

FAFSA® Announcements





All applicants for federal student aid are considered either "independent" or "dependent."

INDEPENDENT STUDENT

If you answer **YES** to ANY of these questions, then you may be an independent student. You may not be required to provide parental information on your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form.

DEPENDENT STUDENT*

If you answer NO to ALL of these questions, then you may be considered a dependent student and may be required to provide your parents' financial information when completing the FAFSA form.

- Will you be 24 or older by Jan. 1 of the school year for which you are applying for financial aid? For example, if you plan to start school in August 2021 for the 2021–22 school year, will you be 24 by Jan. 1, 2021 (i.e., were you born before Jan. 1, 1998)?
- Are you married or separated but not divorced?
- Will you be working toward a master's or doctorate degree (such as M.A., MBA, M.D., J.D., Ph.D., Ed.D., etc.)?
- Do you have children who receive more than half of their support from you?
- Do you have dependents (other than children or a spouse) who live with you and receive more than half of their support from you?
- Are you currently serving on active duty in the U.S. armed forces for purposes other than training?
- 7 Are you a veteran of the U.S. armed forces?
- At any time since you turned age 13, were both of your parents deceased, were you in foster care, or were you a ward or dependent of the court?
- Are you an emancipated minor or are you in a legal guardianship as determined by a court?
- Are you an unaccompanied youth who is homeless or self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?


"If you don't answer "yes" to any of the questions above, you're still considered a dependent student for purposes of applying for federal student aid even if you don't live with your parents, are not claimed by your parents on their tax forms, or are paying for your own bills and educational expenses.






Who's My Parent When I Fill Out My FAFSA® Form?

Based on the information we have on record for you, your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is 0. You may be eligible to receive a Federal Pell Grant and other federal student aid. Your school will use your EFC to determine your financial aid eligibility for federal grants, loans, and work-study funds, and possible funding from your state and school.

Your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form has been selected for a review process called verification. Your school has the authority to request copies of certain financial documents from you (and your spouse).

There is a limit to the total amount of Federal Pell Grants that a student may receive, which is the equivalent of six school years. Based on information reported to the National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS®) database by the schools you have attended, you have received Federal Pell Grants for the equivalent of between one-half and one school year.

There is a limit to the total amount of subsidized Federal student loans that you may receive, Visit StudentAid.gov/sub-unsub for more information.

You reported that you are or were in foster care. You may be eligible for assistance through federal programs for foster youth, such as the John H. Chafee Foster Care Independence Program and/or the Education and Training Voucher (ETV) Program. For more information contact your state ETV coordinator. Based on your EFC of 0, you may be eligible to receive a Federal Pell Grant of up to \$6,495 for the 2022-23 school year provided you have not met or exceeded the lifetime limit established for the Federal Pell Grant program.



Calculation of Financial Need


