Head of School Report – Alyssa

- Recap of MCA scores from spring 2023
 - Overview of testing at school (Fastbridge, MCA, ACCESS)
 - MCA
 - Numbers assessed are very small, which can lead to large fluctuations year to year
 - Reading scores higher than St. Paul, higher than MN
 - Math scores higher than St. Paul, lower than MN, but within 10 points
 - Science (5th grade) 45 percent higher than St Paul, 20 percent higher than MN
 - Very hard to look at growth over the last few years: no assessments 2020, 2021 25% did not participate
 - However, starting to see patterns emerge: consistent growth over 2019 (last "normal" year) and percentages fairly consistently positive 2021-2023
 - Fastbridge used internally, scores similar but more nuanced than MCA, looking good
 - Montessori Effect we see steady improvement over time, 6th years are showing most proficiency
- Outdoor improvements
 - Shade sail
 - Irrigation for recess yard
 - Water fountain in recess yard as well
 - Stage! part of CMS capital improvement
 - Working on more nature play equipment for building, etc but backorder issues
 - o Back of the building space for adults outside is looking nicer too

Director of Business Operations – Chris Bewell

- Enrollment continually fluctuating
