The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

The LEA will determine educational needs by surveying parents and staff as well as assessing every kindergarten through twelfth grade student in the areas of reading and math. Identified needs will be addressed by providing the necessary supports such as hot spots for Internet access and Chromebooks for completing virtual learning assignments.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

All students will be assessed to identify learning gaps during the the first two weeks of school. After all students have been assessed, they will be grouped according to their performance. Students needing intervention, will be placed with the most qualified teachers who have, based on data, proven effective in closing achievement gaps.

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What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Staff members will participate in professional development sessions utilizing Schoology and Schools PLP as well as training on the use of the Chromebooks beginning July 30, 2020. In addition, staff will participate in health and safety procedures and protocol training. Virtual learning K-8 students will be assessed August, 20, 21, 24, and/or 25, 2020. They will also receive Schoology and Schools PLP utilization training on these days. Traditional/blended learning students will be assessed and trained beginning August 26, 2020 when they return to school. These funds will be used through September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

The LEA will use ESSER funds to purchase Chromebooks to implement a One-to-one initiative. Each student will be assigned a Chromebook that will allow them to complete assignments. Parents will be surveyed to determine the level of Internet access in the home. These funds were also used to purchase instructional supplies.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA receiving ESSER funds will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools as required under Section 18005 of Division B of the CARES Act.
- The LEA receiving ESSER funds will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools located within the LEA in the same manner as provided under Section 1117 of the ESEA, as determined through timely and meaningful consultation with representatives of non-public schools.

Pickens Academy will use the funds for purchased services to sanitize the building, purchase personal protection equipment, and to purchase custodial supplies. The LEA federal programs administrator and the headmaster of the private school met on June 18, 2020 to discuss services. Services began on July 31, 2020. All services will conclude by September 30, 2022

4. Other Assurances and Certifications

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA that receives ESSER funds will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its
 employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in
 compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. In addition, LEAs that accept funds will
 continue to pay employees and contractors to the greatest extent practicable based on the unique financial
 circumstances of the LEA. CARES Act funds generally will not be used for bonuses, merit pay, or similar
 expenditures, unless related to disruptions or closures resulting from COVID-19.
- The LEA will request technical assistance on the use of ESSER funds for remote learning, which includes both distance education as defined in Section 103(7) of the HEA and distance learning as defined in ESEA Section 8101(14), so that students can continue learning during school closures.

(5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;

(6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;

(7) that in the case of any project involving construction -

(A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
 (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;

(8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

(9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
(c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

(a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -

(1) ensuring equal opportunities to participate for all eligible students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in any project or activity carried out under an applicable program; and

(2) promoting the ability of such students, teachers, and beneficiaries to meet high standards.

(c) The Secretary may establish criteria and provide technical assistance for meeting the requirements of this section.
 (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.

What steps does the LEA propose to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program?

Every student will have access to an electronic device for virtual learning opportunities regardless of gender, race, color, national origin, disability, or age. All teachers and paraprofessionals will participate in professional development that will assist them in providing blended and virtual learning for students. The various professional development opportunities will focus on iStations, Stride Academy, Edgenuity, Schoology, Schools PLP, and Google Meet.
