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Description of Planning Process
<p>The Penney High School Leadership Team met in May to discuss issues and strengths from the previous school year. In this first initial meeting we reflected on the school year and were able to identify specific positives and negatives from the 24-25 school year. When we met again in July, we were able to specifically identify what our specific goals needed to be for the upcoming school year. We looked at EOC scores and student involvement numbers along with our own personal observations from the previous school year to help guide us in our goal setting.</p>

As part of the initial, large group meeting, we reviewed our building's data which included: MAP results, student attendance, past APRs, and district family demographics which included locale of our parents' employment, annual average salary, and primary care givers identity (grandparents, parents, divorced parent, etc.) Using the data, each domain group then brainstormed district strengths and areas for improvement. These were shared out and compiled for each group to consider as they wrote goals. The generated lists follow:

Building Strengths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - We have strong community support for our school, students and teachers. - For the 23-24 school year, we had EOC scores above the state average for all but one of the tested areas. - We finished our new high school in August 2023. - We will have a new all weather track finished in August 2024. - We have a strong experienced core group of teachers. - We received full credit for our CCR scores in the class of 2025. - We have strong extracurricular programs at Penney with four of our teams earning state trophies (Football 2nd, Cheer 3rd, Winter Guard 2nd, Girls Track & Field 2nd).
Areas for Improvement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - We have an inexperienced principal at the high school. - We have lost experienced teachers to retirement over the last 5 years. - We have new teachers in all but one of our EOC tested courses. - Forty-five percent of our student population is on Free and Reduced Lunch

Goal 2:

SMART Goal Penney High School will have 70% of their students regularly involved in extracurricular activities throughout the 25-26 school year.				
Data Points & Rationale During the 24-25 school year we set a goal to increase student involvement. Our numbers of students involved in athletics across the board had been lower than they were during the 2019-2020 school year. After the 24-25 school year we were able to determine that just shy of 60% of our students were regularly involved in activities. We have decided to increase that number to 70% for the 2025-2026 school year. Studies have shown that students who are involved in extracurricular activities are more likely to graduate and have higher GPAs and attendance.

We want to help our students take pride in their facilities and help us to monitor damaging behaviors.
