Alfred E. Jones & Anna B. Jones Scholarship Candidates must be a high school graduate from Fayette County planning to continue their education with post-secondary school study. Although preference will be given to those who have chosen to study nursing or art, areas that were of special interest to Anna B. and Alfred Jones, respectively, applications from students who seek to pursue courses of study in other fields are certainly welcomed.

Betty Bayne Barnes Scholarship Fund for Women Candidates must be a female resident of Fayette County, holding a GPA of 3.0 or higher, either planning to attend or attending a college or university.

Career and Technical Education Scholarship Fund Candidate must be a graduating senior from a technical program.

Candidates must have a B average in both High School academics and technical programs. Candidates must score Competent or Advanced on End of Program Assessment (NOCTI or NIMS).

Carl S. Micarelli Memorial Scholarship Fund Candidates must be a Fayette County student attending or planning to attend the following schools including, but not limited to, California University of PA, Carnegie Mellon University, Duquesne University, Indiana University of PA, University of Pittsburgh or West Virginia University. Students must be majoring in music, music education or jazz studies with a GPA of 3.0 or higher.

CFFC Board of Directors Scholarship Fund Candidates must be a Fayette County resident, successfully completed college freshman year with a GPA of 3.0 (in a cumulative 4.0 scale), and must show financial need.



Candidates must hold a 3.0 GPA based on a 4.0 scale or maintain at least a 3.0 GPA while making progress toward a degree at the University of Pittsburgh or at West Virginia University.

Dr. Dennis F. Brestensky Scholarship Fund Candidate must be a Fayette County, PA resident attending or planning to attend Penn State University, Fayette – the Eberly Campus. Candidates must have a 3.3 GPA or higher and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be made to students pursuing a Bachelor's Degree.

Dr. Paul Pipik Fund for Study in the Health Sciences	Candidate must be a high school senior, attending a Fayette County, PA high school, holding a GPA of 3.0. Applicants must be accepted to a post-secondary school, major in the field of health science and demonstrate financial need.
George M. and Anna Hochheimer Scholarship	Candidates must be a Fayette County resident, show academic promise and financial need.
Helen Hulvey Scheggia Nursing Scholarship	Candidates must be a high school senior or graduate of a Fayette County, PA high school pursuing a career in nursing. Candidates must maintain a 3.0 or higher GPA.
Laurel Business Institute Scholarship Fund in Memory of Ruth and Milton Decker	This scholarship is available to students who have already completed at least two semesters of one of LBI's Associate Degree programs and who have maintained a 3.25 GPA. In order to submit this application, an LBI Scholarship Reference Form must be uploaded by one of your instructors.
Laurel Highlands Mustang Academic Scholarship	Candidates must be a graduating senior at Laurel Highlands High School and have a minimum 3.5 GPA. Candidates must participate in extracurricular activities.
Lillian's Legacy	Candidate must be a Fayette County resident planning to attend a 2 or 4 year post-secondary school. Consideration will be given to students demonstrating proven financial need and to minorities, but not necessary to receive the award.
Lulu A. Dudley Scholarship Fund	Candidates must be a Fayette County resident, show academic promise and financial need.
Melvin J. and Beatrice Vance Keller Memorial Scholarship	Candidates must be a Connellsville Area High School Senior, a Geibel Catholic Junior-Senior High School Senior, or a student that has received this award in previous years. Students must be pursuing a career in education. Awards are based on academic achievement, holding a 3.0 GPA (based on a 4.0 GPA scale), and financial need.
My Mother's Legacy Fund	Candidates must be a Fayette County resident, pursuing a career in healthcare or the healing arts.
Nancy Vance Jones Scholarship	Candidate must be a female resident of Fayette County, with a strong academic record. A graduate or graduating senior of a Fayette County High School. Demonstrate a significant level of interest and involvement in community service.


Parker A. Hess Memorial Scholarship	Candidate must be a high school senior at a Fayette County school. Applicants with a record of community service (volunteer work, firefighting, emergency medical services, charity work, etc.) will be given strong consideration. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and plan to pursue post-secondary education in the field of health or human services such as: Fire Science, Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement, Allied Healthcare (Nursing, Nursing Assistant, Therapist, Phlebotomy, Radiological Technician), etc.
Rita P. Peters Scholarship	Candidate must be a Fayette County resident enrolled full-time at Penn State Fayette who has completed at least 30 credit hours with a minimum 3.0 GPA based on a 4.0 scale.
Robert E. and Elouise R. Eberly Scholarship Endowment	Candidate must be a United States of America citizen, a Fayette County, PA resident and majoring in Nursing.
Sergeant Eric Hull Advised and Memorial Scholarship Funds	Candidate must be a Fayette County resident, attending or planning to attend college. Preference will be given to Culinary Arts students, however all eligible candidates are encouraged to apply.
Suzanne J. McMonagle Nursing Scholarship	Candidates must be a Fayette County, PA resident pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) or must be a Registered Nurse (RN) pursuing a BSN. Preference will be given to Albert Gallatin High School seniors or graduates. This award is renewable for up to four years, if the candidate maintains a 2.75 GPA and is a student in good standing. (2022-2023 award has already been selected as a renewal from previous scholarship)
The Legacy Scholarship Fund of Ernst Gottlieb Braun	Candidates must be a college student who has completed 36 credit hours and maintains a 3.0 GPA on a 1-4 scale. Candidates must be planning to study in any country within the European Union and be majoring in foreign language study, arts and crafts, architecture or history.
Wolford Swimmer Memorial Scholarship	Candidate must be a Fayette County student either attending or planning to attend college. Candidates must hold a 3.0 GPA (based on a 4.0 GPA scale) and show financial need.
Zackery R. Nelson Memorial Scholarship Fund	Candidates must be a Fayette County resident, planning to attend or attending any college, university or technical school. Students must hold a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Adults wishing to continue their education, but who are not currently enrolled in school, are also encouraged to apply.






VenCo by Cherie Dimaline



Publication date: March 28, 2023



Translated into English by Anton Hur Publication date: April 11, 2023



Who attacked Jacob, and why? And can Casey and the others figure it out before it's too late?



EXPEDITION ENDS: WHAT HAVE THEY FOUND?

PERSUASIVE ARTICLE - Lewis and Clark: brave explorers of unknown land, delving fearlessly into the vast expanse of dangerous, unexplored territory known as the Louisiana Purchase. Doesn't this ignite your inner explorer? Make you crave something new, an adventure? Well, look no further than the infamous Oregon Trail! That's right, you can be one of the many people uprooting their lives and families for a chance to live on the West Coast. That is . . . if you make it. The Oregon Trail is a 2000 mile long trail to Oregon Territory that takes six months of dawn-to-dusk travel and **\$600 for a family of four**. It takes months, maybe even years to save up for-so if you want to be like Lewis and Clark, battling your way to Western riches, you better start preparing soon. Sounds tempting, right? What's more, you'd have some of the same problems that Lewis and Clark themselves struggled with, such as very little food, water, and supplies. You'd face other dangers, too: the main ones being rough weather and geological barriers such as rivers, mountains, and deserts. Still think you can make it out there? Well, rest assured, this challenging journey won't be for nothing. Rich resources, mild climate, and cheap and available land lie ahead. This trip could be especially beneficial to Mormons. With the recent murder of their founder and leader, Joseph Smith, Mormons have no one else to turn to-with the exception of Brigham Young, who is escaping the persecutions by moving the entire religion out West. So, now that you know the risks and rewards, are you ready to face the dangers that Western life brings? Then let loose the explorer inside you and put your survival skills to the test! . . . Well? What are you waiting for?

INFORMATIVE ARTICLE - Not long ago, President Jefferson wanted to buy the Port of New Orleans from France so it could never be closed to United States trade again. Jefferson left there with more than he came for. As well as the New Orleans Port, he bought the Louisiana Purchase, a vast expanse of unexplored land between the Mississippi River and a western mountain range. This land doubled the size of America—but what can we do with land we know nothing about? That's where the Corps of Discovery comes in. The Corps of Discovery is a group of explorers led by Meriwether Lewis and William Clark to find the hidden riches of Jefferson's Purchase, as well as a route to the Pacific Ocean. Their group faced many roadblocks and dangers on their journey, and yet the group persevered through it, managing to make it to the "Rocky Mountains" and back. These disadvantages include lack of food, water, and supplies; no connection to or communication with the rest of the country; their boats were sunk in unknown waters; there were bugs . . . everywhere; and they didn't speak the languages of any Native American tribe. What people are calling the Lewis and Clark Expedition introduced the U.S. to new information such as new plants and animals as well as maps of our territory. In fact, one of these maps is pictured below to the left. On the expedition, the struggling group met Sacagawea, a Shoshone Indian woman who helped the Corps of Discovery tremendously. Sacagawea served as a guide and interpreter to the group of travelers, thus leading to newly established Native American connections out West. Most importantly, the newly explored land gave way to the start of Westward expansion, and began to put the idea of "Manifest Destiny" into the minds of Americans. All in all, the Lewis and Clark Expedition was a successful journey that may have shaped the future of the United States. Alas, only time will tell if it really is our "destiny" to own all land out west.


Lewis and Clark Expedition: A success or pointless?
