## Kindergarten

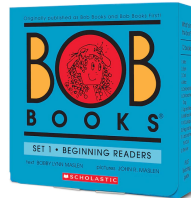

This week students learned about Ray Charles and Helen Keller. They overcame the obstacles of losing their sight and in Helen's case also her hearing. We learned that they had to rely upon their other senses to help them when they couldn't see. Hopefully your child can tell that the stories about Ray Charles and Helen Keller are biographies because they are real stories about real people.

We are finishing up Chapter 5 in math learning how to add two numbers 0-10. Students are using unifix cubes and a part-part-whole template to find pairs of numbers up to ten. They also enjoyed learning some math games to help reinforce what they are learning.

All week students worked on finishing up Chapter 4 in reading. They worked on identifying words that I read, identifying words that matched the picture, and reading three word 'sentences' and matched them to the correct picture. Next week we will continue learning new letter sounds.

We continue to work with patterns, rhyming, counting to 100 by ones and tens, and learning letter sounds. Students are also reading Bob books. They read to me to show they can move to the next book.



## First and Second Grade Explorers

Students are rocketing through this school year!

This week we started a new physical science study on "Matter." They will be looking first at how small parts can make really big things!

Next week students will be starting new math units as well. First graders will be starting Chapter 6. In this chapter they will be looking at how to count and model numbers. Second graders will be doing 2-digit subtraction.

We are really emphasizing the idea of professionalism in our words, actions, and work products. All students are working to answer questions in complete sentences. It would be very helpful if students could practice: writing his/her first and last name, memorizing addresses and phone numbers, and tying shoes at home. I told students that I would wear my "tying" shoes the first week we get back from break and THEY can show me how to tie MY shoes!
