He was an inspirational teacher, coach, and leader who promoted the "Chemic Pride" motto. "Trz" passed away in 1997 at the age of 48 after a very short battle with cancer. During his 25 years at Midland High School, Trz emphasized to his students and athletes the importance of participation, teamwork, hard work, respect for others and the challenging of one's self.

There is a \$1,000 scholarship awarded in his name each year to a graduating senior who exemplifies the attitude and work ethic emphasized by Mr. Trzcinski. Financial need is not a consideration and preference may be given to a student who meets all criteria and has lost a parent.
