high school counselor, applying to the college of their choice, having their high school transcript sent, and registering for coursework at the college (available DE courses at each college are also on [GAFutures.org](http://GAFutures.org)). Students must let their counselor know they are applying for DE and bring their counselor their registration document for the college classes each semester by the deadline set by the Houston County School District to qualify for DE funding each term. Students are responsible for transportation and any fees not covered by DE funding (lab fees and book fees may apply).

**\*\*Hours used in this format will depend on courses students take.**

**All three of these options require students and parents to complete the DE Funding Application on [GAFutures.org](http://GAFutures.org) once a year to receive funding for course work at the college level**

**Students can choose to use their funding in a variety of ways, and the Houston County School District strives to offer many opportunities for students. If you need assistance understanding your options, please make an appointment with your counselor.**

## **Houston College and Career Academy Coursework**

The following programs at HCCA require students to utilize dual enrollment funding to participate. The programs with asterisks below can utilize HOPE Career Grant funds to complete the program at HCCA. If a student utilizes HOPE Grant funds it will impact on students total HOPE hours available after graduation.

**\*Automotive – 17 DE hrs. (2-year program)**

**Barbering – 9 DE hrs.**

**Cosmetology – 13 DE hrs.**

**\*Criminal Justice – 24 DE hrs. (2-year program)**

**Culinary Arts – 12 DE hrs.**

**\*Cybersecurity-18 DE hrs.**

**\*Engineering – 10 DE hrs.**

**\*Fire Safety – 15 DE hrs.**

**\*Health/EMR – 11 DE hrs.**

**\*Health/ CNA – 10 DE hrs.**

**\*HVAC – 24 DE hrs. (2-year program)**

**\*Information Technology – 8 DE hrs.**

**\*Industrial Safety – 21 DE hrs. (2-year program)**

**\*Welding – 23 DE hrs. (2-year program)**
