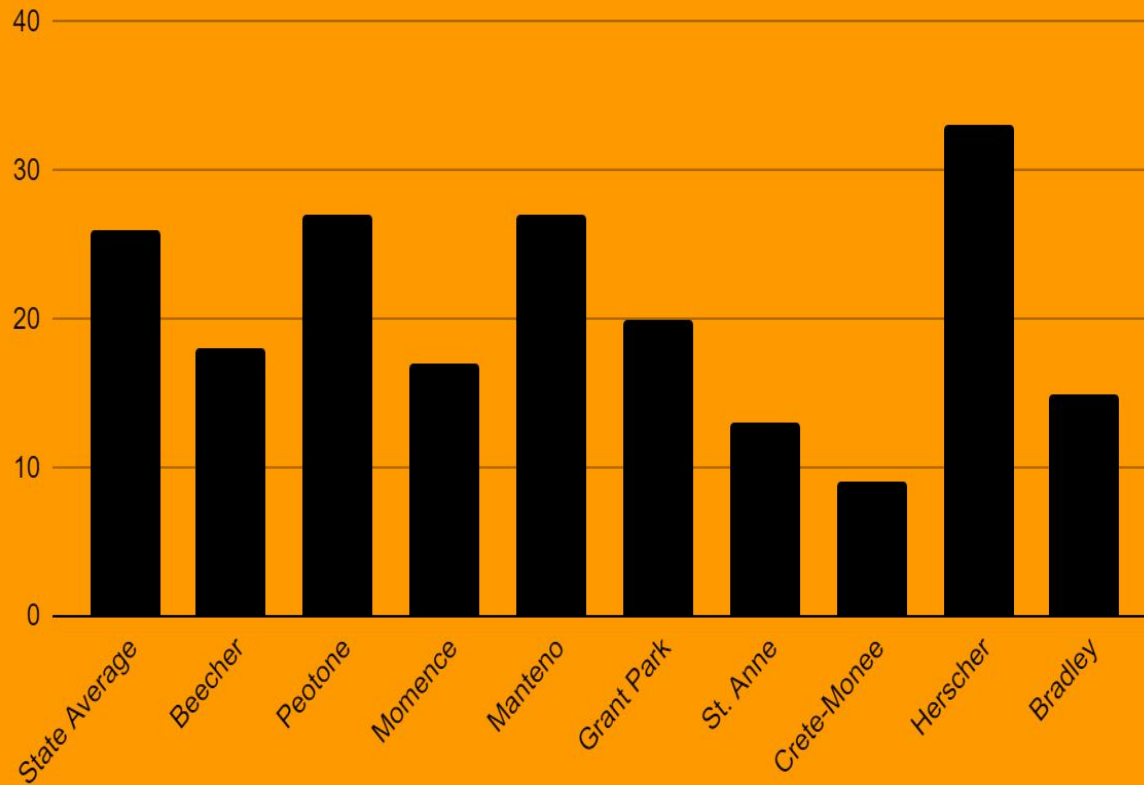

# What are we doing to improve scores?

## ▽ Overall

- We will start looking at the previous year's IAR data earlier in the school year.
- We have started using common plan times to allow special education teachers, the reading specialist, and grade level teachers time to discuss specific student and grade level concerns.
- We have looked at individual IAR tested standards to see what areas are low from last year, and to also identify any low areas over multiple years.
- Practice testing in larger testing sessions to get students used to longer testing blocks, more online IAR practice, look at new practice testing items.
- Testing only 1 test a day, therefore the testing will be more spread out over a 2 weeks period instead of a 1 week period.

## ▽ WIN

- This year, we have allowed grade levels to have more control over what their WIN times look like.
- In the weeks leading up to IAR, we will spend WIN time preparing for the IAR test.

## ▽ ELA

- We will be looking at the number of minutes we teach ELA at each grade level.
- We know more writing time is needed, especially at the 3rd-5th grades. This will be added to the schedule for next year.

## ▽ Math

- We will be looking into a new series next year, for the 24-25 school year.
- We have added additional math fluency programs to most grade levels.
