The Counseling Department has been working with all students these past few weeks in small groups to explore their aptitudes, interests, and career goals by using a program called Smart Futures. Smart Futures is an online career planning and portfolio platform that helps guide students as they make graduation plans. This platform helps students answer three main questions: Who am I, where am I going and how do I get there?

It uses surveys, activities and skill-building tools to help students identify realistic career goals. From there, students are able to explore careers that match their goals. After a student figures out a career path — which could include a four-year college, trade school or military — they are connected with relevant majors and schools.

The PA Department of Education requires Career Planning and Portfolios for every graduating student under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Students will graduate with different artifacts in their Smart Futures portfolios from interest inventories, to resumes, financial awareness and post-secondary planning.

This online career portfolio allows student access both in school and at home. Students find Smart Futures by going to their <u>Clever account</u> or by going to the <u>Smart Futures website</u> and logging in.
