What We Did in Class This Week

This week has been full of fun and learning! Here's a glimpse of what we've been up to:

- <u>Bread Baking:</u> The students had the chance to make and bake bread rolls. We enjoyed sharing them with everyone!

- <u>Nature Walk:</u> We went on a nature walk to observe the signs of fall. The students collected various natural items, which we are using to create a beautiful nature table in our classroom.
- <u>Art:</u> We've been exploring the joy (and challenge) of finger knitting, and the students are eagerly learning this new skill.
- <u>Math:</u> We are reviewing counting from 1 to 20 and exploring simple addition using number lines, stomping, ball passing, and manipulatives. These activities are helping us understand basic addition. We are also learning to solve simple addition using story problems.
- <u>Language Arts:</u> We are reviewing and practicing our Upper Case letters, discussing words that start with each letter as we are working on it, and writing simple sentences (ie. I love bread!).

Verses We Are Learning

- Verse 1: "The Earth is firm beneath my feet. The sun shines bright above. And here I stand so straight and strong, all things to know and love."
- Verse 2: "Whether the weather be fine or whether the weather be not, we'll weather the weather, no matter the weather, whether we like it or not."
