The Nurse Says...

<u>Emergency Medications</u>- Please make sure all emergency medications and emergency health care plans are up to date in the Health Office. If you have not picked up your plan, please stop by the Health Office. <u>If you carry medication, it must be approved by the school nurse.</u> This needs to be done annually.

MEDICATIONS SHOULD NOT BE TAKEN IN THE CLASSROOM UNLESS APPROVED BY THE SCHOOL NURSE. THIS INCLUDES OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS SUCH AS TYLENOL OR ADVIL. If your student needs to take medication during school, please contact the Health Office for the correct process and forms.

<u>In School Illness</u>-If a student becomes ill during the school day, they should report to the Health Office and be evaluated by a nurse. The nurse will then contact parents/guardians for proper dismissal from school.

<u>Mandatory Physicals</u> -10th graders, please be on the lookout for a notification from the nurse regarding your mandatory school physical. Students must submit a health assessment in either 9th or 10th grade per state requirements. If you are in need of one, a letter will be mailed home. Please submit it ASAP if you were notified.

<u>Sports Physicals</u> - Athletes, please make sure your sports physicals are up to date with the school nurse. The State of Connecticut Health Assessment <u>Health Assessment Record</u> record is used for the form. You are not eligible for participation if your physical has expired. Physicals can be submitted by email to <u>garrahyr@rockyhillps.com</u> or <u>staggersa@rockyhillps.com</u> or faxed to 860-258-7646. Also, please make sure you are registered for the sport well in advance of the season starting.

Tardy due to medical/dental appointments- If your student is late due to a medical or doctors appointment please provide documentation from the provider to support this.

Absence Information

At Rocky Hill High School (RHHS), we believe that consistent attendance is essential to your child's success. Seat time equals learning time, and we want to make sure all students have the opportunity to engage in their education fully. To streamline our attendance reporting process, we are introducing a new method for reporting daily student absences, effective April 1st.

Moving forward, all student absences will be reported directly through PowerSchool. This change will help ensure that all attendance information is accurate and up-to-date in one centralized platform, providing both you and the school with a more efficient way to manage attendance matters. Thus, the google form absence form will not be an active method of reporting your child attendance. The google form at the high school will not be available after April 12th.

The instructions below to guide you through the process of reporting your child's absence via PowerSchool:

Steps to Report an Absence in PowerSchool: Here's the link to the public portal: https://rockyhill.powerschool.com/public/home.html

- Log into PowerSchool's Portal
 If you do not have an account or need to reset your password, please follow the instructions on the login page.
- 2. Navigate to the Student's Attendance Select the student whose attendance needs to be reported.

- 3. Locate the "Attendance Monitor" Icon

 Scroll down on the left-hand side of the screen to find the "Attendance Monitor" icon and click
 on it.
- 4. Click on "Report New Attendance"

 This will open the form for entering the absence details.
- 5. Enter the Absence Information
- Enter the dates for the absence. For a single-day absence, only enter the date in the left-hand field.
- Enter the reason for the student's absence.
- Specify if the student will be absent for the entire day or is tardy to school. (Medical appointments require documentation from physician).
- Enter a note regarding the absence. If the absence is due to illness, please refrain from entering confidential medical information. In such cases, we ask that you contact the school nurse directly.
- · Click Submit.
- Verify Your Submission

Once submitted, please confirm that the attendance information has been successfully recorded.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we implement this new process. If you have any questions or need assistance, please do not hesitate to reach out to the RHHS main office or the school nurse. Please be aware that attendance cannot be submitted on the PowerSchool Application at this time.

Graduation takes place every year for all students that are able to satisfy all RHBOE requirements over the duration of their high school career. In order to meet graduation requirements, students will need 25 course credits and 50 hours of community service by the end of their senior year.

Class of 2025: Senior Exit Survey

All seniors need to complete the Senior Exit Survey in <u>Naviance</u> by June 2, 2025 to receive graduation invitations (which will be distributed once they become available). Please refer to these <u>instructions</u>. The senior exit survey provides counselors with updates on plans after graduation (college, military, employment, technical/trade school, gap year, etc.).



2025-2026 Course Selection Process

Before the last day of school, school counselors will meet individually with students to review schedules and resolve any conflicts. **Changes to schedules can not be made after the last day of school.**

Parent, Athlete Reminders

- 1. Sports physicals are valid for 13 months. If the student's physical expires during the season, he/she will not be allowed to practice or play until and updated physical exam form is submitted to the nurse's office. Be sure to check your child's physical date.
- 2. First quarter grades have determined your child's initial eligibility for their winter sport and second quarter grades will determine their continuance in winter sports and their initial eligibility for spring sports. According to the CIAC, "a student can not, at any time, represent a school in interscholastic sports unless passing at least four quarter Carnegie units of work or the equivalent."

Without Officials, It's Just Practice

This has resulted in limited availability of game days during the week and in some cases, less freshmen or junior varsity level contests. friends. Students who have a strong desire to start up a new club or activity are encouraged to do


as long as they complete an application and have a staff member who is willing to supervise the club or activity.

Senior Prom Ticket Sales

Tickets for senior prom will be on sale from 4/28-5/2. Tickets can be purchased in room 1027 or 2056. the cost of a ticket is \$80 per person. Please see Ms. Brzozowski or Ms. Fliss with any questions.



Please pay attention to the following information about class dues. All students owe \$160 for class dues, which are used to help defray activity expenses, such as Class Night and Senior Picnic. Since dues are applied to Senior activities, all students, regardless of when they enter RHHS, are required to pay the full amount. All students are afforded the opportunity to fundraise to reduce these dues to avoid any financial burdens that may occur. All money is placed in the Student

Activity Fund, and receipts are issued upon payment of dues. Receipts are required as proof of payment. Information regarding the collection of dues and each year's activities will be sent home by the class advisors during the first quarter.

Students will not be able to attend events such as Class Night and Senior Picnic if their dues are not paid for by the end of Quarter 3 in their senior year. While class dues total \$160 for senior year activities, a payment plan of \$40 per year is required. Students who are not up to date on their due payments can not participate in certain class events, such as running for a class office. Please note that dues will not be applied towards proms, and there will be additional ticket costs to cover prom expenses.

- <u>Class dues</u> are a total of \$160. To make dues more affordable, we ask that you pay \$40 each year and not wait until your Senior year to pay your dues in full. However, you are more than welcome to pay them in full at any time. Cash or checks can be given to your homeroom teachers or directly to one of your advisors. Please make checks payable to <u>RHHS SAF (your student's graduation year)</u>. You may also pay online via My Payment Plus.
- Remember, to help offset class expenses, you may choose to participate in one or more of the two school-wide fundraisers held each year. The more we sell as a whole school, the more individual profit you make.
