TK and Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

Kindergarten just finished their last chapter in math. They learned about classifying and sorting items based on different criteria. Tk is finishing up learning how to write numbers 1 through 5 and solving simple story problems.

Kindergarteners are learning tricky words. They should know: what, which, why, are, here, word, no, they, when, where, were, my, by, and to. Kindergarteners are also learning how to read words with e. TK just finished their habitat unit. They are adding the finishing touches to their habitat projects. They have been working on this habitat unit for a couple of months. TK will bring home their final projects next week.

Students did the math portions of state testing in the mornings this week. We have kept the afternoons filled with their specialists like PE, Music, SEL and Art in addition to review work in ELA. Next week students will begin a study of Washington State history that will take them through the remainder of the school year. During this unit students will use the knowledge they gain to create timelines, maps, and artwork to describe

Our mealworms have completed their metamorphosis! Students were sure surprised that our worm-like larva, and laidback pupa "turned into" beatles! We were also able to spend a bit of time in the garden planting some tomato starts that we grew from seeds.

We will begin our end of the year district testing next week. I am eager to see on paper the great growth displayed by this sweet, quick group of learners!

A couple things could be done at home to help students "show off what they know." First, please try to ensure students are getting 8-10 hours of consistent sleep each night. Also, try to have them eat a healthy, balanced dinner and breakfast. Academically, the best thing families can do is to have your child read at least 30 minutes aloud each night. If you would like, have your child keep a writing journal to practice handwriting and using story elements or tackle math story problems and computation at home.

Fifth and Sixth Grade Classroom Mr. Burlingame

This week we have been doing state testing in the morning. 5th and 6th grade have been testing each day in the morning during our scheduled Math time. They have been going to recess at the normal time and stopping their tests at lunch time. This means that students are still able to have PE, Music, Science, and Art in the afternoon as well as ELA. It is very important that students get a full night's sleep, a nutritious breakfast, and arrive at school on time. Thank you for your support of Evaline and the great students of Evaline.

The past few weeks we have been doing google slide projects on the states of America. Students have researched different aspects about their chosen state including its geographical location, features, the current serving governor and senators, and state icons such as birds, flowers, songs, and apparently dirt.
