CSBA Professional Governance Standards

Adopted by the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District April 11, 2001

THE BOARD

School districts and county offices of education are governed by boards, not by individual trustees. While understanding their separate roles, the board and superintendent work together as a "governance team." This team assumes collective responsibility for building unity and creating a positive organizational culture in order to govern effectively.

To operate effectively, the board must have a unity of purpose and:

- Keep the district focused on learning and achievement for all students.
- Communicate a common vision.
- Operate openly, with trust and integrity.
- Govern in a dignified and professional manner, treating everyone with civility and respect.
- Govern within board-adopted policies and procedures.
- Take collective responsibility for the board's performance.
- Periodically evaluate its own effectiveness.
- Ensure opportunities for the diverse range of views in the community to inform board deliberations.

THE INDIVIDUAL TRUSTEE

In California's public education system, a trustee is a person elected or appointed to serve on a school district or county board of education. Individual trustees bring unique skills, values and beliefs to their board. In order to govern effectively, individual trustees must work with each other and the superintendent to ensure that a high quality education is provided to each student.

To be effective, an individual trustee:

- Keeps learning and achievement for *all* students as the primary focus.
- Values, supports and advocates for public education.
- Recognizes and respects differences of perspective and style on the board and among staff, students, parents and the community.
- Acts with dignity, and understands the implications of demeanor and behavior.
- Keeps confidential matters confidential.
- Participates in professional development and commits the time and energy necessary to be an informed and effective leader.
- Understands the distinctions between board and staff roles, and refrains from performing management functions that are the responsibility of the superintendent and staff.
- Understands that authority rests with the board as a whole and not with individuals.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BOARD

The primary responsibilities of the board are to set a direction for the district, provide a structure by establishing policies, ensure accountability and provide community leadership on behalf of the district and public education. To fulfill these responsibilities, there are a number of specific jobs that effective boards must carry out.

Effective boards:

- Involve the community, parents, students and staff in developing a common vision for the district focused on learning and achievement and responsive to the needs of all students.
- Adopt, evaluate and update policies consistent with the law and the district's vision and goals.
- Maintain accountability for student learning by adopting the district curriculum and monitoring student progress.
- Hire and support the superintendent so that the vision, goals and policies of the district can be implemented.
- Conduct regular and timely evaluations of the superintendent based on the vision, goals and performance of the district, and ensure that the superintendent holds district personnel accountable.
- Adopt a fiscally responsible budget based on the district's vision and goals, and regularly monitor the fiscal health of the district.
- Ensure that a safe and appropriate educational environment is provided to all students.
- Establish a framework for the district's collective bargaining process and adopt responsible agreements.
- Provide community leadership on educational issues and advocate on behalf of students and public education at the local, state and federal levels.

1. Approval of Support for Proposition 15, Tax on Commercial and Industrial Properties for Education and Local Government Funding Initiative (The California Schools and Local Communities Funding Act of 2020) - Resolution Number 7-2020-2021

Resource Person: Antonio Garcia, Superintendent

Summary of Proposition 15: Proposition 15 would amend the State Constitution to require commercial and industrial properties, except those zoned as commercial agriculture, to be taxed based on their market value. In California, the proposal to assess taxes on commercial and industrial properties at market value, while continuing to assess taxes on residential properties based on the purchase price, is known as *split roll*. The change from the purchase price to market value would be phased-in beginning in the fiscal year 2022-2023. Properties, such as retail centers, whose occupants are 50 percent or more small businesses would be taxed based on market value beginning in the fiscal year 2025-2026 (or at a later date that the legislature decides on).

The ballot initiative would make an exception for properties whose business owners have \$3.00 million or less in holdings in California; these properties would continue to be taxed based on their purchase price.

APPROVAL OF SUPPORT FOR PROPOSITION 15: CALIFORNIA SCHOOLS AND LOCAL COMMUNITIES FUNDING ACT OF 2020

RESOLUTION NO. 7-2020-2021

WHEREAS, public schools in California face challenges in providing an equitable and fair education for a student population with vast differences in language, poverty, parental education level, and other social, educational, and economic factors; and

WHEREAS, research has proven that investments in high needs students raises achievement levels, lowers poverty, and increases the productivity of the workforce; and

WHEREAS, although California has the fifth largest economy in the world, it falls short in providing adequate funding to services that support our children, ranking 41st in the nation on education spending; and

WHEREAS, California's funding shortfalls has direct consequences for our children: California is in the bottom 10 states in the nation in teacher-to-student ratios and guidance counselor-to-student ratios, and last in librarian-to-student ratios; and

WHEREAS, property taxes on commercial and industrial properties are a principal source of funding for our schools and local communities. While other states assess commercial and industrial property based on its fair market value, California allows commercial and industrial property taxes to go many years, even decades, without reassessment; and

WHEREAS, passage of Proposition 15: California Schools and Local Communities Funding Act of 2020 would preserve most of Proposition 13 as it does not affect property taxes for homeowners, renters, farmers, or small businesses because the initiative exempts all residential and agricultural property and exempts all small business owners whose property is worth less than \$3 million.

WHEREAS the California Legislative Analyst's Office estimates that Proposition 15: California schools and Local Communities Funding Act of 2020 reclaims between \$6.5 billion and \$12 billion in property tax revenue every year by closing loopholes in California's property tax system.

WHEREAS School Services of California estimates that the District will receive somewhere between \$3,633,642 to \$6,428,751 in additional funding per year if Proposition 15: California Schools and Local Communities Funding Act of 2020 passes.

WHEREAS, this campus will have up to 18 or more school bus trips and multiple vehicle trips from teachers, maintenance support staff, FFA students, and vendor truck trips for supplies and animal feed.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board supports the proposed Circulation Element amendment to allow for the extension of Union Valley Parkway to the east of the existing interchange. This extension will eventually allow for a full public road connection to Rodeo Drive thereby providing a secondary route to the new school facility. This action will provide added safety and access.

F. Authorization to Utilize Region 4 ESC/OMNIA Partners – The HON Company, LLC for District-wide Purchases of Furniture, and Installation for the length of the Contract through April 30, 2023

September 2020 and Coronavirus Activities

1. Santa Maria High School Construction Projects

SMHS Reconstruction – Rachlin Partners

- Increment 1, Phase 1 50 Classroom and Administration Building: Vernon Edwards Constructors (VEC) received sub-contractor bids on September 16, 2020. VEC has reviewed the bids and presented an initial draft of the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) proposal for review by the project team including Rachlin Partners, Support Services, Maintenance and Operations, and District Administration staff. The first team evaluation meeting to start the process of verifying costs occurred September 28, 2020 with follow-up item assessments expected to continue throughout October. Barring any issues requiring additional review time, it continues to be anticipated a GMP will be presented to the board at the November meeting.
- Increment 2, Phase (To Be Determined) Administration Building Conversion to Classrooms: Rachlin Partners and its engineering consultants are evaluating comments received by Division of the State Architect (DSA) and will be working to make plan adjustments and provide responses as required.

SMHS Proposition 39 - HVAC Replacement Bldg. 240 - Ravatt-Albrecht Architects

 The project Architect is working directly with the original manufacturer of the existing roofing structure to determine necessary structural modifications that will allow for the installation of replacement rooftop HVAC equipment. Upon receipt of the modification package, the architect will complete the design package and a tentative project schedule to move the project forward toward DSA for review.

SMHS Synthetic Turf Replacement – Support Services

 A Notice of Completion has been approved by the Board and the final retention release is in process. This project is closed.

SMHS Eight Portable Classroom Installation – Rachlin Partners

 All construction and punch list work are complete. A Notice of Completion has been approved by the School Board and issued to the County. Final project closeout documentation activities are underway, and a final pay application is in process. (Photos)

2. Ernest Righetti High School Construction Projects

ERHS New 38-Classroom Building – Rachlin Partners

 Evaluations of data gathered during a two-day simulated occupancy test conducted in July continues. As previously noted, the results of the test indicated the system is operational, however, a determination on whether the system is modulating properly around the set point variance (plus or minus 4 degrees) is still being evaluated. Additional testing is being considered. Approximately \$80,000 in funds remain held pending resolution of the HVAC control issue.

ERHS Maintenance and Operations Building – Rachlin Partners

The Architect and Electrical Consultant are evaluating the results of electronic scans and
potholing data showing actual depths of existing underground conduit and pipe. The goal
is to determine if potential footing clearance conflicts with current design plans. Conflicts
may require footing modifications or rerouting conduit and pipe. An updated project
schedule will be provided upon completion of the reviews.

ERHS Phase 2 Improvements – Rachlin Partners

 DSA plans and specification approval have been received. Planning meetings will occur during October and November to develop a temporary housing plan, phased project schedule, and draft bid package.
