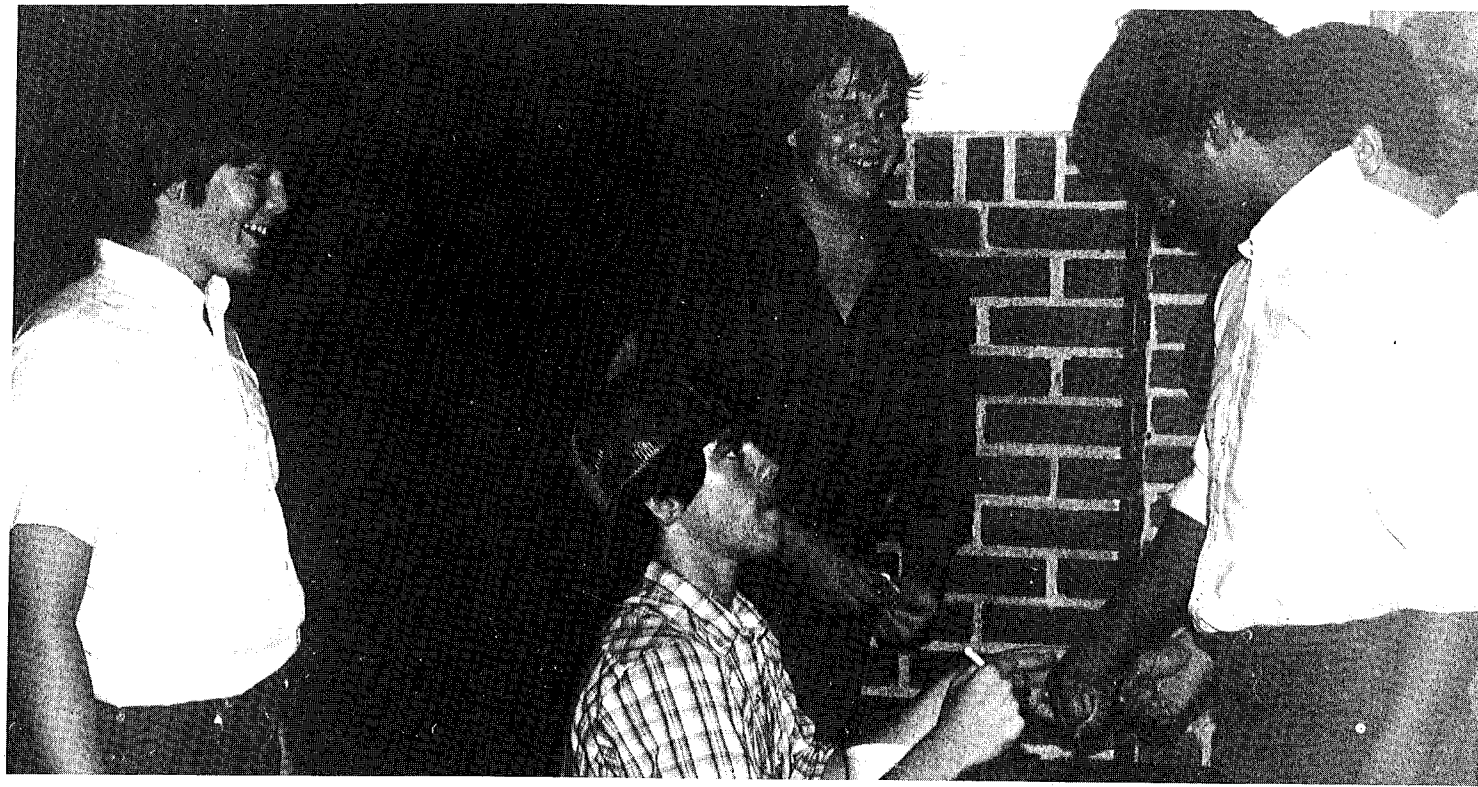

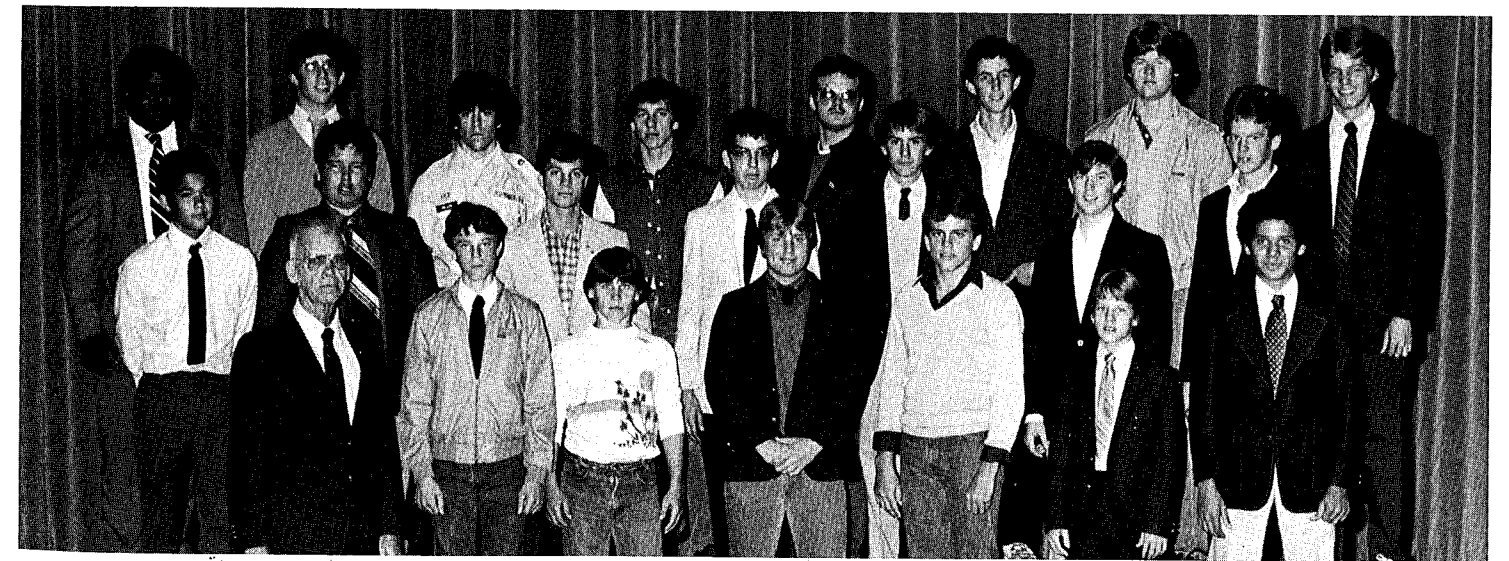

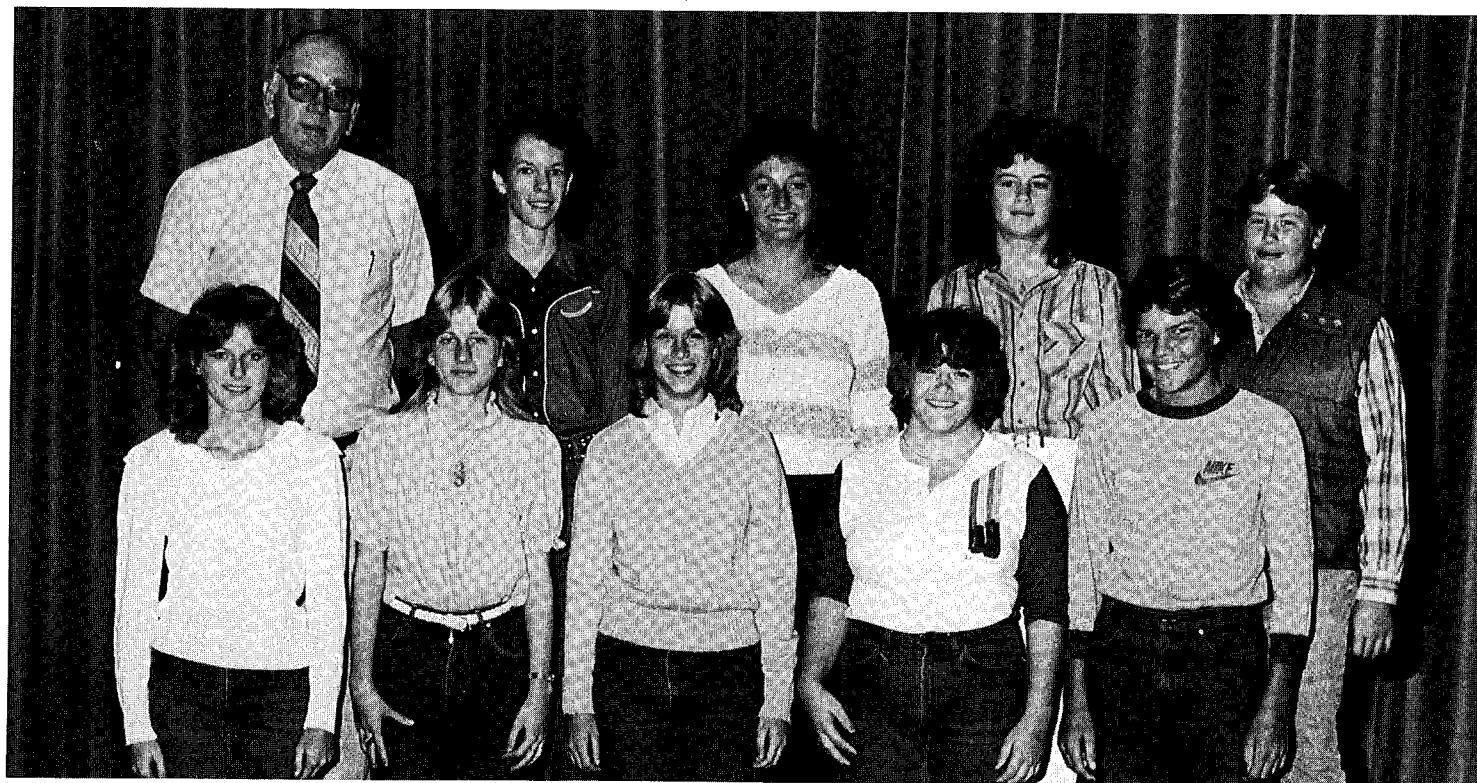
Leo Fades Away

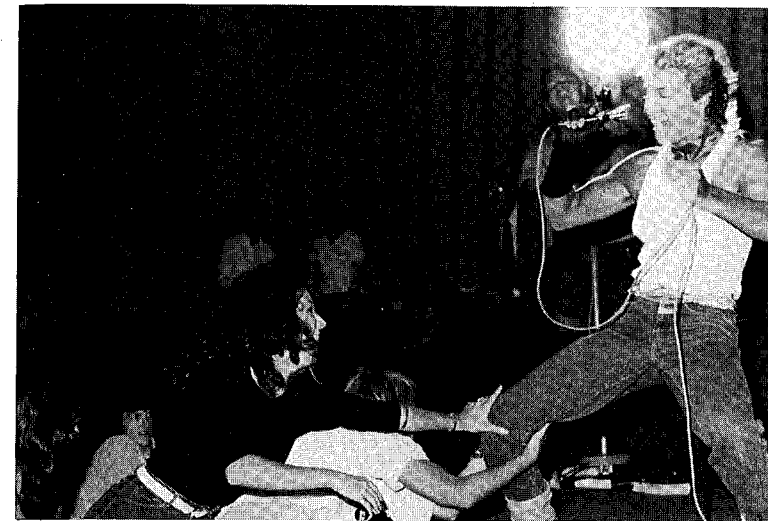

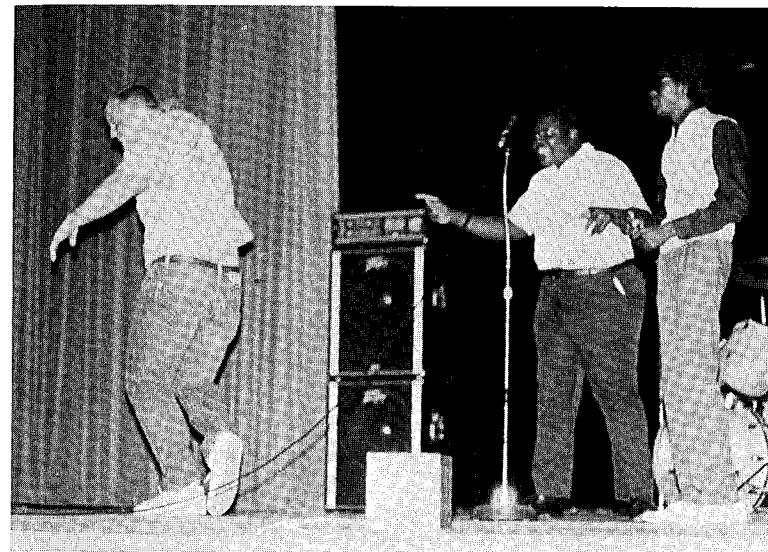

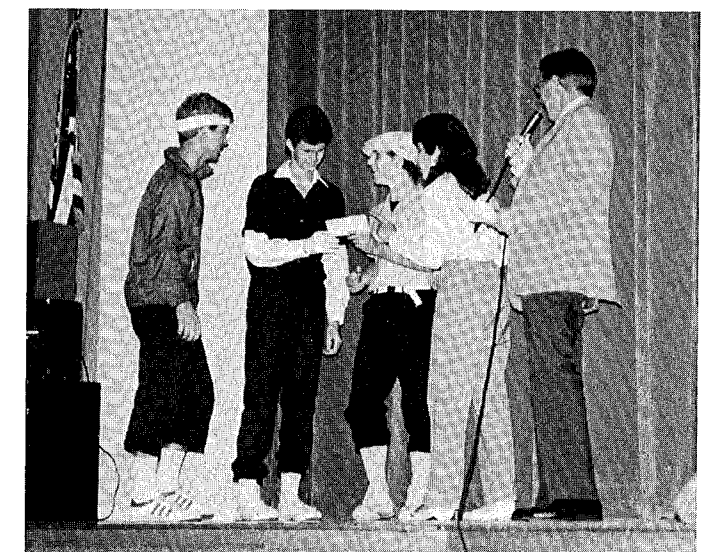

Everyone did a great job and are to be complimented for a job well done.



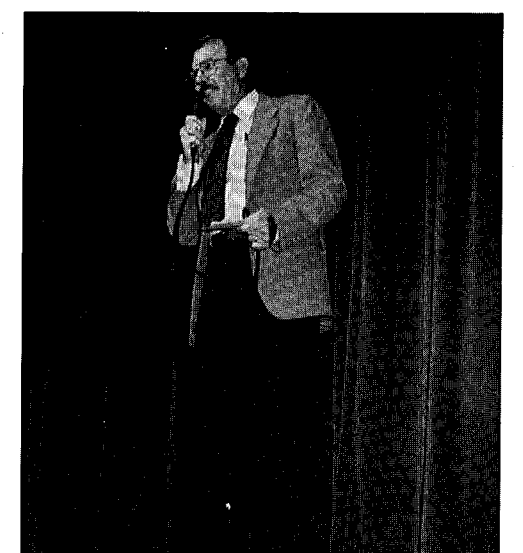

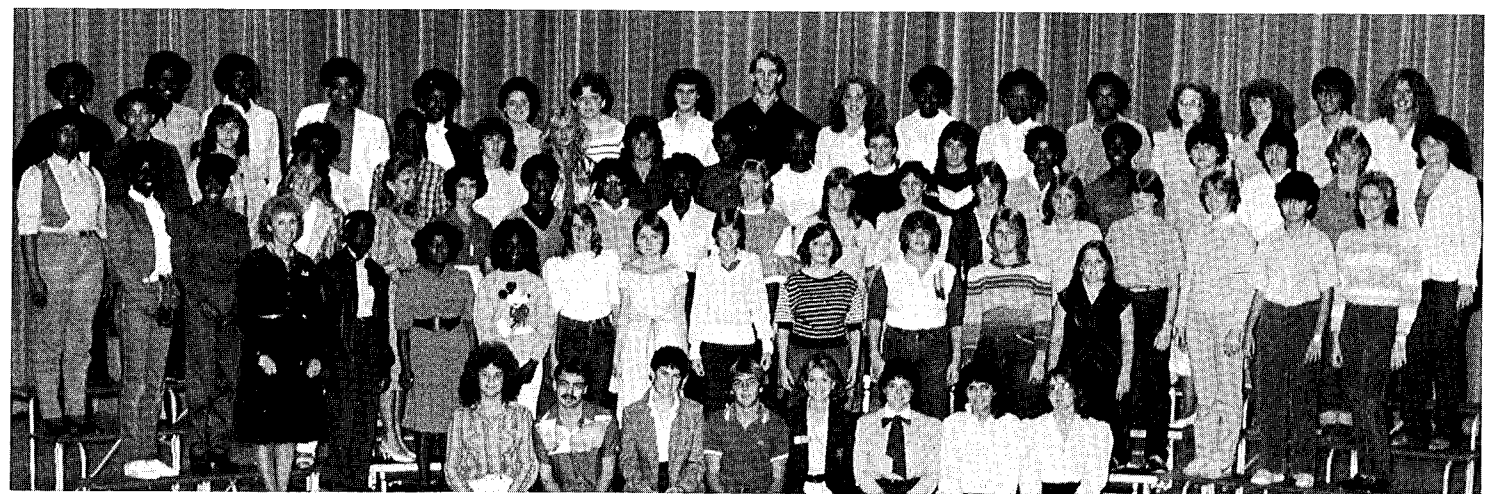

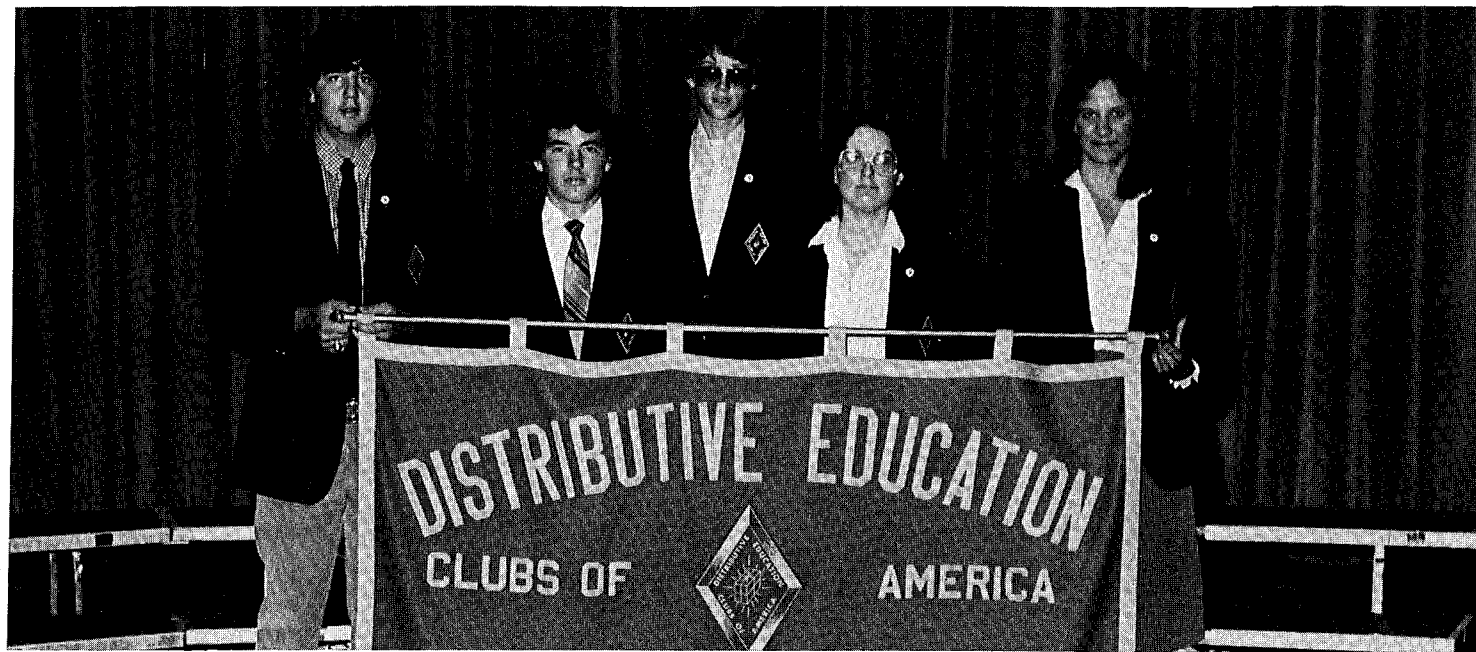

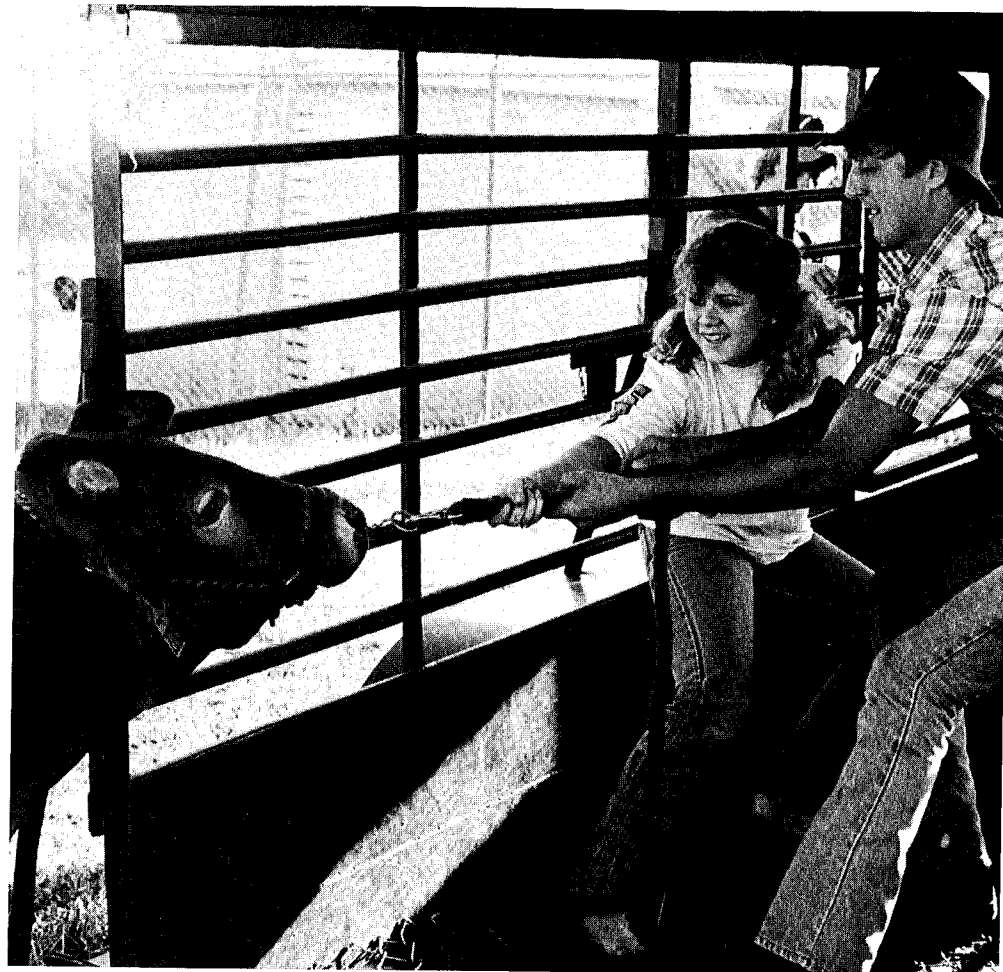

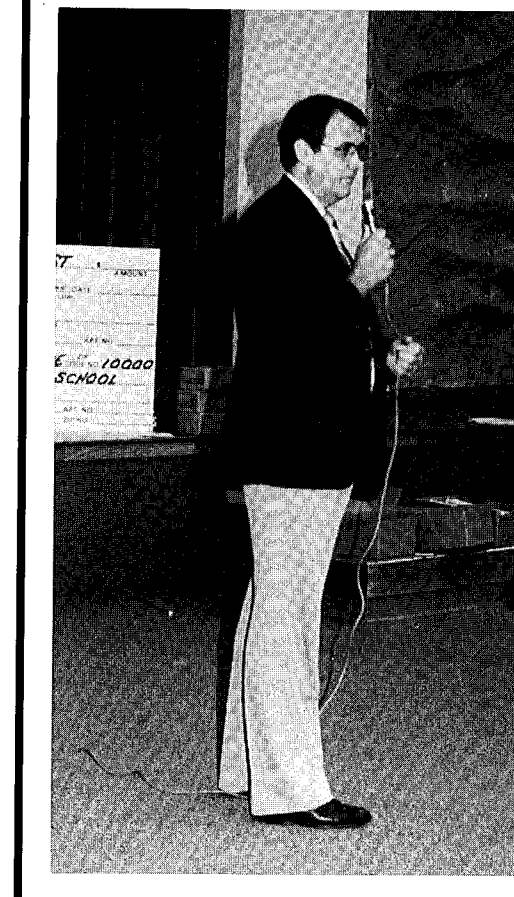

Workers Reach Their Goal

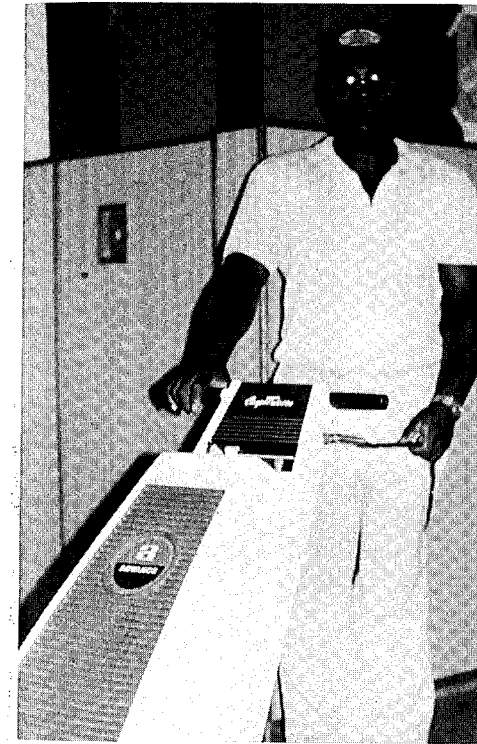

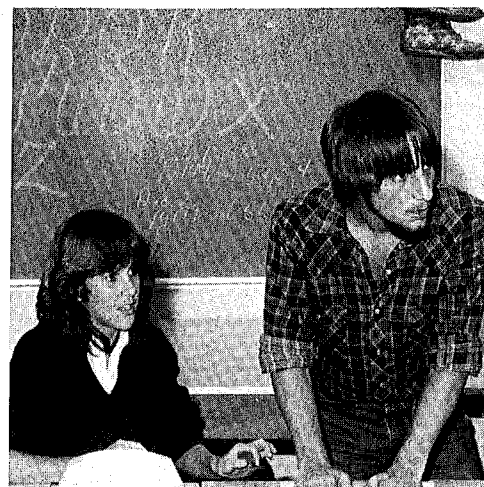

Material Processing Class Goes to Haines City

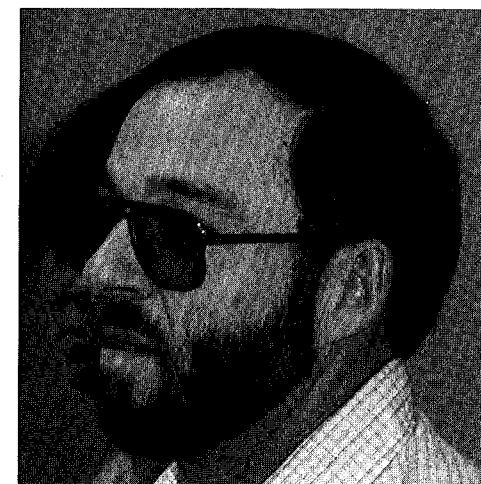
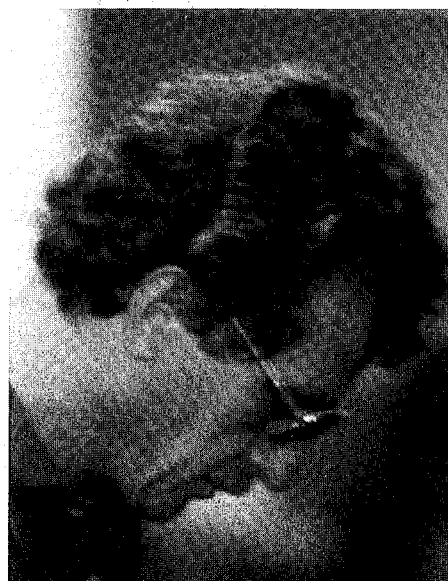

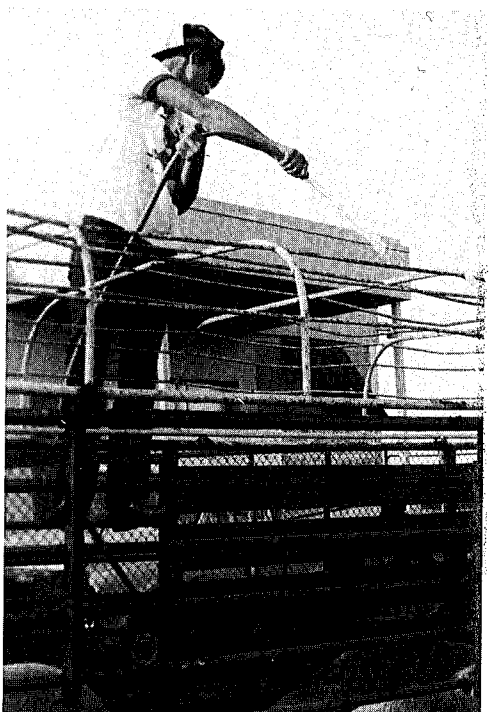

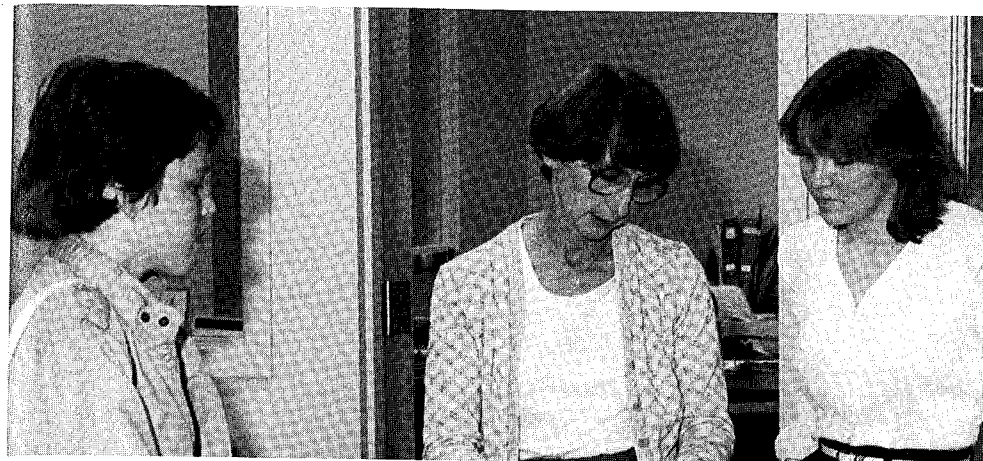
Media Checks Out

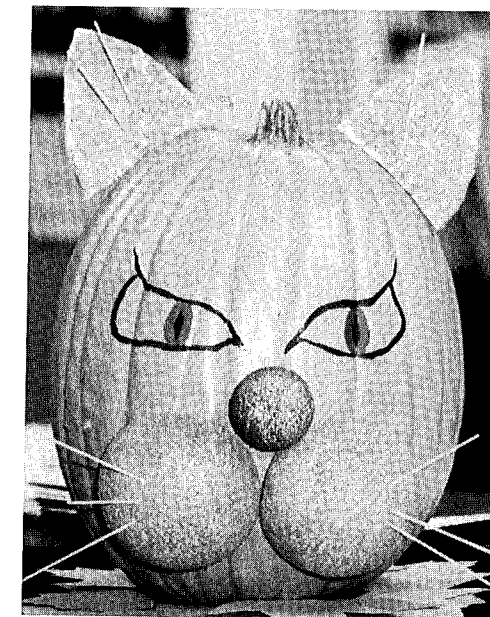

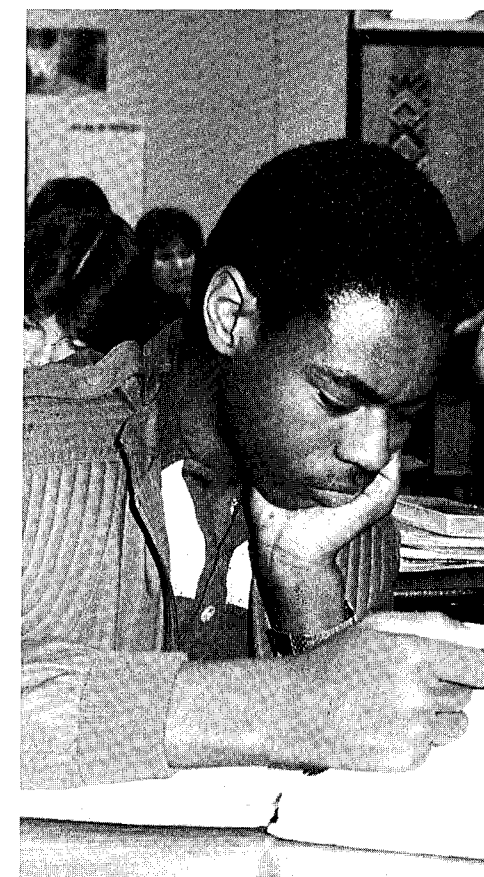

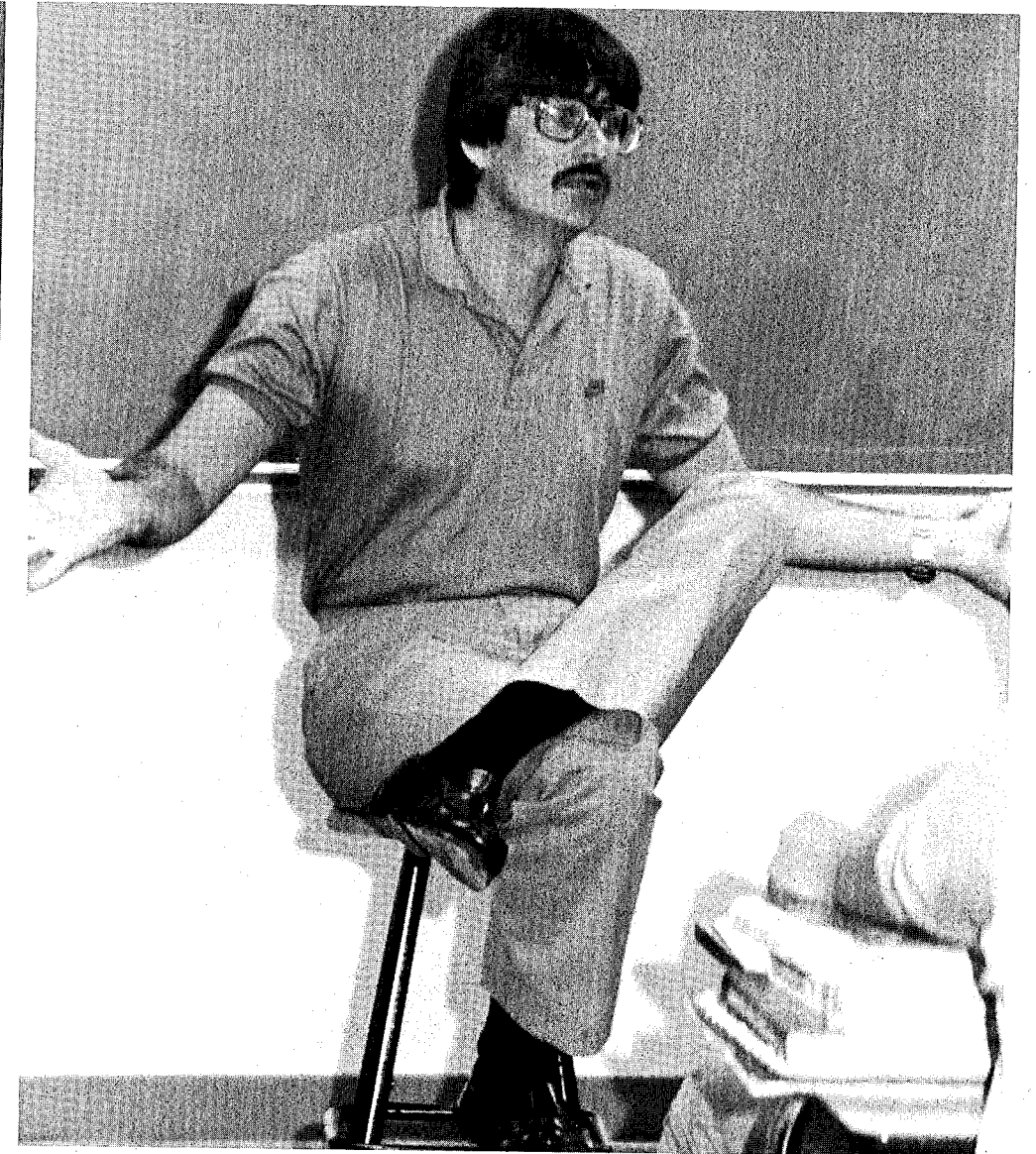
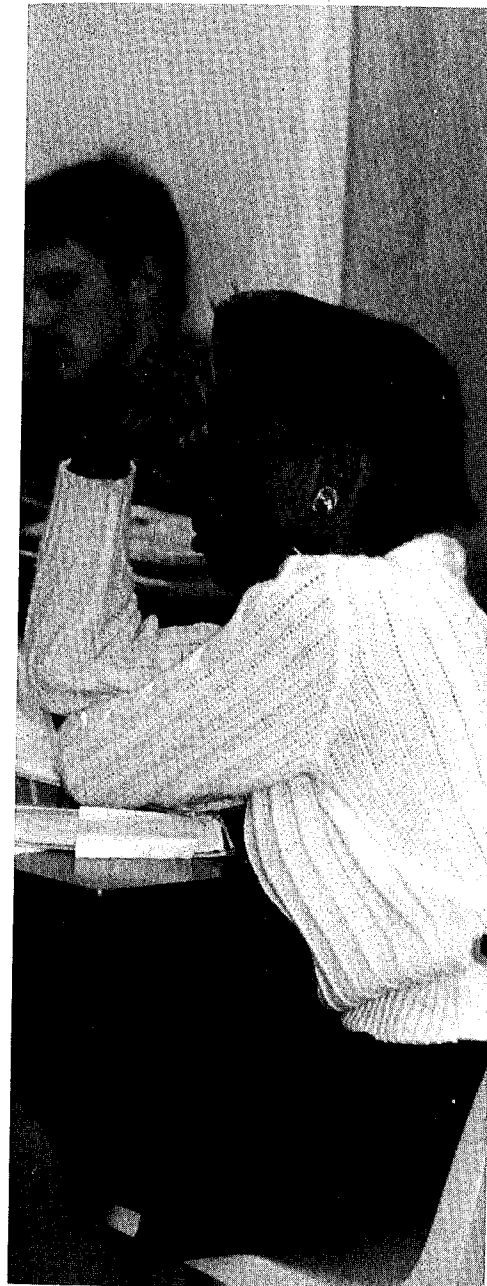
More Science!

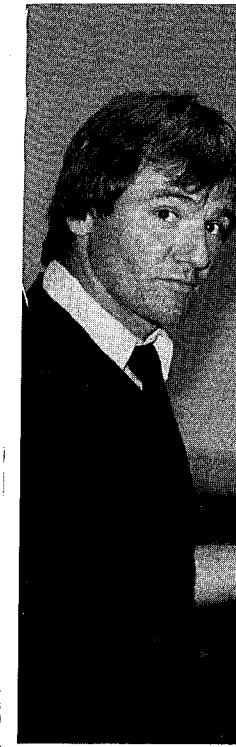


Vamos a Epcot!

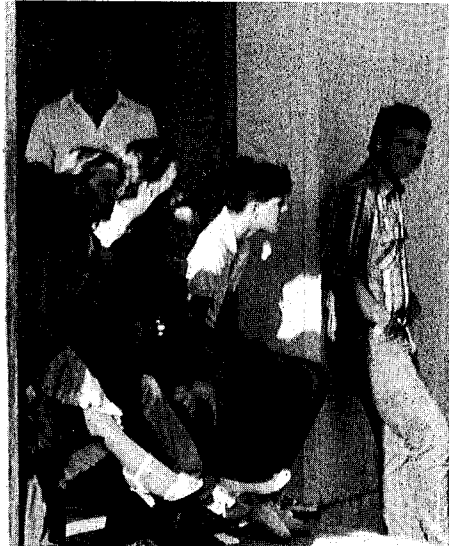
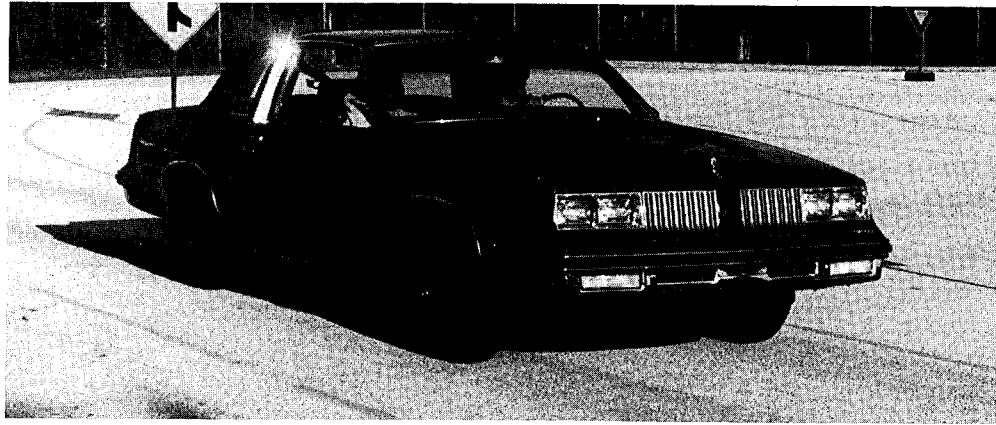
Driver Education Prepares Responsible Drivers

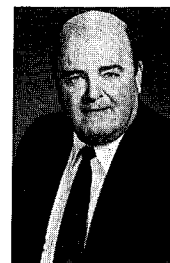

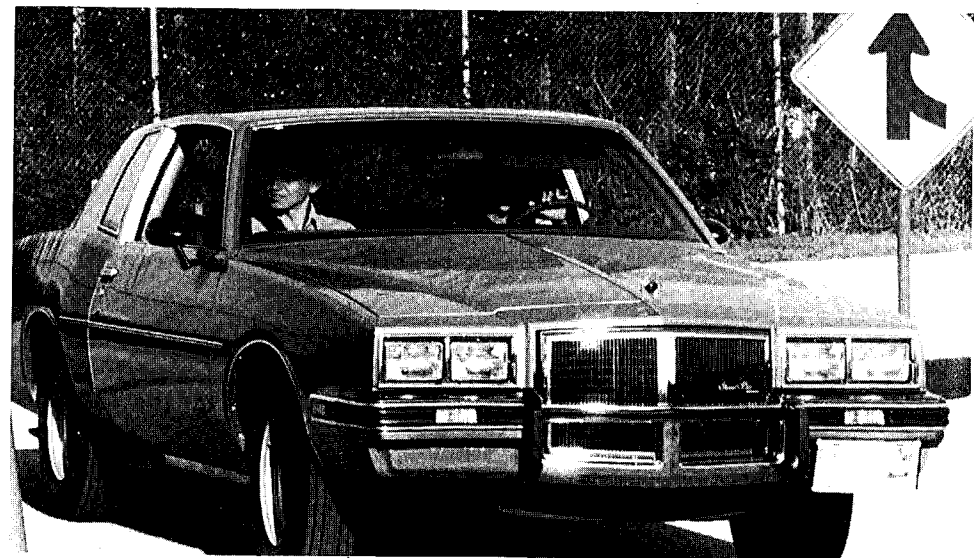

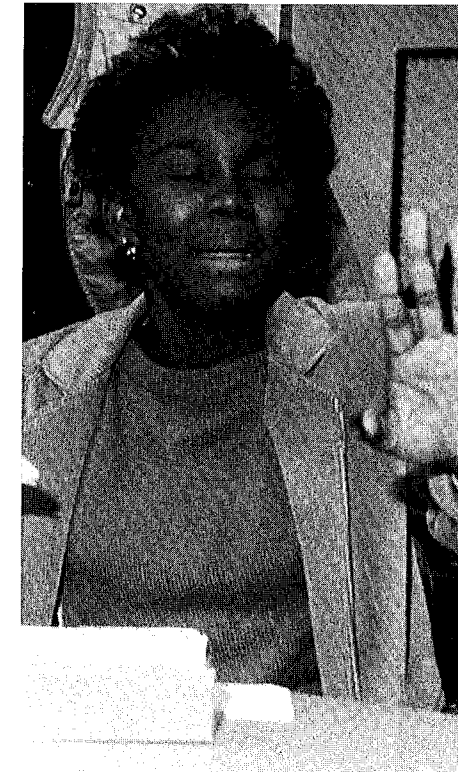


Students Learn About Business

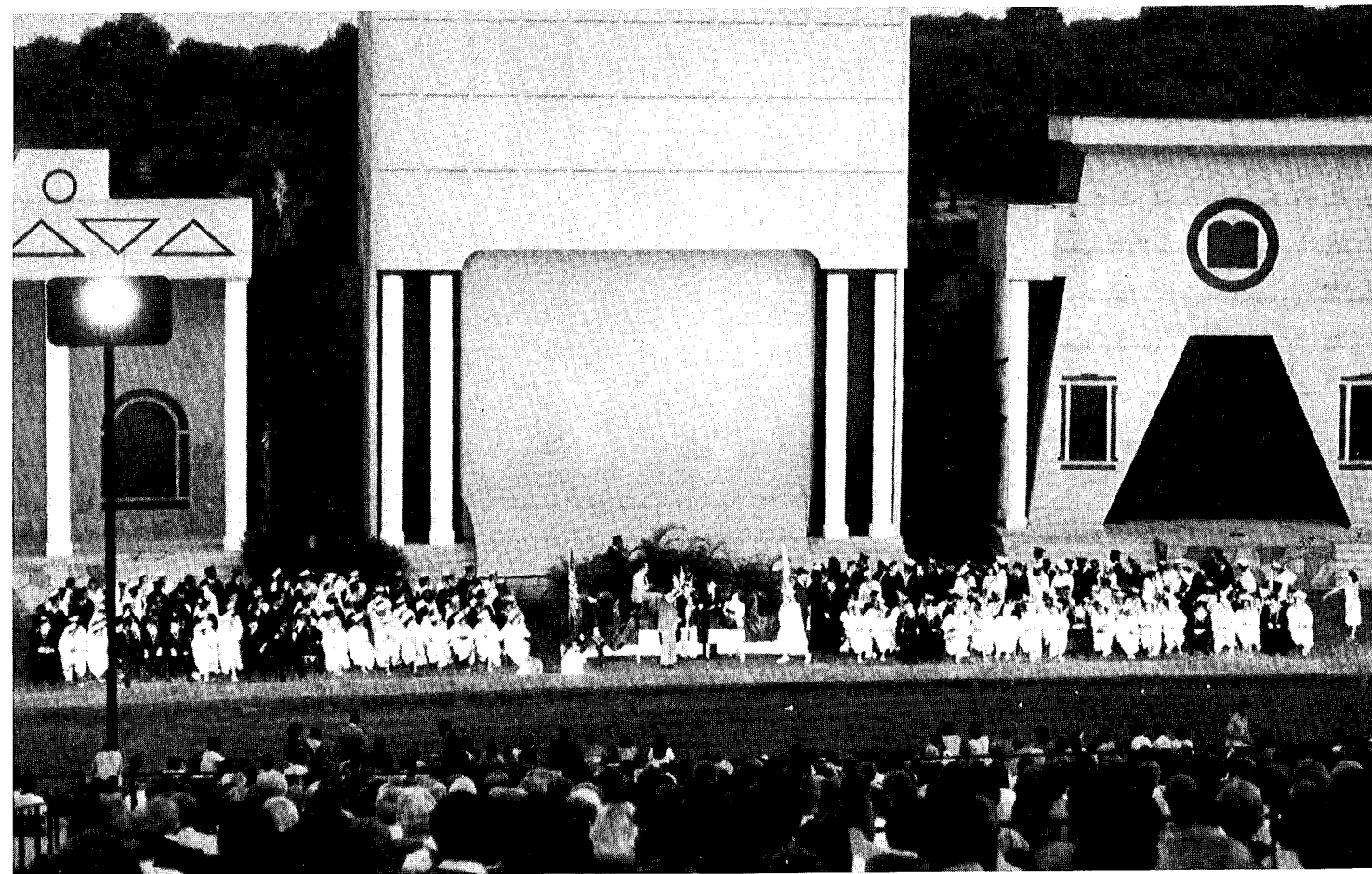
