





Strategies put into place this year: The lesson plan rubric was reevaluated during last summer and was a focus at staff development at the beginning of the year. As teachers became more familiar with the rubric, their planning improved and scored higher on the rubric each nine weeks.







SB 401-UIL Homeschool Participation

2024-25 School Year	SB 401 Change for 2025-26 School Year
ISDs can OPT IN to allow homeschool participation	ISDs shall provide homeschool participation unless the school board votes to OPT OUT of allowing homeschool participation
Homeschool students may participate in UIL activities at the school that the student would be eligible to attend based on the student's residential address if the school has OPTED IN to allow homeschool participation.	Homeschool students may participate in UIL activities at the school closest to the student's residential address that does allow homeschool participation, if the school to which they are zoned OPTS OUT of homeschool participation.
