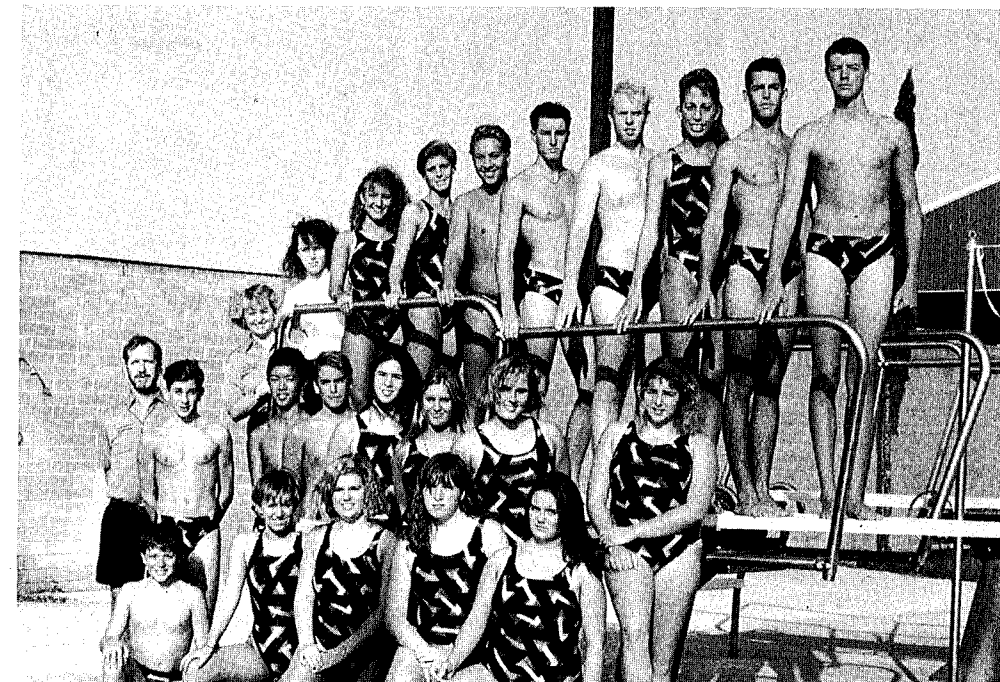

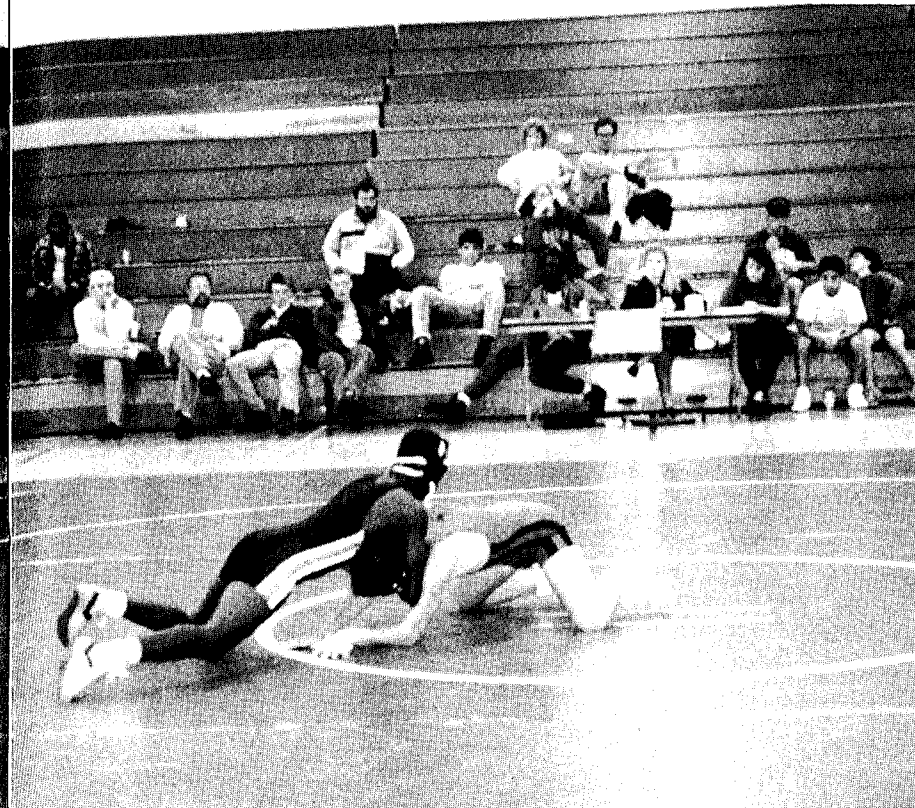

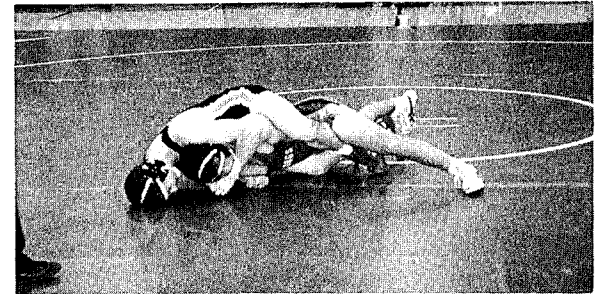

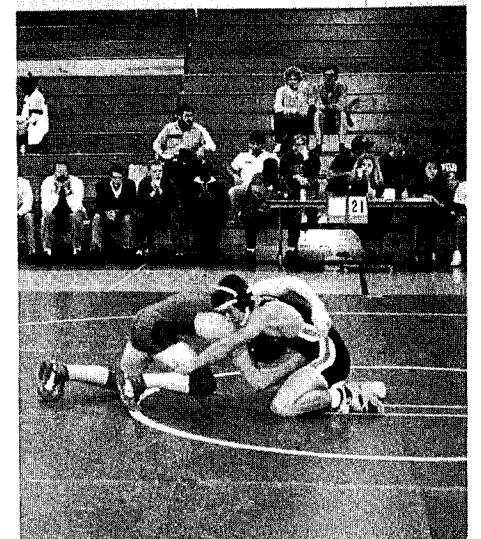

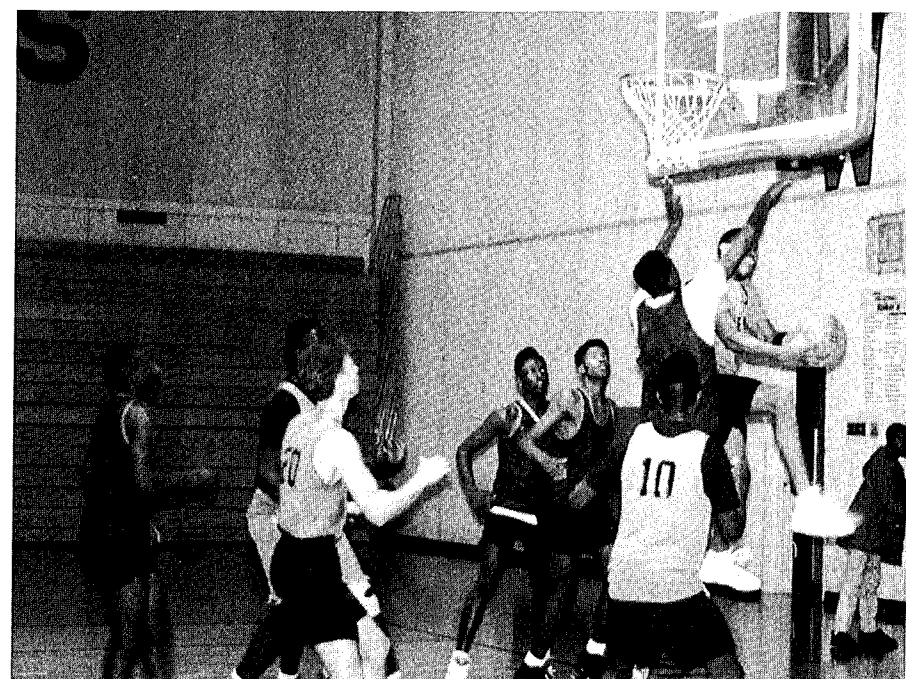

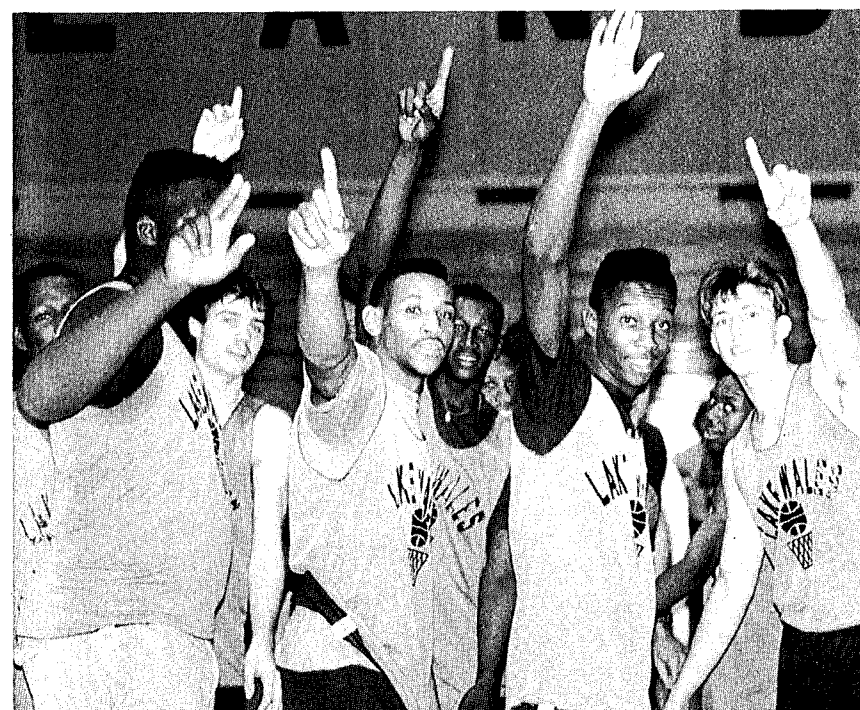

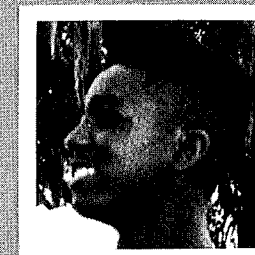

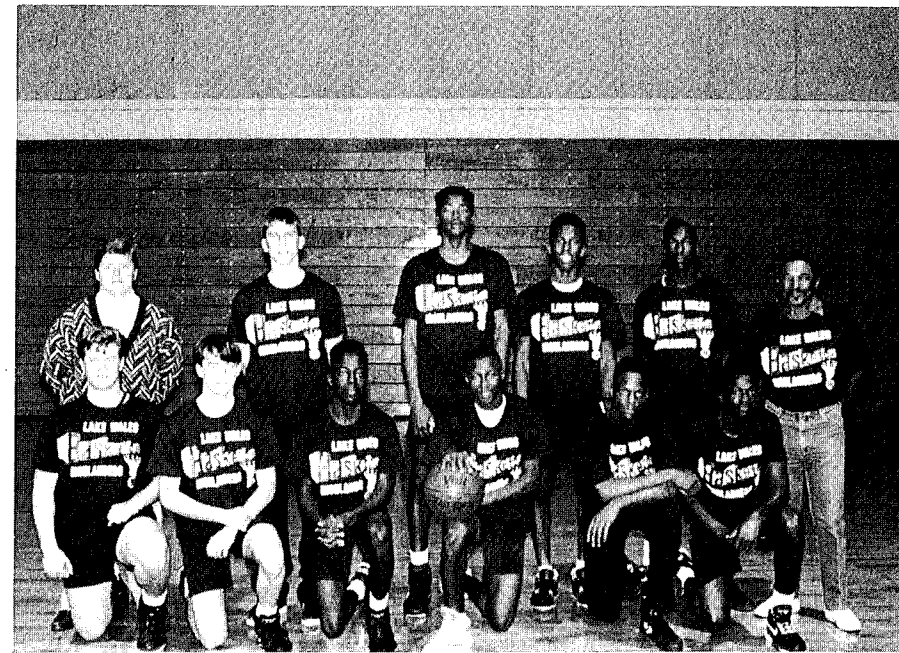

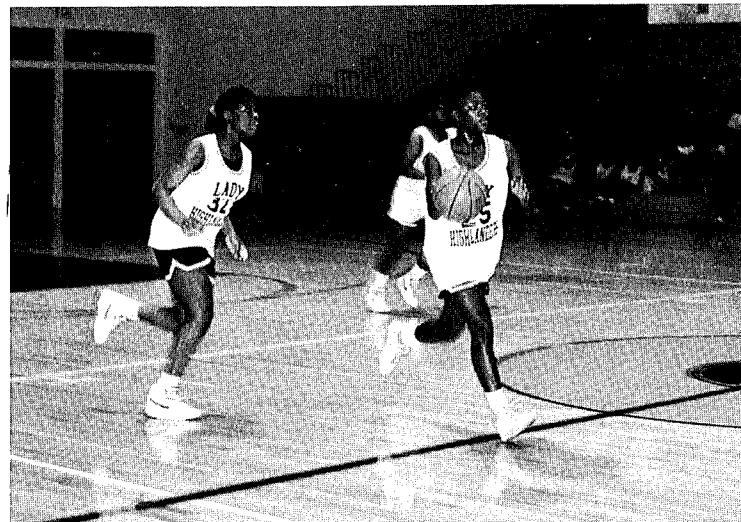
The team has a record of 8-14, and are playing very well. The team's starting line-up con-

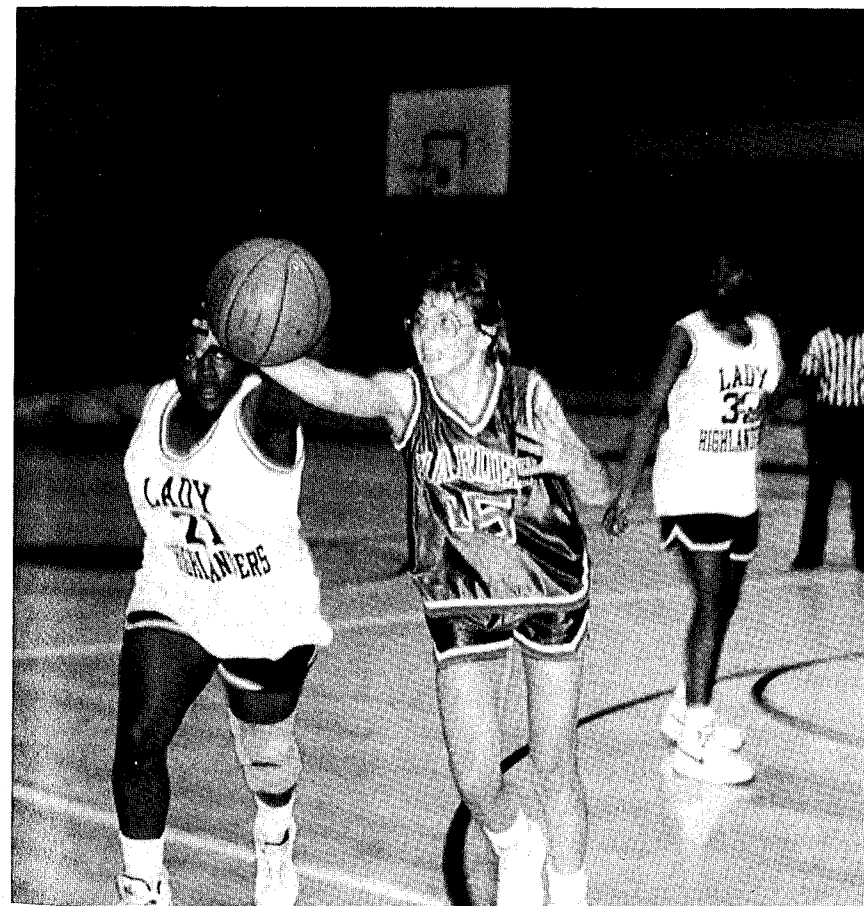

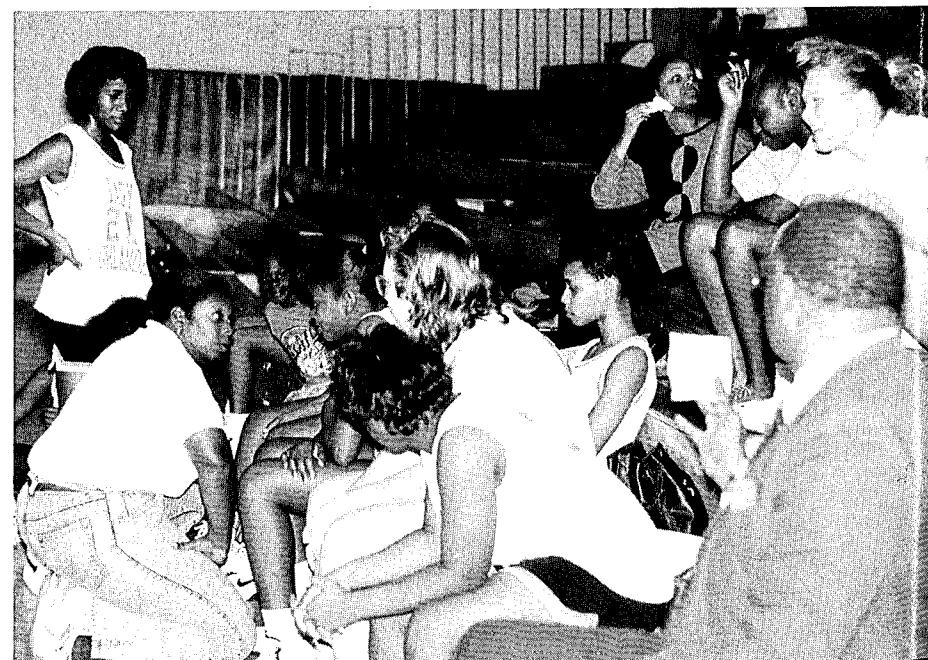

one seed Santa Fe. Since the team only lost five starters the future looks bright for Lake Wales Soccer.



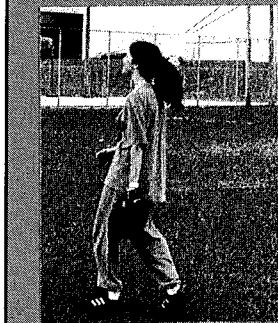

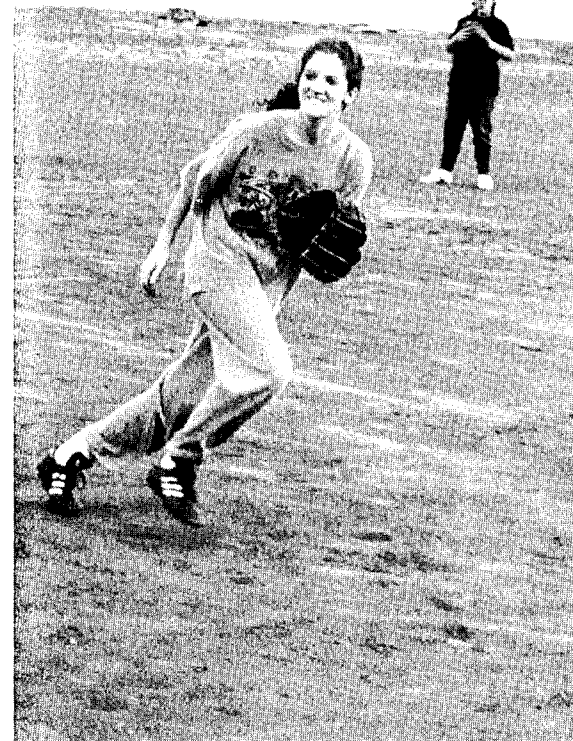

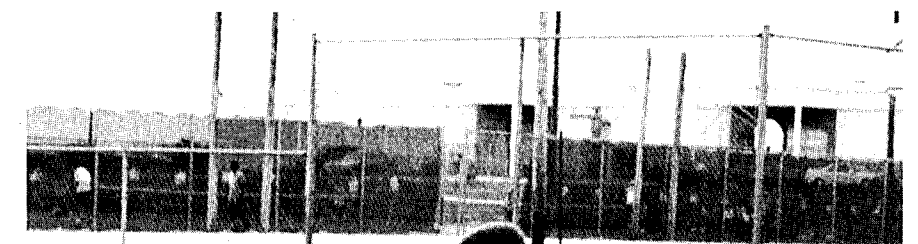

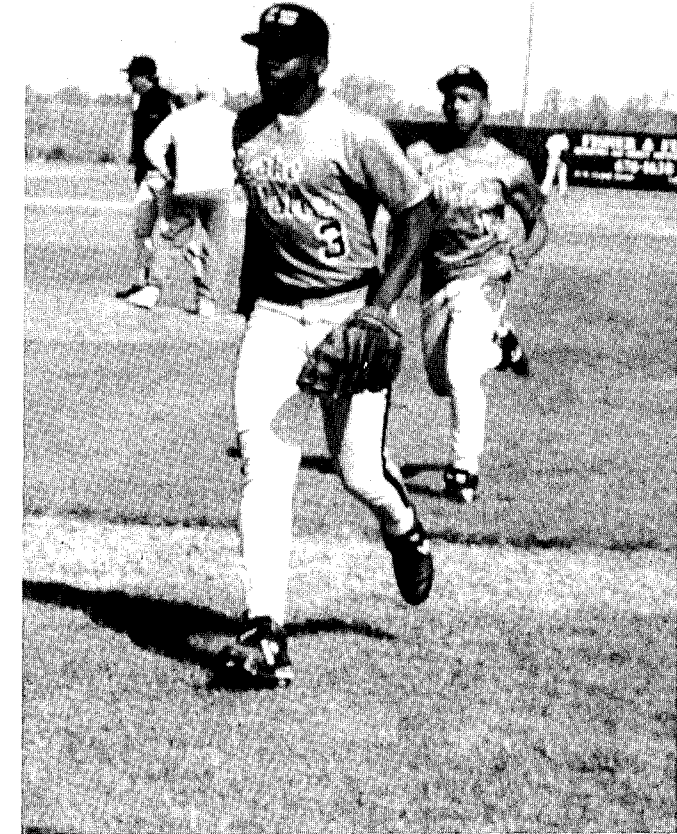

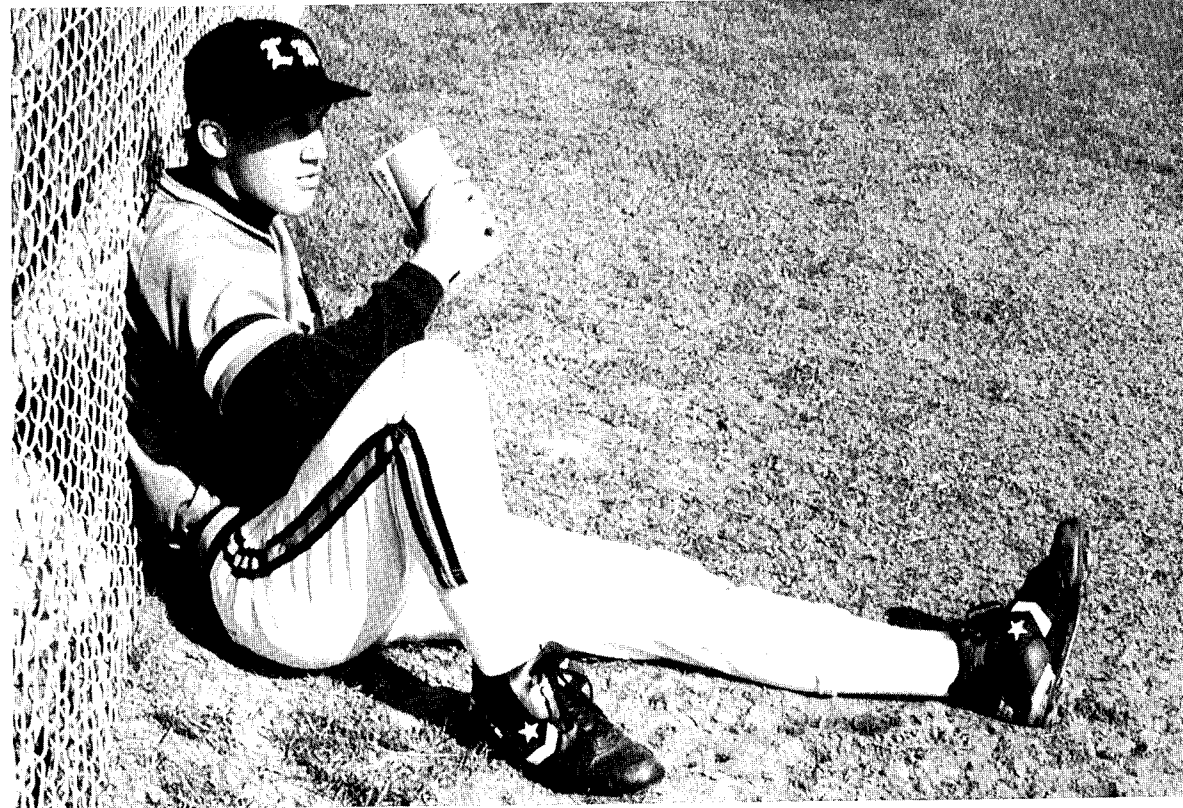


# ABSOLUTELY EXPLOSIVE

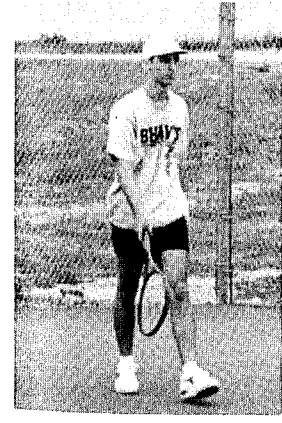

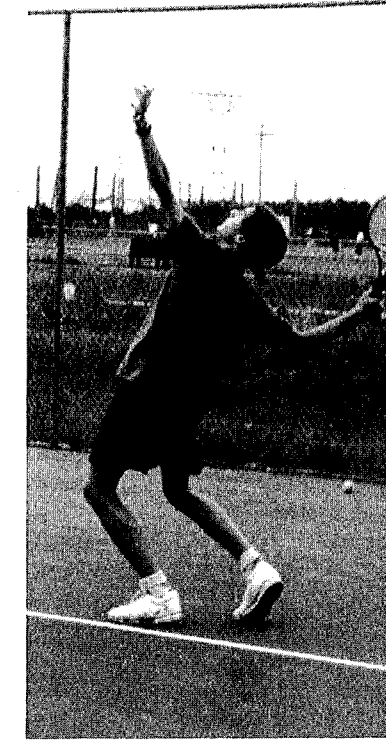

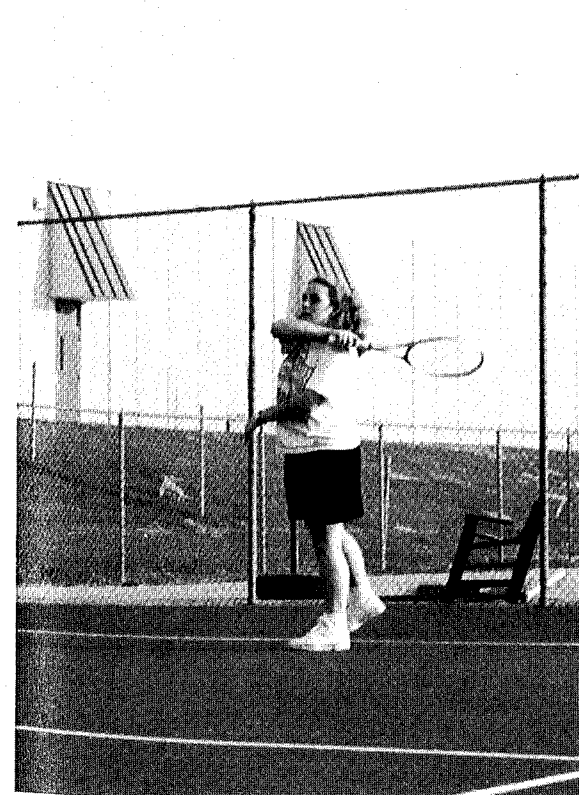

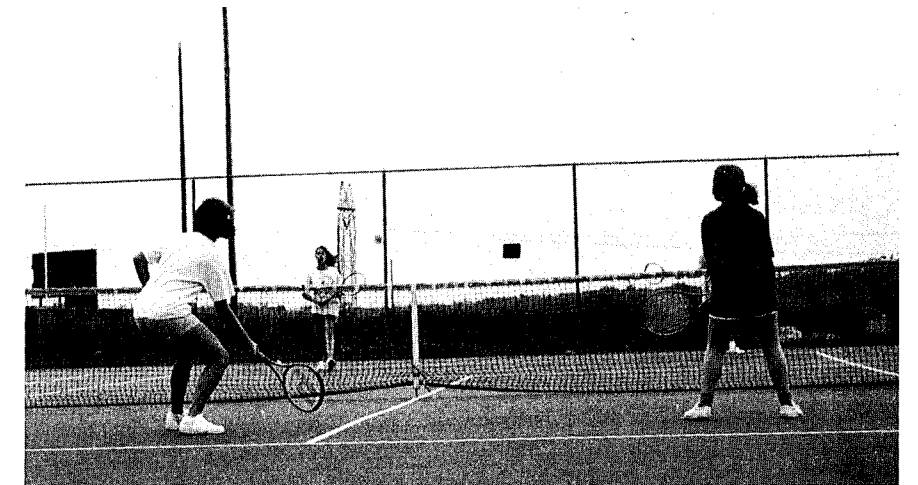

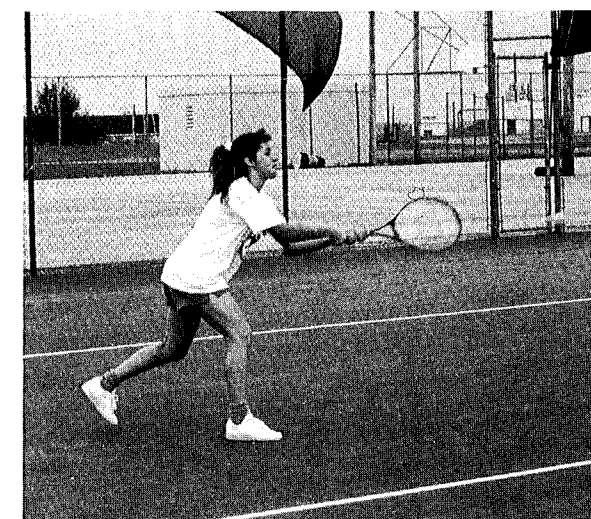

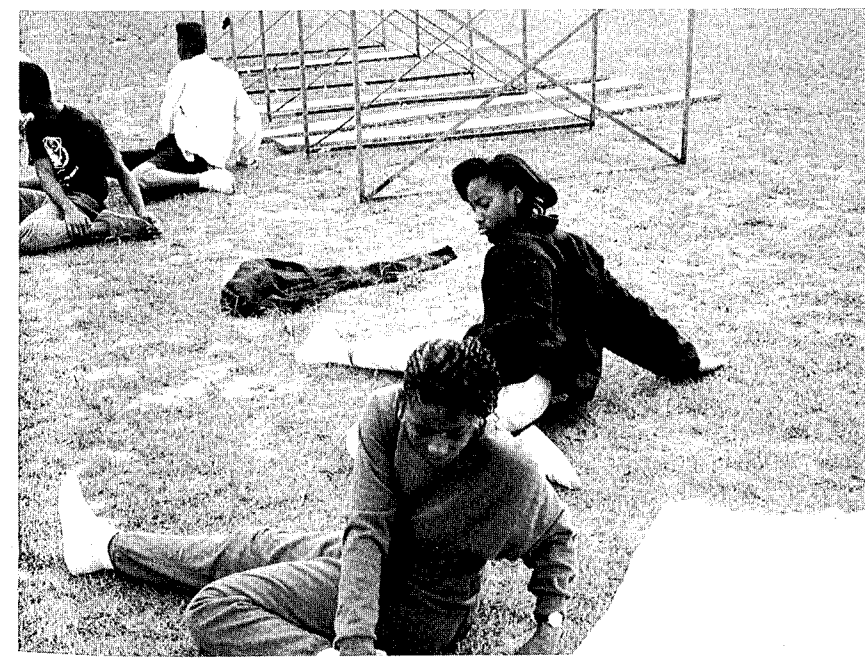

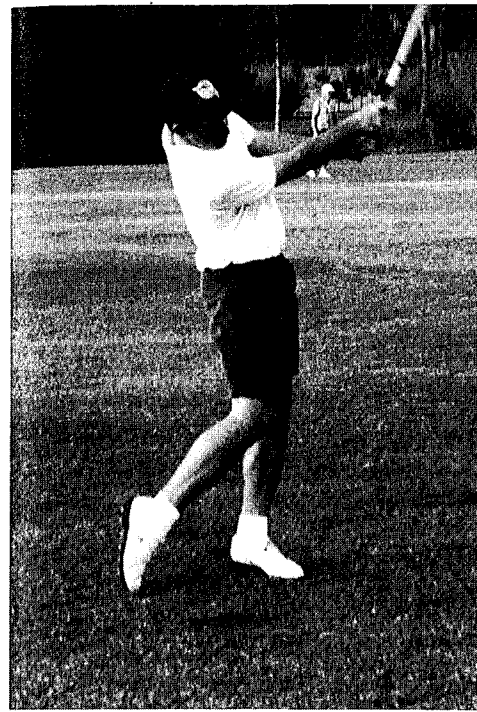

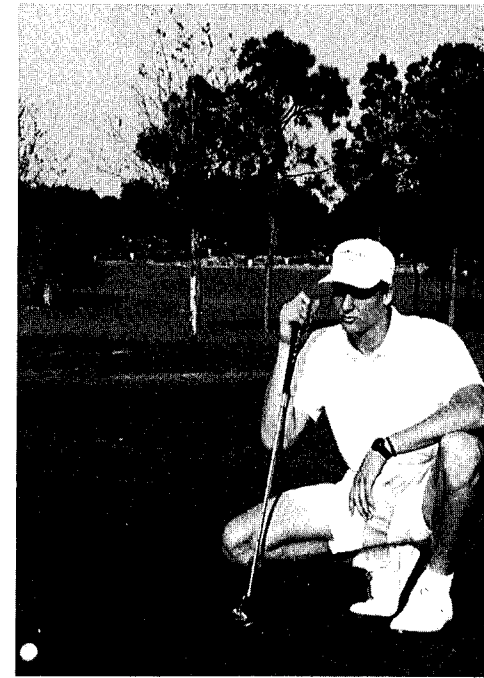

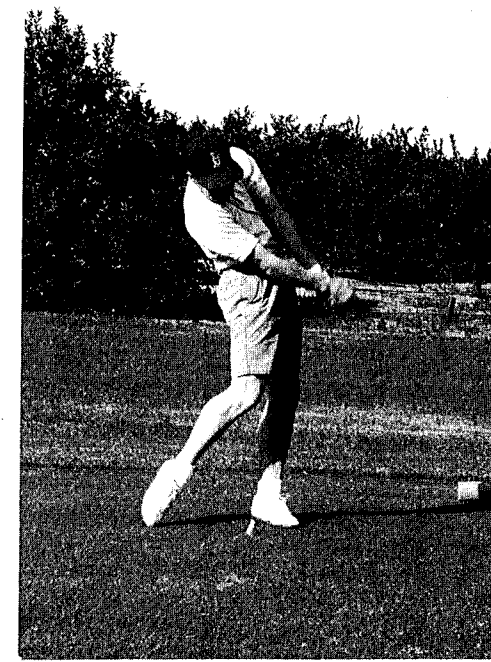

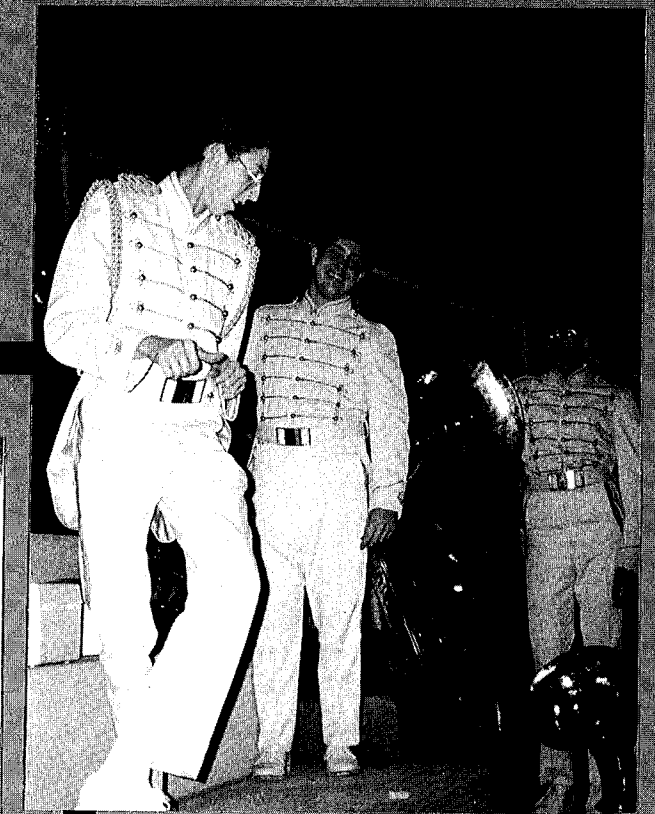

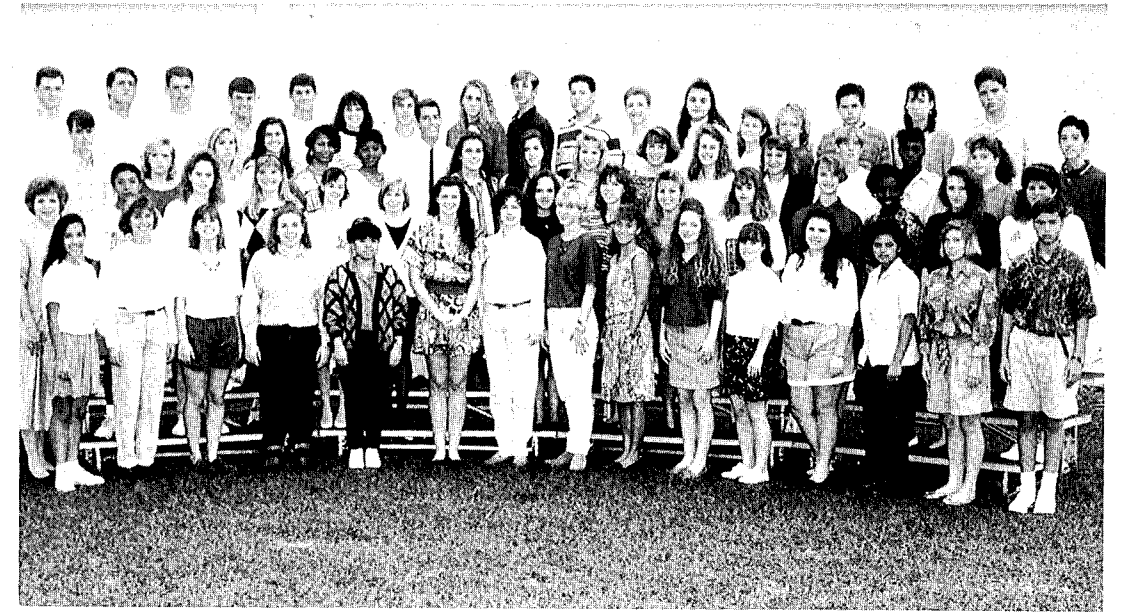

Each year NHS does at least one service project. This year

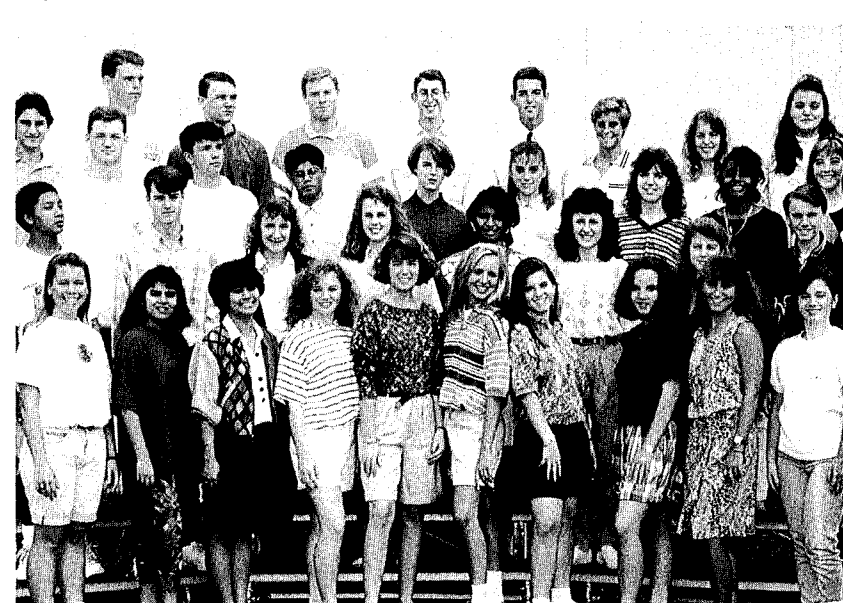

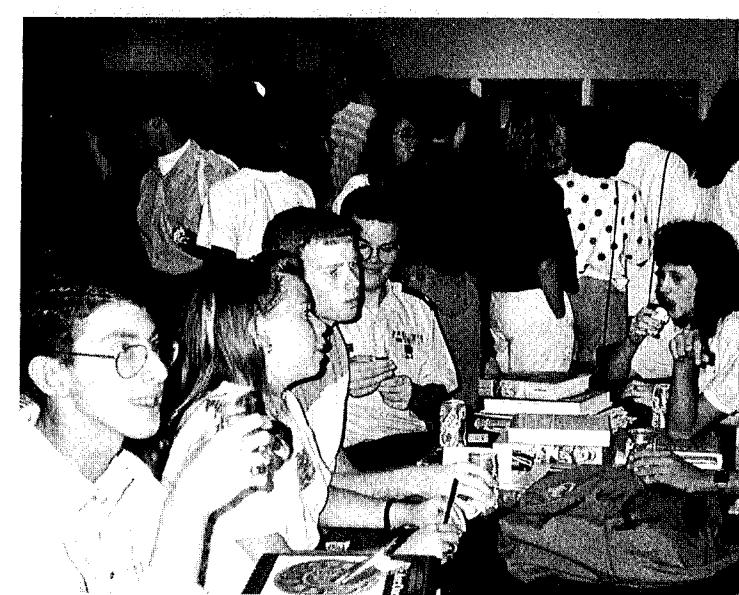

over 25 people through many long and grueling practices that extended to even Saturdays. A perfectionist, she molded the amateur actors from Drama Club into "professional" ones.

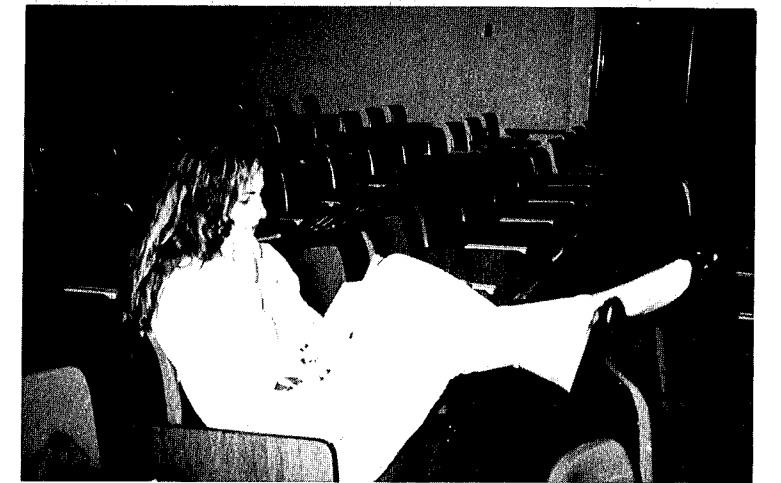

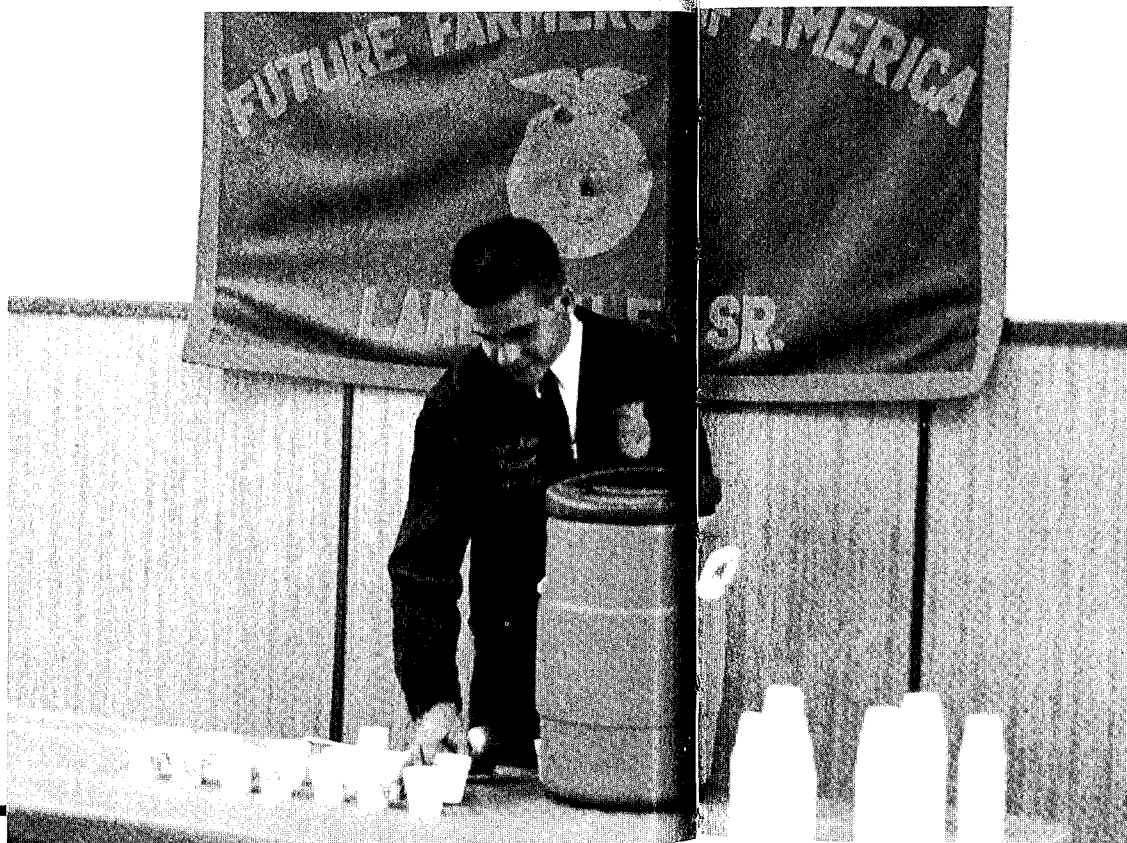



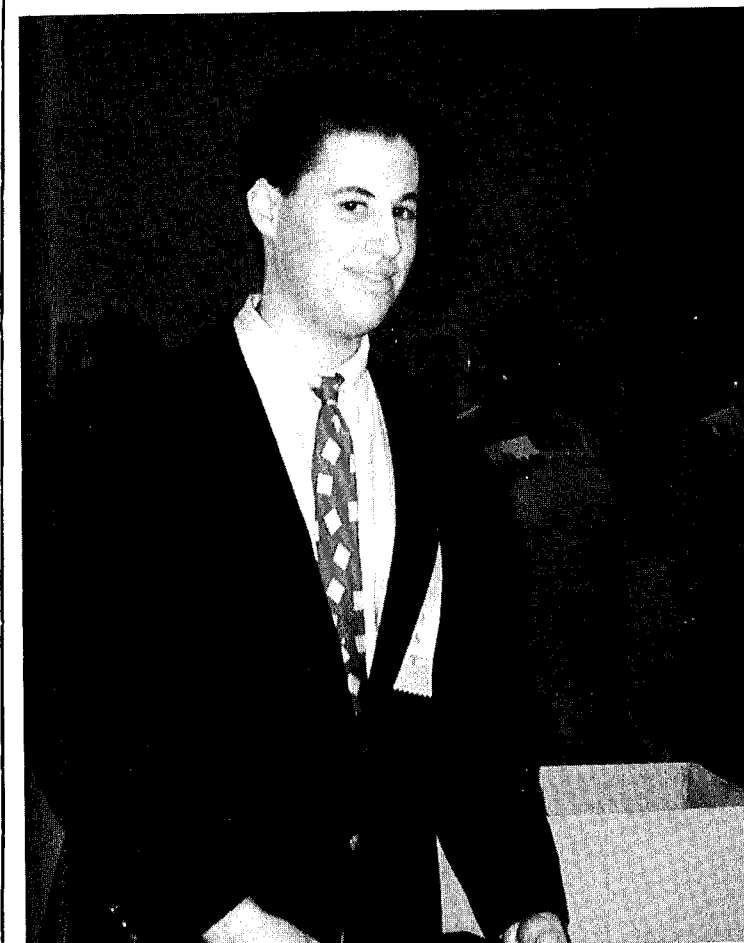

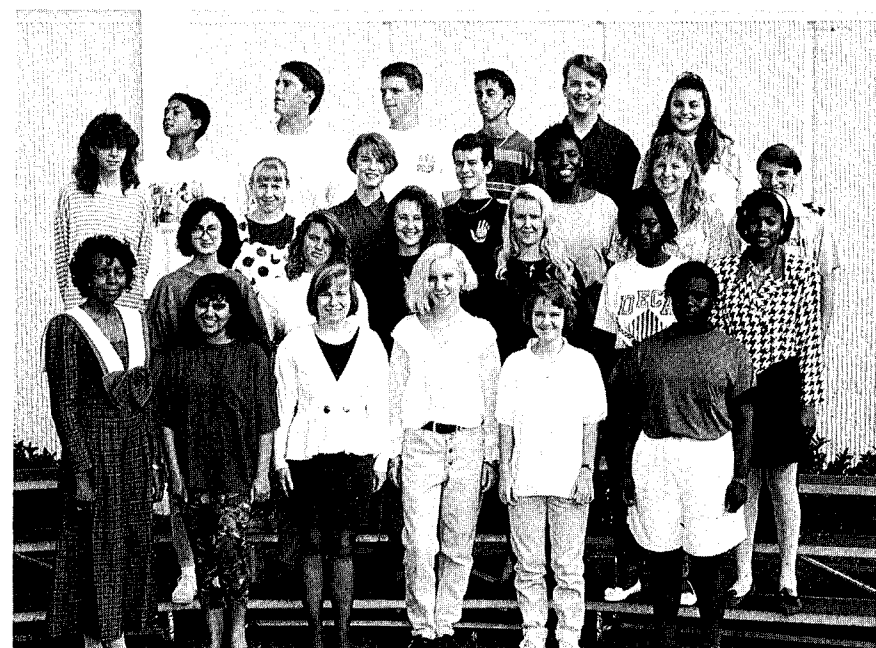

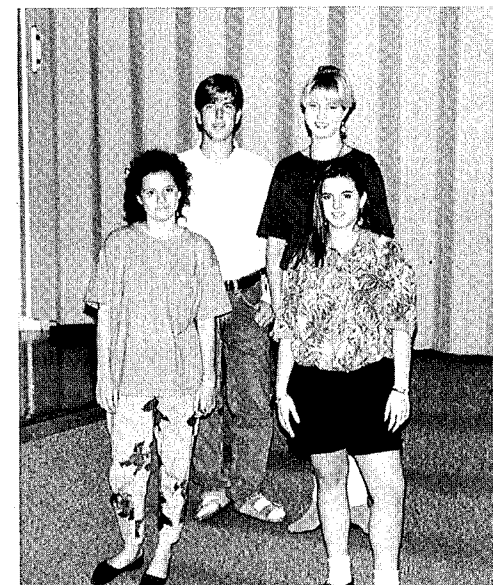

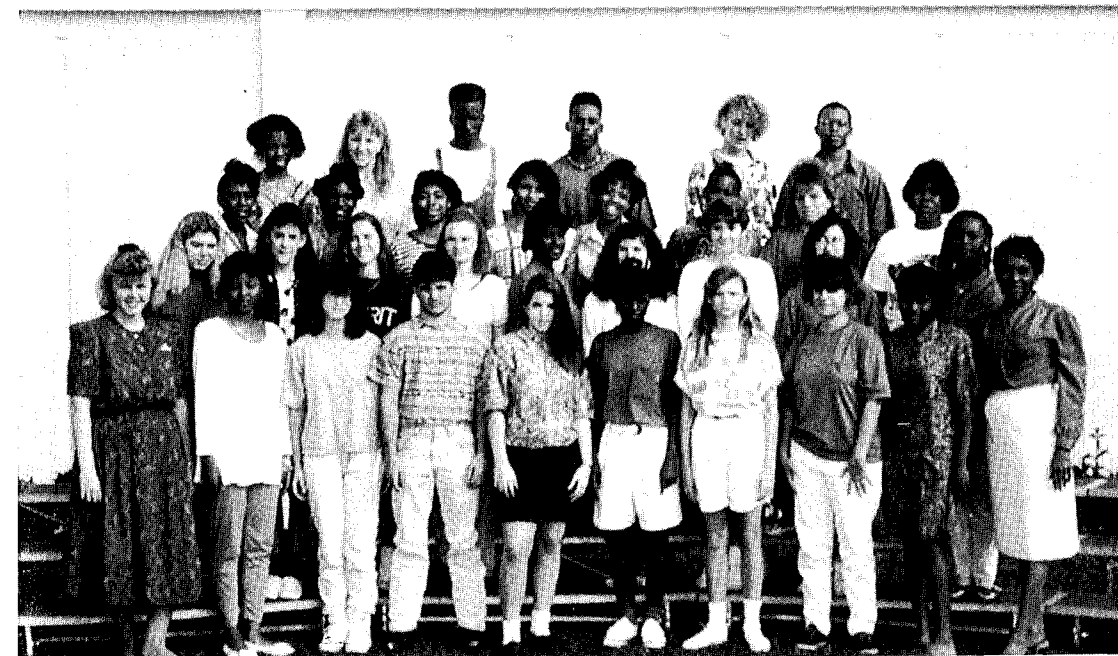

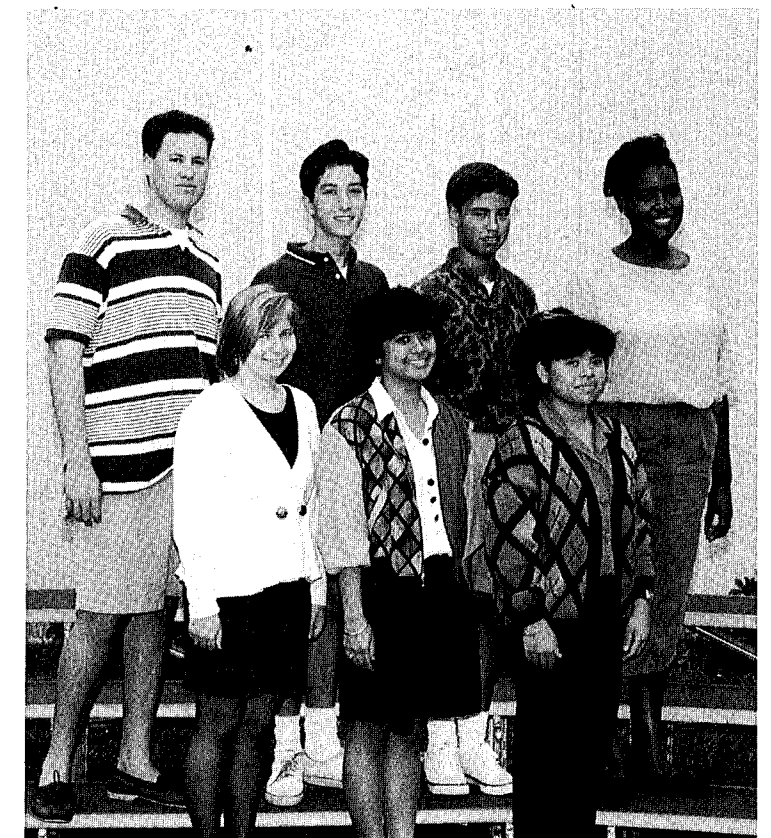

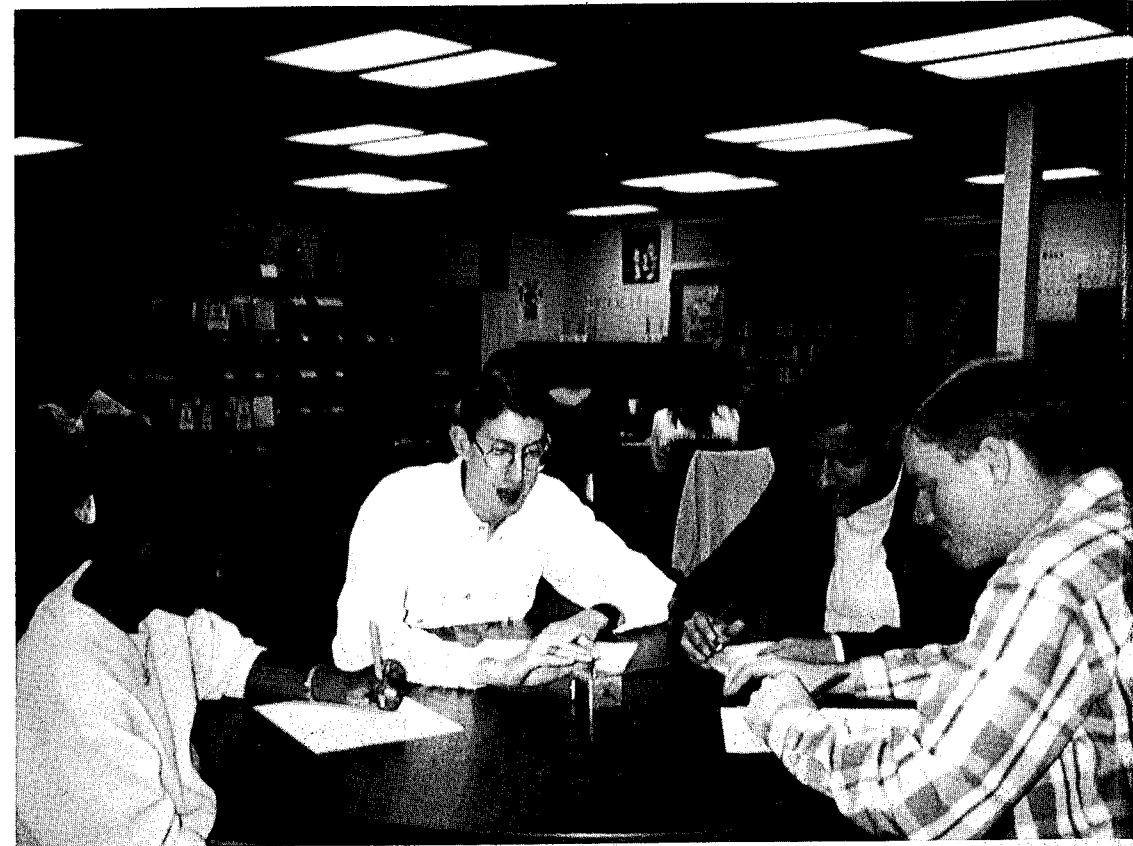

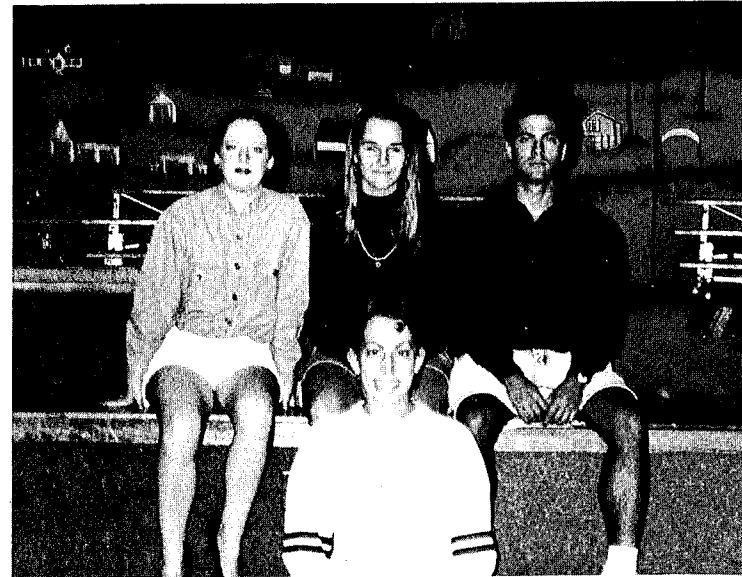
# KEY CLUB'S EXPLICIT SERVICE

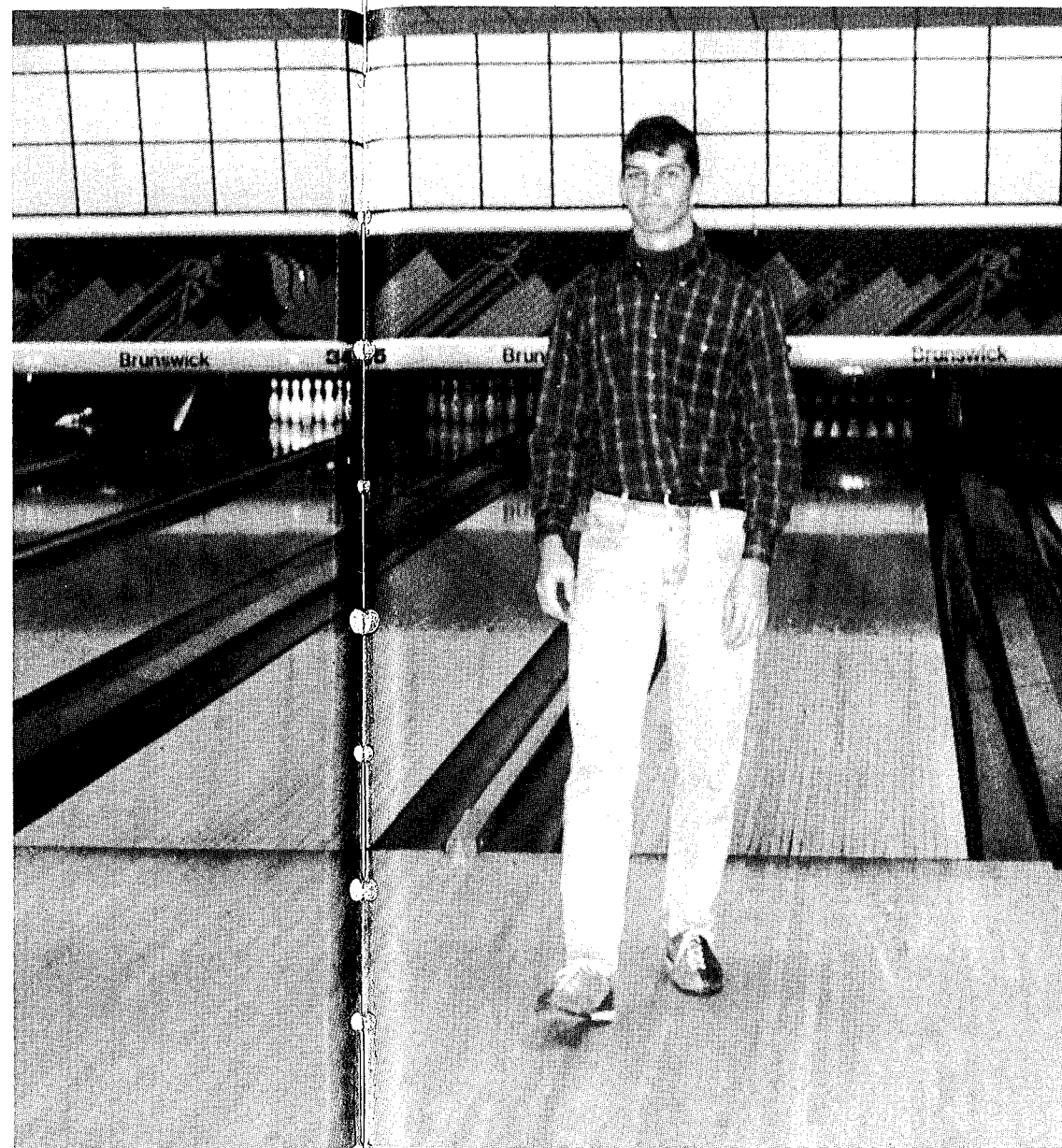
## Their Freedom of Religion

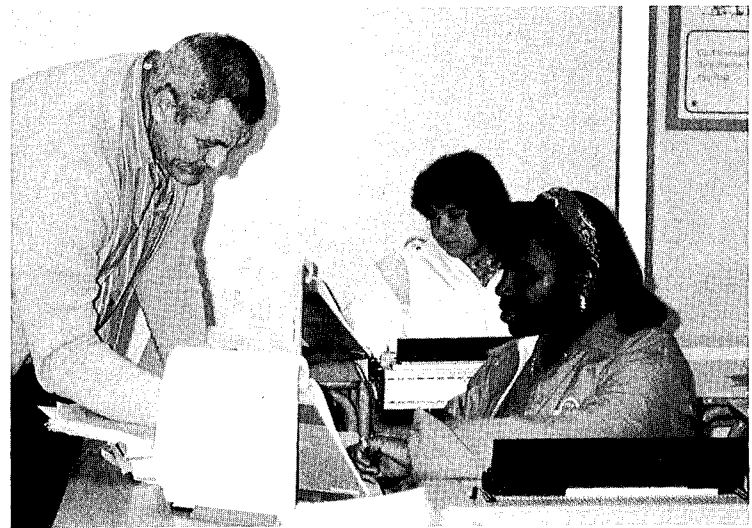

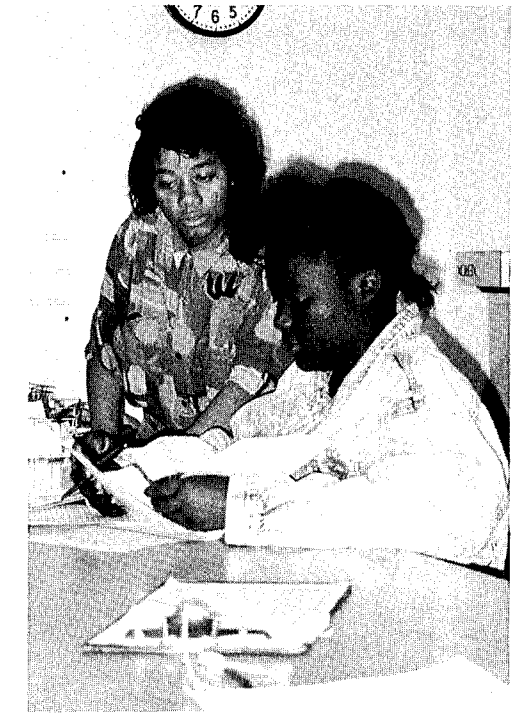

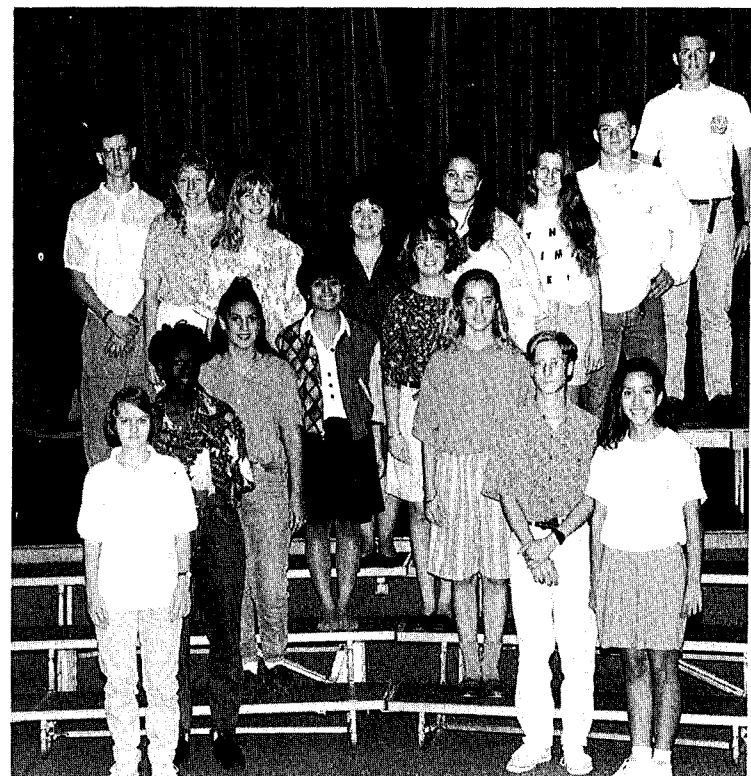

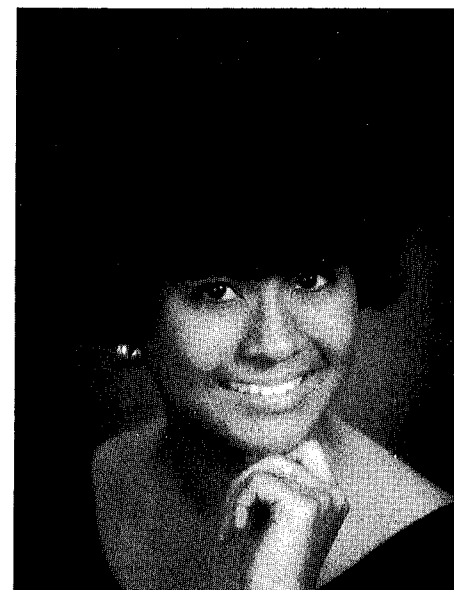
