

Annual Public Notice of College, Career and Technical Education Opportunities 2025-2026

In compliance with the United States Department of Education Office for Civil Rights (OCR) Guidelines for Eliminating Discrimination in Vocational Programs, 34 C. F. R. Part 100, App. B, IV (O), all career and technical education opportunities of the Franklin County School System are, and will be offered, without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, or disability.
