## **TITLE... Tips to Maintain Summer Reading**

-Make reading a priority in your home-Children learn to value and respect those things that you do. Allow your kids easy access to books by placing them strategically throughout your home. Set aside time each day to read. You might start out with 20 minutes each day and by the end of the summer work up to 1 hour. Go to the library each week, they frequently have new books to read and enjoy. -Let your child choose their own books. Guide them by suggesting book series that you feel would be age and subject-appropriate for your child. -Plan an activity that centers around their favorite book-If your child likes to read about butterflies, use that opportunity to create a butterfly craft.

Few other ideas: (1) watching TV with the sound off and closed captioning on, (2) reading directions for how to play a new game, or (3) helping with meals by writing up a grocery list, finding things in the grocery store, and reading the recipe aloud for mom or dad during cooking time.
