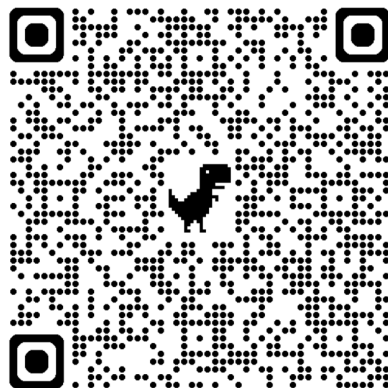
# YEARBOOK

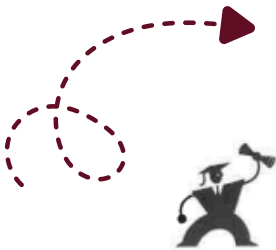

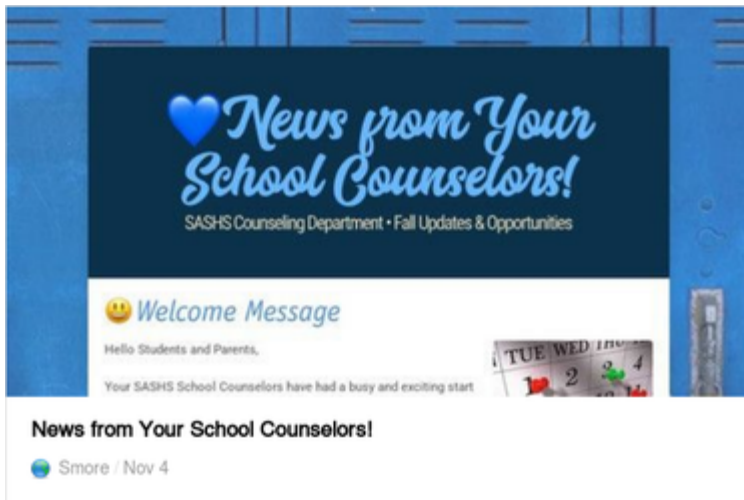

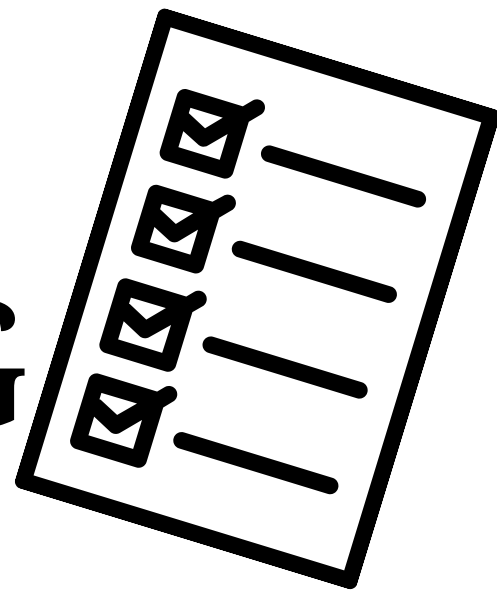

### Students Who Must Arrive by 7:27 AM

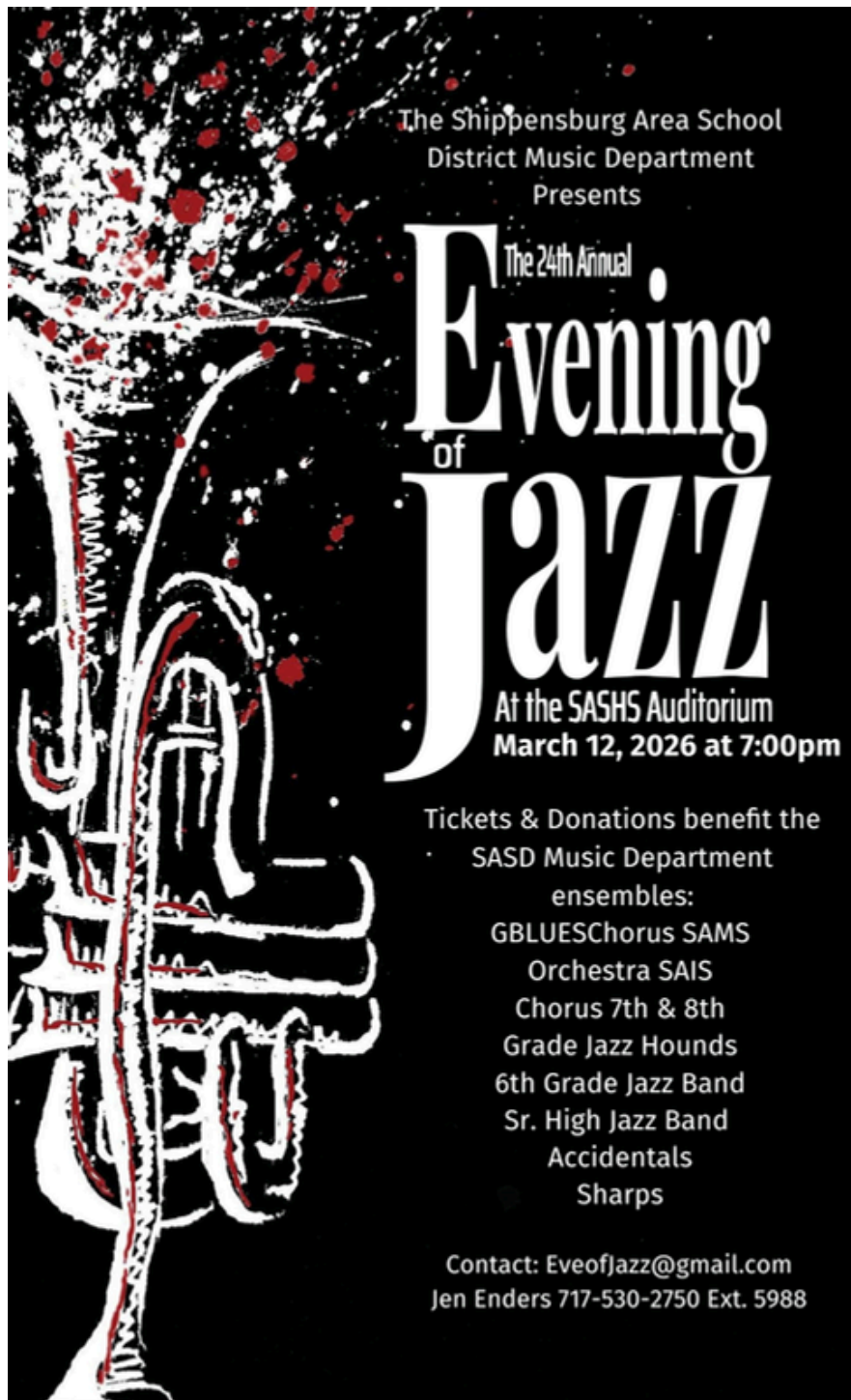
- Students enrolled in a Keystone-tested course (Algebra 1, Biology, or Literature 10)

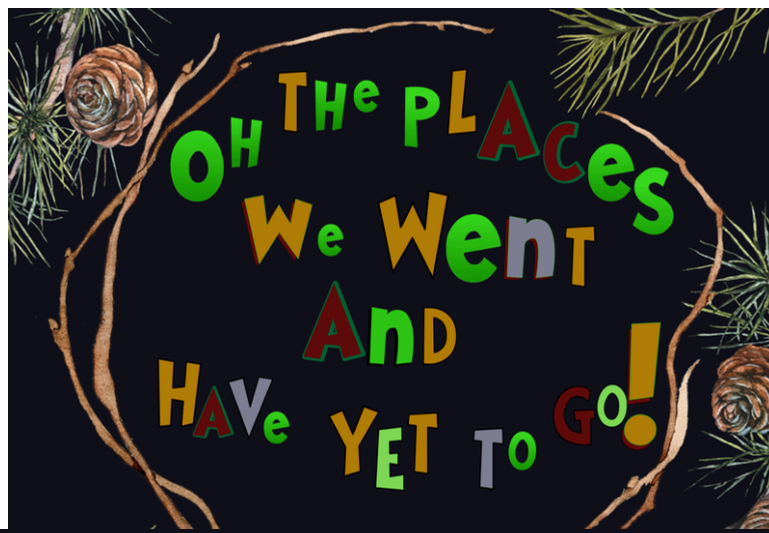
