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TK and Kindergarten

This week kindergarten is finishing up the third unit in reading. They should know the sound of the letters a, m, c, d, g, i, o, and t. Students are learning to sound out three-letter words using the sounds they learned. We continue to work on identifying the beginning, middle, and end sounds of short words. Kindergarteners also learned about the five senses. They learned about parts of the eye, how we smell, how we hear, and the sense of touch.

In math, kindergarteners are learning about the number 10.

TK is learning about families. They are also learning nursery rhymes and how to recognize syllables in words they hear. TK is working with the numbers 1 through 5.

Pumpkins! Pumpkins! Pumpkins!

Students read about and explored pumpkins this week. For art, we made a diagram of a pumpkin using paper plates, yarn, paint, and paper. We made observations and collected data on pumpkins as well. We measured their circumference, weighed their mass, and determined whether they would sink or float.

After studying the external features of these large fruits we dissected them! Students grouped seeds by tens to see which pumpkin had the most. We think we made a link to larger circumference and larger seed

yield! After counting seeds we began germinating them and will plant them next week.

Our explorers used a VENN diagram as a pre-write to organize how two pumpkins were alike and different. We used this graphic organizer to write paragraphs comparing and contrasting our two pumpkins.

It was a busy, fun week with a busy, fun group of students!

Fifth and Sixth Grade Classroom Mr. Burlingame

This week 5th grade finished up their math chapter in decimal addition and subtraction. We've practiced in our math books and on iXL and it has been really fun to see this group grow in their understanding of decimals. 6th grade started a new chapter in math this week on integers and understanding negative numbers. They also started plotting on coordinate planes and will soon be solving linear equations.

Science has taken us through the properties of air and the composition of the atmosphere. We have now started looking at how airplanes and gliders use these properties to stay in the air. Students have modeled gliders by folding paper airplanes and noting their behavior in different environmental conditions. They then attempted to achieve stable flight by changing the shape of the airplane to counteract different forces.
