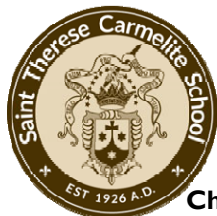

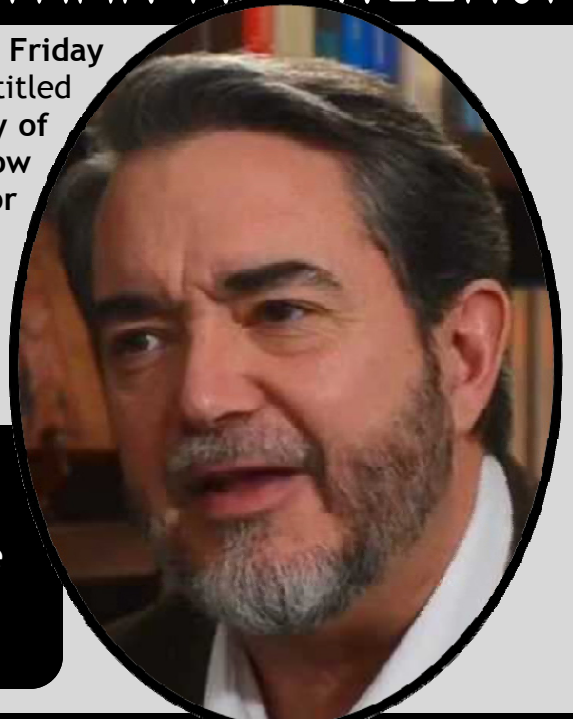
NEW PARISHIONERS: WELCOME TO ST. THERESE! PLEASE REGISTER ONLINE OR IN THE PARISH OFFICE

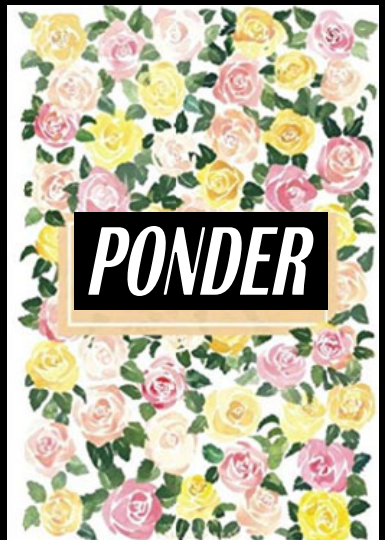

MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY

Mary is YOUR Mother

How often do you stop and reflect on the title of Mary as Mother—not only the Mother of God who gave to us all the gift of Jesus—but YOUR Mother? Reflect on the ways in which your Mother Mary is your companion on this journey of life, and how—with and through her Son, Jesus—she invites you to enter into a deeper and more meaningful relationship with God the Father.

From the Cross, Jesus generously gave the gift of His mother to all humanity. Who wouldn't want a maternal figure by his or her side throughout life to motivate, comfort, counsel, and simply love us as we are? What an awesome treasure we have as Catholics!

The Blessed Mother, who has appeared and revealed her presence throughout the world, is the same Mary whose intercession we seek, the same mother who accompanies us, and the same advocate who is with all of her children. The various titles of Mary are ways in which people of every culture relate to her and ways in which she reveals aspects of herself. Through her many titles and images, people can personally and communally identify with Mary.

For example, in the apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Mary appeared to St. Juan Diego and proclaimed herself to be the spiritual mother of all humanity. In Fatima, she appeared to three shepherd children and entrusted her messages to them, urging them to join in promoting the praying of the Rosary to bring peace to the world. In Banneux, Belgium, she described herself as the Virgin of the Poor, and she promised to intercede for the poor, the sick, and the suffering.

Litanies in honor of Mary remind us of her role as Mother of Divine Grace, Mother of Good Counsel, Virgin Gentle in Mercy, Mirror of Justice, Throne of Wisdom, Gate of Heaven, Refuge of Sinners, Comfort of the Troubled, Help of Christians, Queen of Peace, and more. These various titles portray some of the roles Mary fulfills as she intercedes for us. In daily life, especially in times of trouble and turmoil, we can find a strong source of hope and strength by looking to our Mother Mary for loving comfort.

By her life and through her apparitions, our Blessed Mother invites us to believe in her Son and to be steadfast in prayer. She offers consolation and help to all who turn to her. Through her apparitions and miraculous intercession, she has strengthened the faith, hope, and love of her children, and they in turn have shared her message of hope and faith with others.

Now is the time to reaffirm your relationship with your Heavenly Mother. Turn to her and find strength, hope, and consolation. She will **never** cease to hear your prayers. She will love you and accompany you all the days of your life, just as she so faithfully and lovingly stood by her Son, Jesus.



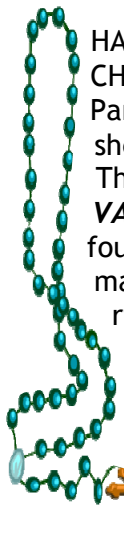
REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS & THE EASTER SEASON



TODAY'S READINGS: In today's First Reading from the Book of Acts, we heard, "...there arose no little dissension and debate..." Did that happen to you at work or home this week? Most of us can recall run-ins with co-workers, even with the boss. Did it happen while socializing with friends? Go easy on politics, religion...even sports! At home? Even the most peaceful household experiences a little "give-and-take" now and then. So where was it that "there arose no little dissension and debate"? That tumultuous conflict occurred in Antioch and Jerusalem among our first Christian ancestors, disrupting the community life of the early Church. But today's Acts of the Apostles shows how beautifully the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus in today's Gospel, helped the Church achieve a grace-filled resolution. What evolved was that "reconciled diversity," envisioned in today's reading from Revelation, and the wondrous experience of Jesus' promised Gospel gift: *"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."*

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION: Why is it still Easter? The roots of our tradition of fifty days of rejoicing from Easter to Pentecost lie in the seven-day rhythm of the Jewish week, drawn from the six days of creation plus a Sabbath day. A favorite name for the Lord's Day among our ancestors in the faith was, "The Eighth Day," meaning that in Christ a breakthrough to a new humanity was achieved. With that inner architecture, it makes sense to see Pentecost as a week of weeks, forty-nine days plus one, again signaling that a new age has begun in Christ and the outpouring of His Spirit. The Jewish appreciation for Pentecost gave rise to the Jubilee year, the fiftieth year, when debts were released and prisoners set free. Today, the character of our Easter Sundays is conveyed by joyful Alleluias and the rite of sprinkling at Mass. Long ago, people expressed this joy by suspending all rules of fasting and by never kneeling at liturgy. These customs all point to our conviction that time is holy. There is an elegant balance to the Christian year: Forty days of Lenten fast and discipline give way to fifty days of unrestrained rejoicing. That's why it is still Easter!

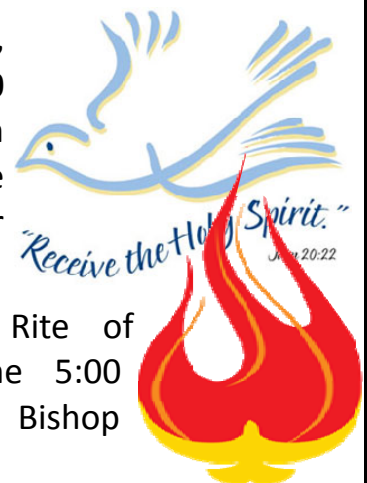
