Proposed Attendance Zone Changes | 2027-2028

Why the Attendance Zone Is Changing

The proposed change is focused on managing growth in the Centerville area while using recognizable road boundaries.

1

Provide room for growth at Centerville Elementary

More than 1,000 homes are currently planned within the Centerville Elementary attendance zone. The proposed change is intended to create additional room for future student growth.

2

Follow boundaries families recognize

Lines follow major highways, power lines, or stream corridors, so a family can tell which side of the line they live on.

3

Use a phased approach

This proposal may be the first phase of attendance-zone adjustments in the Centerville area, with the proposed change taking effect for the 2027–2028 school year.

4

Monitor residential development

The district will continue to monitor planned and active residential developments within the Centerville Elementary attendance zone as the community grows.

5

Monitor student enrollment

The district will continue to monitor student enrollment to determine whether additional attendance-zone adjustments are needed in future school years.

6

Students who are enrolled at impacted schools

Grandfathering, existing out-of-zone provisions and advance notice to families make the transition student and community friendly.

Grandfathering & Enrollment Planning

A key part of the plan is a student and community friendly transition for students and families.

Grandfathering

Students currently enrolled in an impacted school may request to remain at their current school rather than attend their newly zoned school.

*** Parents would be required to provide transportation.

Out-of-zone enrollment

- **House Bill 251** — any family may request another HCSD school with available space; the family provides transportation.
- **House Bill 224** — active-duty military families who live on the installation may request any HCSD school with available space.
- **ELL and Special Education services** — students placed at a specific school to receive services.
- **Senior Privilege** — students finishing grade 4, 7, or 11 may complete grade 5, 8, or 12 at the same school after a move within the county.

Enrollment planning note: Projected enrollment includes the proposed zoned population and current out-of-zone students for planning purposes. Actual enrollment may vary based on grandfathering decisions and other enrollment provisions.

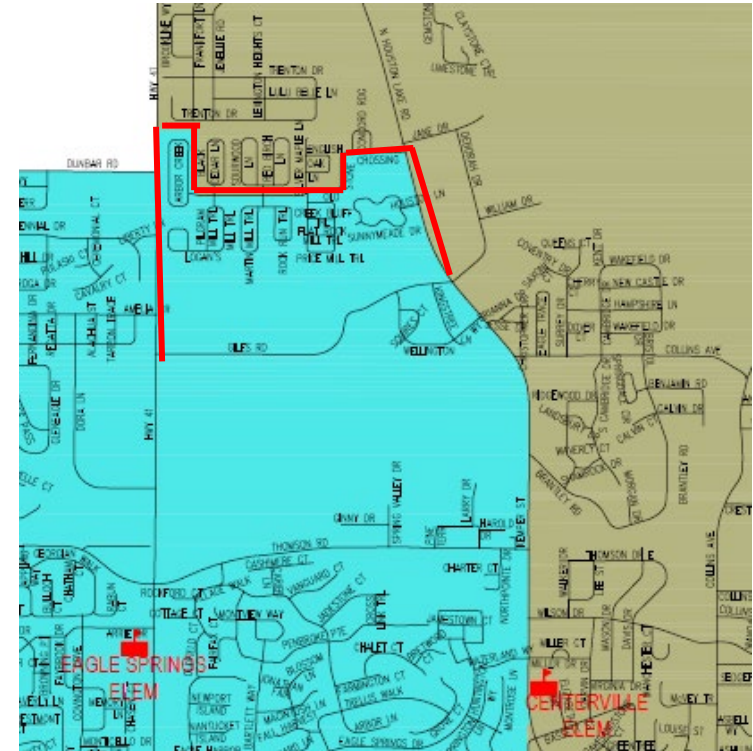

What changes

- Approximately 124 students move from Centerville Elementary to Eagle Springs Elementary.
- The Eagle Springs northern boundary shifts from Giles Road to the Old Stone Crossing / Arbor Creek Road corridor.
- Relieves enrollment pressure at Centerville as the area continues to grow.

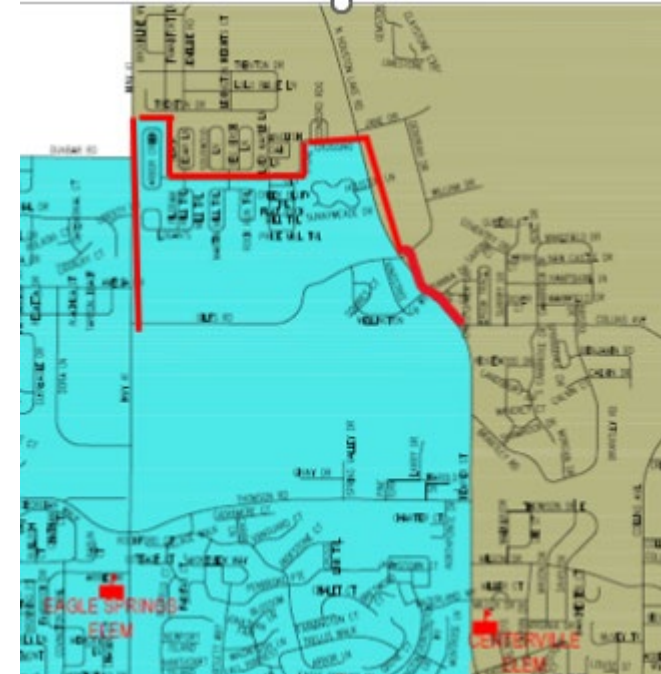
