We are encouraging our families to have their scholars practice Freckle at home for at least 20 minutes a day.

In preparation for MAP testing and to build reading stamina please have your scholars read at home for at least 30 minutes.

Research shows that reading with your scholar at least 30 minutes daily will increase academic achievement.

At home please continue to do the following:

- Reading at least 30 minutes every night
- Practice Sight Words/Spelling Words
- Practice Math Facts
