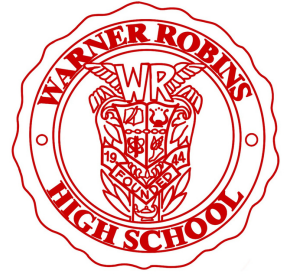

## Georgia High School Graduation Requirements

English/ Language Arts	<b>4 credits</b>	One English class in each year of high school, to include Ninth Grade Literature, American Literature and two other English classes.	
Mathematics	<b>4 credits</b>	One math class in each year of high school, to include Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and one other math class.	
Science	<b>4 credits</b>	One science class in each year of high school, to include Biology, Physical Science <b>or</b> Physics, Environmental Science <b>or</b> Chemistry <b>or</b> Earth Science or an AP Science and one other science class.	
Social Studies	<b>3 credits</b>	Three social studies classes, to include ½ credit American Gov't, World History, United States History and ½ credit Economics.	
Career, Technical and Agricultural Education	<b>3 credits</b>	Students must earn 3 credits, in any combination, from these three curriculum areas.	
Fine Arts		Students planning to attend a 4-year college or university immediately after high school must earn a minimum of 2 credits in a same foreign language.	
Foreign Language		Students who plan to continue a technical program of study at a technical college after high school are encouraged to take at least 3 credits in a single CTAE career pathway.	
Health and Physical Education	<b>1 credit</b>	½ credit Personal Fitness and ½ credit Health. Typically taken in the 9 <sup>th</sup> grade. A student taking 3 credits of JROTC will satisfy this requirement.	
Electives	<b>4 credits</b> (5 in Houston Co.)	Students planning to attend a 4-year college or university are encouraged to take at least 2 electives from academic curriculum areas.	
Total	<b>23 credits</b> (24 in Houston Co.)		
<b>Promotion to the next grade</b> is based upon credits earned. 10 <sup>th</sup> = 5 credits 11 <sup>th</sup> = 11 credits 12 <sup>th</sup> = 17 credits	EOC's count 20% of the students' final grade.	. . . . .	<b>1 credit</b> consists of two semesters; ½ a credit each. Credit is earned when a minimum passing grade is achieved. A semester lasts 18 weeks and consists of 90 hours of classroom instruction. Passing grade is 70 or above.
<b>23 credits</b> (24 in Houston Co.) must be earned to earn a high school diploma. A student has the opportunity to earn 28 credits in 4 years of high school during the school day.			

# College Prep Checklist

## 9th Grade

### Student's 9th Grade Checklist

- Create a GAfutures account at [GAfutures.org](https://GAfutures.org). GAfutures is a great resource to help you explore and plan for college and your career.
- Review your Plan&Pay4CollegeGA 9th grade letter found on your GAfutures Dashboard.
- Start thinking about what careers you may be interested in and choose your classes accordingly. Check out the Career Exploration section on GAfutures to help you determine your interests and the different types of careers out there.
- Be sure to introduce yourself to your school counselor. Make an appointment to discuss your classes and ask questions about education options after high school.
- Make sure your parents have a copy of your class schedule and list of teachers.
- Ask your counselor or teachers what Advanced Placement courses are available whether you are eligible and how to enroll.
- Keep track of your extracurricular activities (volunteering, sports, band, etc.), awards and recognition.
- Develop good study habits. Your HOPE GPA begins calculating as soon as you set foot into high school. Create a schedule and stick to it.
- Discuss financial aid and college savings options with your parents. Consider opening a Path2College 529 Plan college savings account and contribute regularly. It's never too early or too late to save!
- Use The Federal Student Aid Estimator to help understand your options for paying for college.
- Participate in school or community-based activities that interest you.
- Talk to your counselor about dual enrollment and your education opportunities after high school-college, military, career.
- Check your HOPE GPA through your GAfutures account beginning the 10th grade to see if you are on track to be eligible for the HOPE or Zell Miller Scholarship.\*

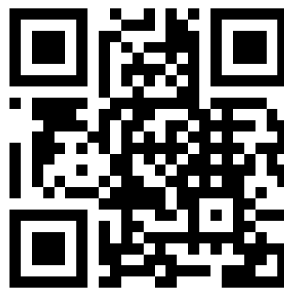

## Copyright Piracy Awareness Notification

Title I, Part A, Section 1116 of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) states that Title I schools shall provide information and resources to help parents and families work with their children to understand the harms of copyright piracy. In keeping with this requirement, definitions of relevant terms as well as links to websites that may be helpful in educating children concerning copyright piracy regulations are included below.

Copyright-a form of protection given to creators and authors of literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works. A copyright means that the author has the right to do or let other do any of the following things:

- Make copies
- Distribute copies
- Perform work publicly
- Display work publicly
- Make modifications or adaptations

Generally, it is illegal for anyone to do any of the things listed above without the creator's permission. However, there are some exceptions and limitations to this right. One major limitation is the Doctrine of Fair Use.

Copyright Piracy-Unauthorized reproduction for sale or use of a copyrighted work such as a book, lyric or software.
