Classroom and Academic Expectations

Backpacks: Backpacks will be hung or placed on shelves in the classroom. Scholars will unpack their book bags in the morning and return to them at the end of the day.

Visitors: Currently, parents, community members, and guest presenters are allowed to come into the building. A driver's license or photo ID is needed for all adults, and a computerized check-in process will be followed. We look forward to working with others to bring well-rounded instruction to the learning experience.

Change of Plans: If something comes up during the day and your scholar will go home a different way than normal, call the office to have a message relayed to your scholar's advisor.

Nurse Expectations:

Remember the nurse station is the hotspot for illnesses. Keep this in mind. Send cough drops, Chapstick, etc. when there's a simple issue. Encourage your child to be more aware of actual medical needs. We have some first aid items in the classroom for cuts, scraps, and itching.
