Homecoming, with all of its gayety and excitement, was made even greater as our class presented half-time festivities at the game and ended the evening with a semi-formal dance.

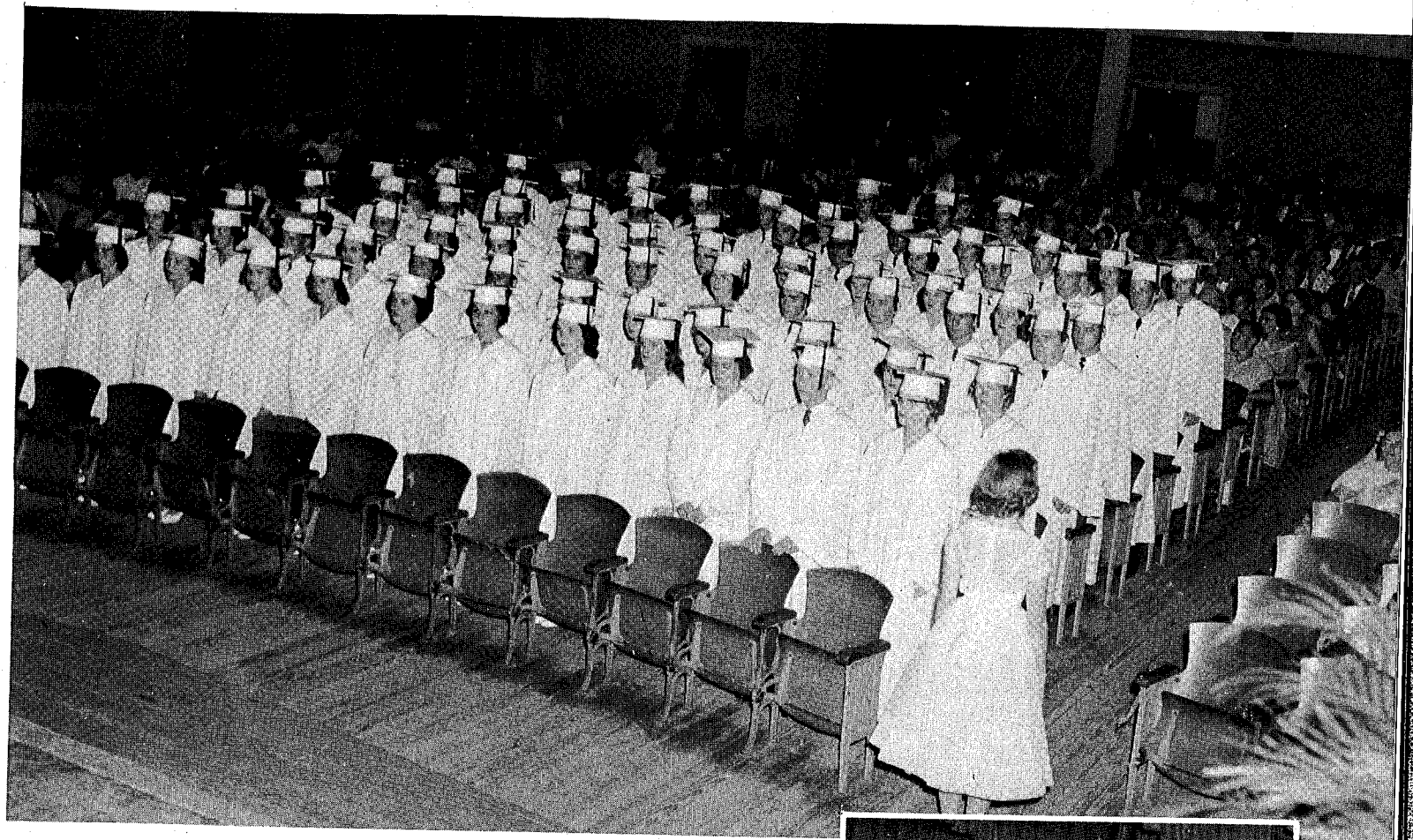
This year, THE LITTLE DOG LAUGHED showed the talents of the class on the stage. This three-act comedy was presented with the new props which were our gifts to the school.
