The Williamsburg County School District is proud to announce that one of its students, a dedicated and high-achieving student, has been named a Junior Scholar in recognition of exceptional academic performance and leadership. Junior Scholars are identified when students score 550 or higher in Reading and Writing and 530 or higher in the Mathematics portion of the PSAT.

Rakhee T. Lundy, an 8th grader from Kingstree Middle Magnet School of the Arts, has demonstrated a commitment to excellence through outstanding PSAT results, high grades, research projects, community service, and extracurricular involvement. This recognition as a Junior Scholar highlights his dedication to learning, innovation, and making a positive impact.

The South Carolina Junior Scholars Program was developed by the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) during the 1985-86 school year as part of a statewide effort to improve education in South Carolina and to meet the needs of students with exceptional academic talent. The program aims to identify these students and provide opportunities that will facilitate their intellectual growth, broaden their interests, and promote their academic achievement.

As a Junior Scholar, Lundy will receive an Award of Merit certificate and a Junior Scholar bumper sticker from the South Carolina Department of Education.
