



6TH GRADE:

LA -

As part of our English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum, we will soon begin a unit titled *Finding Courage*. In this unit, students will read and consider works about people who develop the courage to face their own fears. We will examine several ways that fear affects us, as well as how people overcome a variety of fears. The texts we will read center on the Essential Question "How do you find courage in the face of fear?" This open-ended question is intended to spark thoughtful discussion. You may wish to explore this question with your student at home as well.

SS- Unit 1 Europe: Past Shapes the Present-The purpose of this unit is to provide an overview of civic concepts, particularly as it relates to the role of citizens in Europe in affecting the decisions made by their respective governments. Special attention is given to the governments of Germany, Russia, and the United Kingdom and how past historical events have shaped the present government.

Science-In the month of November, some 6th graders will explore the world of weathering, erosion, and deposition. Students will learn to discover the forces that shape the environment outside their front door and marvel at the moving rocks of Death valley California. No stone will go unturned as students explain the cracks in the sidewalk and feel the smooth texture of river rock. Rock on Perry Middle.

Math-For the month of November, we will be talking about equations and inequalities. Specifically, substituting, translating/ writing, and solving, both equations and inequalities. Also graphing inequalities.

7TH GRADE:

LA- The beginning of November will mark the start of Unit 3 in Language Arts. In Unit 3 we will explore the essential question, Is space exploration a daring adventure or dangerous risk? Some of the unit goals are analyzing mood, identifying central ideas, and developing an argument. Student textbooks are a great resource for parents to look at if they want to help students master the skills we are developing.

SS-World Geography students are studying political geography throughout the month of November and December.

7th grade Social Studies will begin studying Asia in November beginning with a look at the region's geography and cultures.

Science-7th Grade life science students will continue studying the human body systems, and then we will begin our study on genetics.

Math-Students in 7th grade Math are in the middle of Unit 2 which covers evaluating expressions and solving equations. Building upon their knowledge from 6th grade using the distributive property and solving one step equations, at the end of the unit students will be able to combine like terms, evaluate equivalent expressions, write, and solve two step and multistep equations, and solve multistep real-life mathematical problems. Students will apply their understanding of positive and negative rational numbers as well as properties of operations from Unit 1 as they begin to use numerical and algebraic expressions and equations to solve problems.

8TH GRADE:

LA- As a part of our ELA curriculum, we will begin our unit titled *Places We Call Home*. In this unit, studetns will analyze plot, themes, characters, themes, and imagery. We will center our texts around the essential question What are the places that shape who you are? This question will lead to our unit test before Christmas break and into our end of unit writing task

SS- This November in Georgia History we will begin Unit 6 where we will be examining the period from about 1875 until the end of the 19th Century known as the "New South." We will Evaluate key political, social, and economic changes that occurred in Georgia during this period as well as learning about the influence of Georgia-based businesses on the State's economic growth and development. This unit should take about two weeks and once complete we will begin Unit 7 which looks at Georgia as it enters the 20th Century. In this unit we will Analyze Georgia's participation in important events that occurred from World War I through the Great Depression. This unit is about three weeks long so it will last beyond the Thanksgiving break and into December.

Science-8th grade science will be finalizing their Unit on Matter. The next unit will focus on Energy.

Honors Physical Science-Students will begin the last unit of the semester. We will begin by looking at similarities and differences in electromagnetic and mechanical waves. We will move into looking at the electromagnetic spectrum, sound, and light.

Math-Algebra 1 is learning all about Functions and Sequences




