# Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners of St. Therese:

As we enter into the season of Advent, we will hear a lot about the coming of Christ—certainly the coming of Christ at Christmas, but also, earlier in Advent, about His Second Coming at the end of time. But there is another coming of Christ that we can access every day: Holy Mass. Christ comes to us in the Eucharist to give Himself completely to us. In fact, we might say that all His comings are present in the Mass: His birth, His death and resurrection, His many comings, and His final coming. So, we might say that *the Mass is Advent in Sacrament*. Advent helps us to increase our longing for Jesus and to be with Him in Heaven. And when we long for Him in the Eucharist, we're ultimately longing for that final Communion with Him for all eternity.

If the Mass is Advent in Sacrament, Our Lady is Advent Incarnate, in the flesh. She is the person who personifies the waiting and expectation of Advent. And she waits with us in expectation for her Son to be born in our hearts and souls once again. Isaiah, the prophet of Our Lady, reminds us that "in quiet and in waiting does your strength lie" (Is. 30:15). So we must, like Our Lady, root ourselves in quiet prayer as we wait.

The rich season of Advent seems to get neglected in the Church today for two main reasons. First, there is the ever-pervasive secular culture that emphasizes the materialistic preparation for Christmas and seems to distract from a genuine spirit of quiet waiting for the Messiah. Secondly, Advent seems to be less understood than Lent and does not have the popular traditions of Lent. So, in order to truly enter into the spirit of Advent, maybe we need to slow down, simplify, and really dedicate ourselves to a prayerful waiting for Christ to come into our lives in a new way.

Advent is a season that has a distinctive spirit of joy infused into it. We, like Our Lady when she was expecting, await in joyful anticipation for the coming of Our Savior to us in a new way. But we can't experience the real joy that the Lord is waiting to pour into our hearts if we are caught up in the distractions and diversions common during this time of the year. We have to be intentional about detachment and simplifying our lives. This is why the Church marks Advent as a penitential season. We must let go of some things to be filled with even greater things or the greatest thing of all, God! So let us be generous in giving ourselves to this beautiful season in company with Our Lady. If we entrust ourselves to her, she will always lead us into a New Advent of Christ in our lives and the lives of our loved ones!

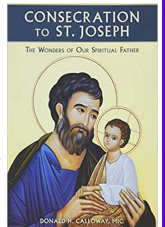

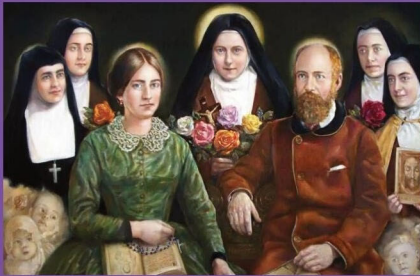

# Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration

"Each time you approach the Blessed Sacrament, remember that Jesus has been waiting for you for twenty centuries for this personal visit from you.." – St. Josemaria Escriva (January 9, 1902, to June 26, 1975), Priest and Saint of Ordinary Life



**St. Josemaria Escriva:** Despite the tribulations St. Josemaría encountered during his life, he always maintained this spirit of gratitude. Three of his siblings died when he was a young boy, and his father died when he was 22. As a priest, he was in continual danger during the Spanish Civil War, and for many years he suffered from diabetes. As the founder of Opus Dei—a personal prelature which promotes and fosters lay sanctity—he faced fierce opposition from skeptics outside the Church and from the clerical-minded within it. Yet he persevered in thanksgiving through all obstacles. He encouraged souls to be especially thankful for the Holy Eucharist: “Do not leave the church immediately after receiving the Sacrament. Surely you have nothing so important on that you cannot give Our Lord ten minutes to say thanks. Love is repaid with love.”

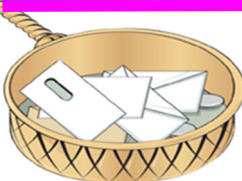

# Stay Awake !

Lately I've been listening to a science-based podcast on healthy daily living. The host frequently discusses the wide range of health benefits of sleep. So, each night I'm trying to get more, and better, slumber, and it's helping me feel energized. So, why in the world should we follow Christ's advice this week? "Watch, therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house will come ... lest he find you asleep." Isn't sleep, especially at midnight and cockcrow, a good thing?

Of course, it is. But the wakefulness the Lord calls us to is a deep, personal orientation to Him. A nightly vigil is therefore a metaphor for this, but it's not just that. We should give up real sleep in order to pray, too. This difficult practice is a time-tested way to foster wakefulness of heart. **When we give up sleep to pray, it focuses us. We learn that life is not an endless series of days.**

You and I belong to the Lord—awake or asleep, in life and in death. Sooner or later, even our need for our physical sleep will pass away. And our attentiveness to God—that is, whether we are awaiting Him to meet us—will be all that matters.

May I challenge us this week and this Advent to intentionally give up at least one hour of sleep each week for prayer? Stay up later, wake up in the middle of the night, or an hour earlier, and pray. Will we be a bit more tired the next day? Yes. But we'll be amazed at the spiritual wakefulness that results, too.

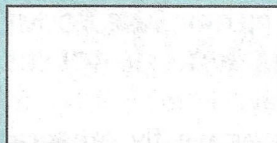

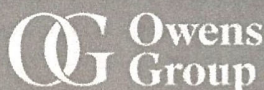
