## WARREN/ALVARADO/OSLO PUBLIC SCHOOL EDUCATION FOUNDATION ANNUAL MEETING March 16, 2022

The annual meeting of the WAO Public School Education Foundation was held at the WAO High School Multipurpose Room on March 16, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. Members present included Melanie Nelson, Carol Bowman, Duane Swanson, Russell Miller, and Pamela Jubie. Jordan Johnson, school board liaison.

Melanie extended a welcome and read the Mission Statement.

**Notice of Annual Meeting:** Pam read the annual meeting notice.

**2021 Financial Reports:** Katie Holte, Phil Thompson & Associates, reviewed the 2021 year-end statements with comparison to 2020. Any questions were addressed.

**2021 Scholarship Recipients:** Scholarship night, 46 scholarships valued at \$99,300 (including renewable funds) were presented. In January 2022, \$85,200 was paid out (approximately 86%).

**2021 Classroom Purchases:** Purchases totaling \$49,051.30 were approved by the Foundation.

**Chairman's Report:** Available for review in booklet. Carol A. reiterated how appreciative the Foundation is of the great support from the WAO community, alumni, and local businesses with donations. She again thanked the board members and volunteers for all their hard work over the year.

Committee Reports: See Exhibit A of Annual Report for details.

Fundraising: Total raised in 2021 was \$35,692.47.

Alumni: Total membership 1394.

Grants: None reported.

**New Scholarships**: Three scholarships were presented for the first time in 2021 – the Betty Melgard Scholarship, the Stefan Johnson Memorial Scholarship, and the Bob Mattson and Dave Schroeder Scholarship. The Stuart Hurst Angel Award was also established and presented for the first time.

**Call for Adjournment:** Pam made a motion to adjourn the annual meeting and Russ seconded. Motion carried.

**Staff Presentations:** WAO Elementary Kindergarten teachers – Cindy Franks, Sadie Gornowicz, and Lana Maruska – shared their classroom experiences with the 3 sets of kitchen sets which were purchased through the Foundation. The sets allow for dramatic play with the children role-playing which builds social skills and aids in language/vocabulary development. They shared giant thank-you letters from the classes and pictures.

WAO Special Education teacher, Mary Stanislowski, spoke of the Kindness Cart which was funded through the Foundation. The Kindness Cart was manned by special education students who would bring treats to teaching staff of both schools. The kids loved it and teachers greatly appreciated the gesture.

### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

Another year is in the history books for the Warren/Alvarado/Oslo Public School Education Foundation. We continue to be more visible in the communities that we serve through our programs and actions. Through our visibility, we strive to provide for the district via members of the communities, alumni/staff of the former Warren, Alvarado, Oslo, and Valley North Districts in addition to the combined WAO District and Staff. These folks have helped us carry out our motto "We Can't Succeed Without You!"

July brought many alumni and friends "home" for class reunions, the Marshall County Fair, and our annual golf scramble. Year after year, our board, along with many volunteers, put in many hours to make this event run smoothly. We certainly couldn't do this project without our wonderful volunteers that give so freely of their time. We are also very indebted and grateful to our sponsors/donors, golfers and to everyone that helped in any way. We cleared over \$26,000. The Saturday open house at the school buildings brought many alumni, families and friends to walk down their memory lane. Year after year, we hear the comment about the cleanliness and great upkeep of the buildings.

We had two raffle drawings during the fair. One was a 50/50 drawing that brought in over \$1,600. The other was a \$100

ticket raffle with only a limited number sold. It brought in almost \$7,000.

The Class of 2022 had 45 scholarships totaling \$68,250 presented to them this past year. Many of these scholarships are facilitated by the Foundation, but we also presented seven of our own. Many of the scholarships have more than one recipient. In addition, some second, third, and fourth year students each receive \$1,000 from the Greg M. Haugen Memorial Scholarship and the Robert L. Strandberg Memorial Scholarship to continue their education.

The Oslo Reunion Committee had money in a fund that they designated for scholarships. This enabled 2 scholarships that were a one-time award in the amount of \$675 each.

Many "things" are continued from year to year. New certified teaching staff are given \$200 to use for their classroom/department and a \$50 gift certificate from the WAO Warehouse to purchase Pony items. We also continue to fund water and snacks for all students during state testing. In addition, we continue to fund the annual spelling bee that is held each January. The winner of the local contest advances to the regional contest.

The WAO Staff is most appreciative of items that they have received in the fall or spring needs for their classroom/department. The mission statement of the

Foundation is the main guide in approving requests. The mission statement is: "The WAO Education Foundation promotes the highest quality education in our communities though the enhancement of public school education programs, projects, and activities, the establishment and awarding of post secondary scholarships; and the creation of private support opportunities for public elementary and secondary education." Thanks to the generosity of donors and alumni, it enabled the Foundation to approve \$25,955.53 of needs during 2022.

We also continue to send condolence letters to the families of deceased alumni staff, and "friends" of the Foundation. In 2022, 53 letters were mailed along with one of our brochures.

We have shown our appreciation to the WAO Staff, Personnel, and Board of Education for all of the things that they do for the students and school. During American Education Week, each employee was given a \$10.00 gift certificate from one of the three convenience stores in Warren. Also, for National Teacher Day in May, each member of the teaching staff was given a certificate that they could turn in for a free dilly bar at the Warren Dairy Queen. We are grateful to all employees for their dedication to the district.
