★ SUPPORTING YOUR STUDENT AT HOME

Scavenger hunts are always a fun way to review skills previously learned at school! On index cards, write down words or sentences to read, addition or subtraction equations, or simple tasks for your child to do. Then, hide them around your home. When your child finds it, they can write down the answer or do the task and bring it to you to check. Have a small prize for them at the end, and you have the reward of knowing your child is practicing on skills that they need additional practice on!

★ OUR LEARNING

- Reading-** I can use photographs and text features to answer questions. I can answer questions about a story.
- Phonics-** I can read and write words with ending blends (-mp, -ng, -nk). I can read and write words with inflectional ending -s, -ed, and -ing.
- Writing:** I can write an informative text. I can use and read contractions. I can identify pronouns.
- Math-** I can write numbers 1-80. I can add subtract within 15, including with word problems. I can create and read tally charts.
- Science/Social Studies-** I can discuss people who make contributions to my community. I can celebrate Halloween.
