


Capital Letters



Top start; around down, close up, down, and up.



Top start; down, up, around halfway, around again, touch, sidestroke, and stop.



Start below the top; curve up, around, down, and up.



Top start; down, loop right, curve up, around, close, loop right, through, and stop.



Start below the top; curve up, around to the middle, around again to the bottom line, and up.



Start below the top; down, around, up, and sidestroke. Wavy cross and a straight cross.




Bottom start; uphill high, loop through the middle, up, curve down, around, through the uphill, sidestroke, and stop.



Start below the top; make a cane. Top start, to the right; down, up, left, touch, loop right, through, and stop.



Start below the middle; sidestroke left, curve down, around, uphill high, loop down, and up.



Bottom start; curve up, around, touch on the way down under water, loop up left, and through.



Start below the top; make a cane. Top start, to the right; slant down left, touch, slant down right, and up.



Start below the top; uphill, loop down, loop right, and up.



Start below the top; make a cane, up over the hill, up over the hill again, and up.



Start below the top; make a cane, up over the hill, and up.



Top start; around down, close up, loop right, through, and stop.



Top start; down, up, around halfway, and close.



Start below the top; curve up, around, down, loop right, and up.



Top start; down, up, around halfway, close, slant down right, and up.



Bottom start; uphill high, loop through the middle, curve down, around, through the uphill, sidestroke, and stop.



Start below the top; down, around, up, and sidestroke. Wavy cross.



Start below the top; make a cane, around, up, down, and up.




Start below the top; make a cane, around, slant up right, sidestroke, and stop.



Start below the top; make a cane, around, up, down, around, up again, sidestroke, and stop.



Start below the top; curve up, slant down right, and up. Cross down left.


















Start below the top; make a cane, around up, down under water, loop up left, and through.














Start below the top; curve up, around, down, around again, and down under water, loop up left, and through.

Cursive Letter Descriptions

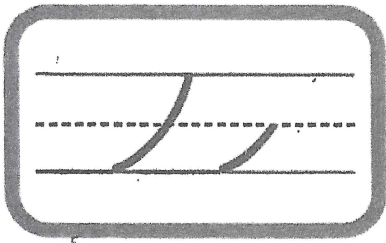
Lower-case Letters

-  Overhill; back, around down, close up, down, and up.
-  Uphill high; loop down, around, up, and sidestroke.
-  Overhill; back, around, down, and up.
-  Overhill; back, around down, touch, up high, down, and up.
-  Uphill; loop down, through, and up.
-  Uphill high; loop down under water, loop up right, touch, and up.
-  Overhill; back, around down, close up, down under water, loop up left, and through.
-  Uphill high; loop down, up over the hill, and up.
-  Uphill; down, and up. Add a dot.
-  Uphill; down under water, loop up left, and through. Add a dot.
-  Uphill high; loop down, up into a little tummy, slant down right, and up.
-  Uphill high; loop down, and up.
-  Overhill; down, up over the hill, up over the hill again, and up.
-  Overhill; down, up over the hill, and up.
-  Overhill; back, around down, close up, and sidestroke.

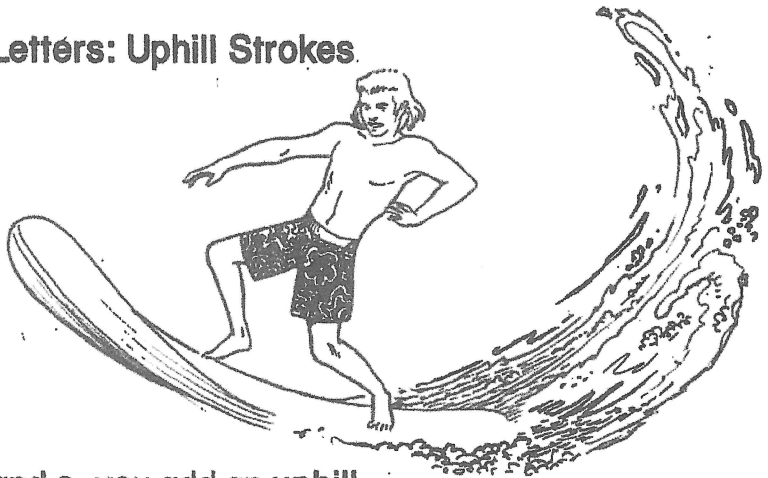
-  Uphill; down under water, up, around into a tummy, and up.
-  Overhill; back, around down, close up, down under water, loop up right, touch, and up.
-  Uphill; sidestroke, down, and up.
-  Uphill; down, around, close, and up.
-  Uphill high; down, and up. Cross.
-  Uphill; down, around, up, down, and up.
-  Overhill; down, around, up, and sidestroke.
-  Uphill; down, around, up, down, around, up again, and sidestroke.
-  Overhill; slant down right, and up. Cross down left.
-  Overhill; down, around, up, down under water, loop up left, and through.
-  Overhill; around down, around again, and down under water, loop up left, and through.

Strokes That Make Cursive Letters: Uphill Strokes



uphill strokes

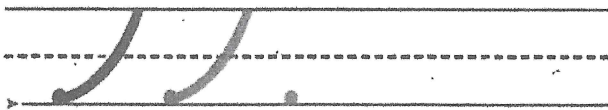


To write cursive l, h, k, t, i, u, and e, you add an uphill stroke to each letter you already know. These letters already have an ending stroke. Now look at j and p. To write them, begin with an uphill stroke and add an ending stroke.

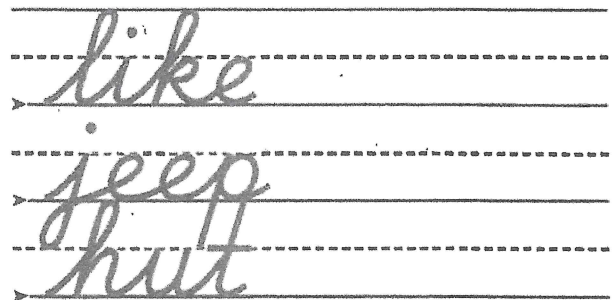
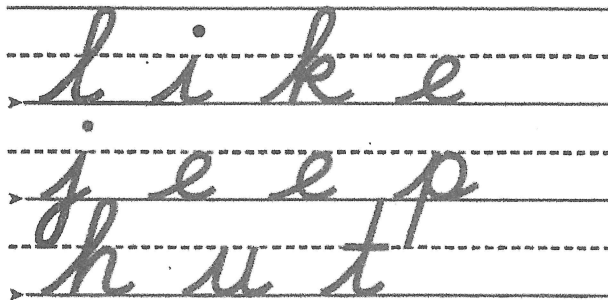
With your finger, trace the uphill stroke in each letter. Circle the ending stroke in each letter.



An uphill stroke can be tall or short. Practice each one.

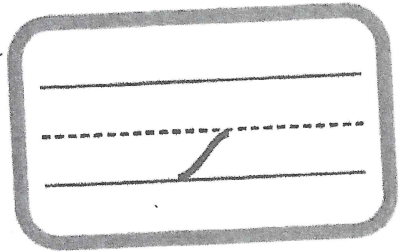


Now look at the letters below. Notice that they begin with uphill strokes. Trace the words.

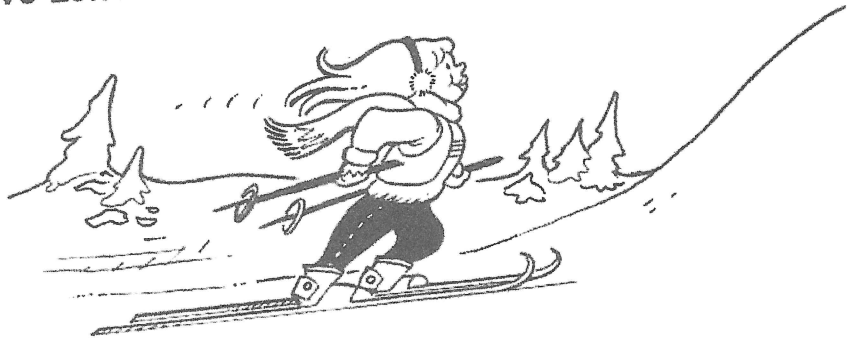

Strokes That Make Cursive Letters: Overhill Strokes

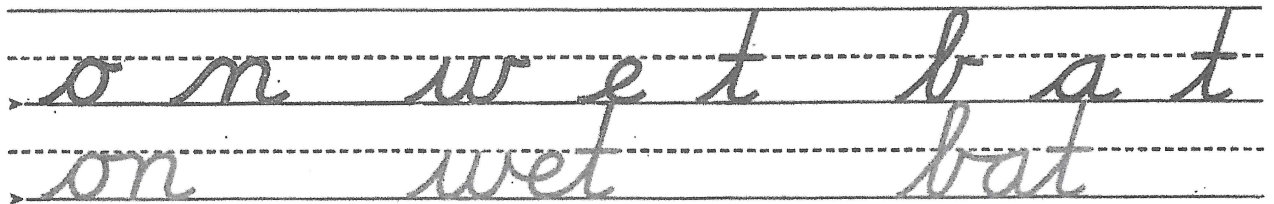

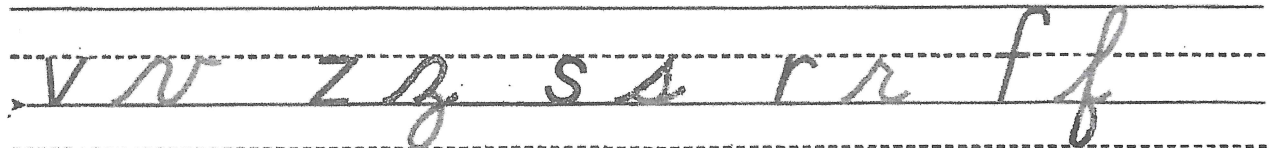
Practice the sidestroke.

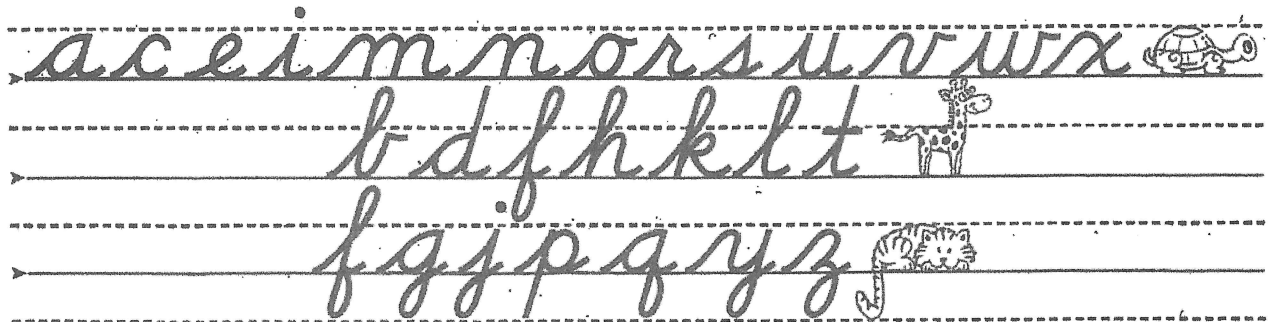

Letter Size and Form



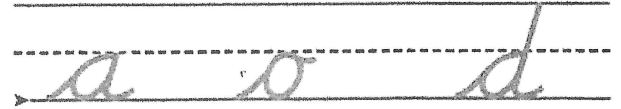
Cursive letters come in the same three sizes as manuscript letters. There are small letters, tall letters, and letters with descenders. Which tall letter also has a descender?

Some cursive letters have loops.



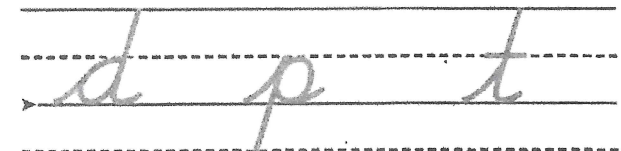
To practice looping letters, trace these letters.



Some cursive letters need retracing. Go over a line that you've already written.



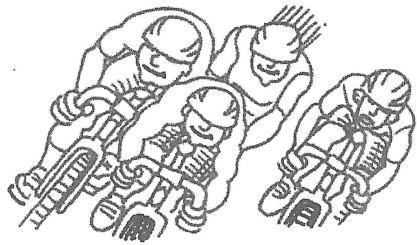
To practice retracing, trace these letters.



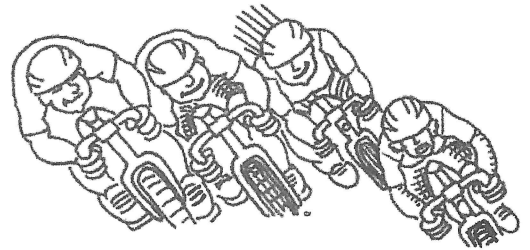

Letter Slant and Word Spacing

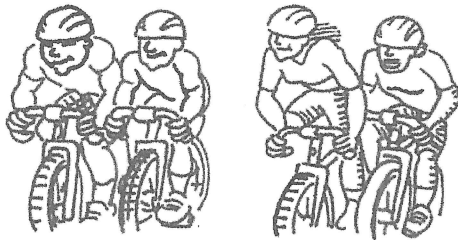

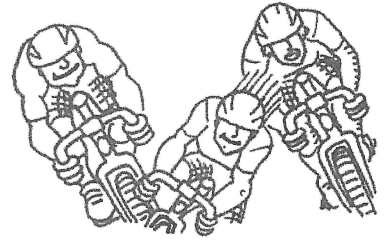
