



Renowned Illustrator Speaks to Art Students

For artists, inspiration and advice from other artists is crucial, especially when those artists are experts. On January 14th, Author/ Illustrator Preston McDaniels was invited to share his wisdom and experience in Mrs. Renate Johansen's art classes. Mr. McDaniels has illustrated a vast number of children's books, including The Princess and the Kiss, Cynthia Rylant's Newberry Award winner Lighthouse Family series, Francis O'Roark Dowell's From the Highly Scientific Notebooks of Phineas Mc-Guire, and many more. Published in 2007 by Simon and Schuster, McDaniels' self-penned work A Perfect Snowman has been called "transcendent" and "a charmer of a tale, worthy of being passed from generation to generation," by the Trades. Born in Story City Iowa, McDaniels grew up struggling with frail health through most of his childhood. However, he was often found drawing and doodling on every surface available throughout the house. Ernest Shepard, Garth Williams, and Maurice Sendak are some of McDaniels' most inspirational figures, and McDaniels also draws from his childhood influences and experiences.

Having McDaniels come to Nebraska Christian was both an honor and a privilege. He, along with many other artists, inspires art students to persevere with pa-

students and often form enduring friendships with them. Some of our American students even have traveled overseas to spend time in their friends' countries and experience the sites, history, and culture. Our American dorm students also make life-long friendships with other believers from across the state.

We are currently beginning to take applications for next year. If you know of any students who might like the opportunity to receive a Christ-centered education and get to know students from across Nebraska and countries such as China, Kenya, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand, and Vietnam, please tell them about us. Have them contact us if they'd like more information or to schedule a visit. A great day to visit will be on April 6th, which is our campus preview day.

One area that we haven't finished paying off is the water project. As we look ahead to what buildings and updates might occur on campus in the next 50 years, this project was a critical and efficient way to improve campus infrastructure because it wasn't only for the new dorm; it connected all of our buildings to city water. This was needed due to codes on new or updated buildings, which require fire suppression. Our well couldn't pump enough gallons a minute to provide what we needed, and this, in the long-term, was the cheapest and best solution. We still owe \$115,000 on this project; please prayerfully consider your part to help us close it out.

In 2016, you are going to hear much more about Phase 2 of "The Next 50 Years" Capital Campaign, which involves our current gym, music, kitchen, and dining facility. There are some initial drawings that involve both an upgrade to the current facility—roof, exterior, windows, etc.—and a new build of a kitchen, dining, and multi-purpose gym facility. This would allow for more space for our music program; a dining room/commons area that


