

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TTK and Kindergarten

We are off to a great start with our Read-a-Thon! Students are encouraged to read **30 minutes each day, including weekends**. Please return reading logs **daily** in your child's planner or purple folder so I can record the minutes. I track the minutes students read at school on their individual reading logs, which are kept in the classroom. I will keep you updated on your child's progress toward their **monthly goal of 900 minutes**. Our classroom goal is for every student to reach their personal reading goal.

Kindergarten students are currently learning about teen numbers. They are exploring how teen numbers are composed (for example, ten ones and two ones make twelve).

Kindergarteners are also learning the tricky words *of, the, all, and, and a*. In addition, they are beginning a unit about seasons and weather, where they will learn about different types of weather and how seasons change throughout the year.

Our TK students are working on a Habitats unit and are currently learning about oceans and the types of animals that live there. They are also practicing letter sounds for M, A, T, D, O, C, E, S, G, and F, as well as identifying and writing the letters in their own names.
