
Greetings Knights Community Family,

We've held professional learning opportunities, which have helped to ensure our teachers are comfortable with implementing something new. I'm excited to share that we are seeing incremental growth among our scholars.

We have (4) intervention teachers who assist us with leveling our scholars up. The work specifically with scholars who have been identified through our MTSS/RTI process that are in need of additional support. Scholars are utilizing Achieve 3000 and IXL to help with literacy and math as needed. The commitment of the dedicated educators in our school district is simply unwavering. We have a celebration coming up in February for scholars' achievements in Achieve 3000 and IXL. We are so grateful for our community partners who support us in this effort. We are especially grateful for Family Connections and Ms. Edwina Turner for our partnership and the work they do to support our scholars.

We are continuously striving to increase Lexile Levels among all scholars. In addition to our new reading curriculum for elementary scholars, our Media Specialist, Ms. Townsend, recently ordered several new books for the Media Center. The best part about this is that scholars had input about what they would like to read. Since the new books arrived, we've seen an increase in scholars going to the media center to check out books.

STEM Truck at the STEW

On December 12, 2023, the scholars at Stewart County Elementary and Middle School had an opportunity to experience the STEM Truck from South Georgia Technical College (SGTC).

Dr. David Finley and other instructors afforded the scholars of Stewart to participate in the educational lab. Scholars were involved in activities to learn how to virtually paint automobiles, fly drones, and enjoy other technical type learning utilizing virtual technology. Also, the students had the opportunity to actively participate in Robotics. The scholars in grades 3 - 8 were very excited about the activities and became interested in attending SGTC. We are planning to have the STEM Truck to return to campus in the spring for the high school scholars.

Each of the activities are classified as STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) fields with an emphasis on innovation, problem-solving, and critical thinking.



ASSESMENT

As the first semester comes to an end, Stewart County Schools have made great strides in the area of testing. Reading and Mathematics Growth Measure universal screeners have been administered for the beginning and middle of the year. Acadience early literacy assessments have also been given. Teachers are analyzing the data to measure academic gains and areas to focus instruction. Scholars with gains will receive incentives for their improvement.

We are preparing our scholars for the Georgia Milestones Assessments (GMAS). Grades three through eight have taken the DRC Beacon assessment in English Language Arts and Mathematics. This assessment is designed to address student instructional needs, identify areas of strength and target areas of improvement in each instructional domain, and measure progress throughout the year. The DRC Beacon assessment will be administered again in February to measure progress towards mastery of the standards. At the high school level, our scholars are preparing for the Georgia Milestones End of Course assessment by taking interim benchmark assessments. These assessments have been developed to mirror the GMAS and are given to scholars who will be taking EOCs in the spring.

I'm pleased to announce that we were able to order (2) new buses in November. We like to keep our school bus fleet up and maintain safe transportation for our students. In December, we covered and completed emergency evacuation drills with our students that consisted of the reasons to evacuate, the type of ways to evacuate and instructions when evacuating the school bus. As CDL holders, our bus drivers are required to submit random drug and alcohol testing with a thirdparty tester. As another layer of safety and being a CDL holder, our bus drivers are also registered with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). In addition, queries are also run through the Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse database. These queries will determine whether drug or alcohol violations exist in the clearinghouse for bus drivers.



We are asking for your support in improving whole school attendance and punctuality. During the COVID pandemic, scholars and families needed to isolate if they or a close contact tested positive. The impact on children's education through learning loss is huge, and at a time when so much education has been disrupted, we must make every school minute count. We urge you to ensure that your scholars are in school and on time daily to prevent anyone from falling behind with their learning. We want to help families get their scholars to school on time. Here are some things you can try:

- Have everything you/your scholar needs for school prepared the night before.
- Ensure that your scholars go to bed reasonably so they are not too tired to get up in the morning.
- Ensure your scholars have a good night's sleep by minimizing their use of devices at bedtime.
- Have a consistent bedtime routine for your scholar.
- Set an alarm to allow plenty of time for your morning routine to get to school on time.


