Dear Parishioners,

This week is the last week to purchase the Year of Winnings raffle tickets. They can be purchased following the weekend Masses at St. Edward or at the Parish Offices during business hours.

Last week, I thanked those who work for Hospice programs and those who work for funeral homes. This week, I need to thank hose that provide for the various needs of those experience loss. This includes those that provide the luncheons after the funeral. Such a meal provides a social time for the mourners to gather and talk about the deceased and connect with other mourners.

There are also others who take food to the homes of the families experiencing loss. It might seem like a little thing, but in the midst of grief and turmoil, it is possible to forget to eat, or to lack time to prepare something, or being overwhelmed at even what to have. A delivered meal, or even just an entree or dessert, removes the inertia that so often accompanies the grief. This is part of the Corporal Works of Mercy.

No less important is the Spiritual Work of Mercy. We pray for the dead (I recently wrote about that), but we also comfort the grieving and afflicted. Sometimes, we won't have the words, but in the end, it is about presence more than the right words. Just being with someone

Recently, a few of our families have had a privileged place of being with their loved ones in the last hours. This is a difficult place as the emotions are often overwhelming, but it is also a place of profound grace. I have been privileged to be at the side of a number of people in their last moments – my mom, residents at the nursing home where I worked as an aide or hospital when I was a chaplain

for a summer program, and as pastor.

The death bed can be a place of profound grace and presence of God, especially for those who have prepared well for death and the families where faith has a strong hold. I also have been at the sides of some that have been difficult to witness – some because of the extreme pain that came from a family's refusal to provide for palliative care (usually in the form of an opioid). Please, if the Lord is calling a loved one home, do not be afraid to be present. You will go changed.




