A special "Eclipse" snack was provided to the scholars in Mrs. Murray's class as the culminating activity.

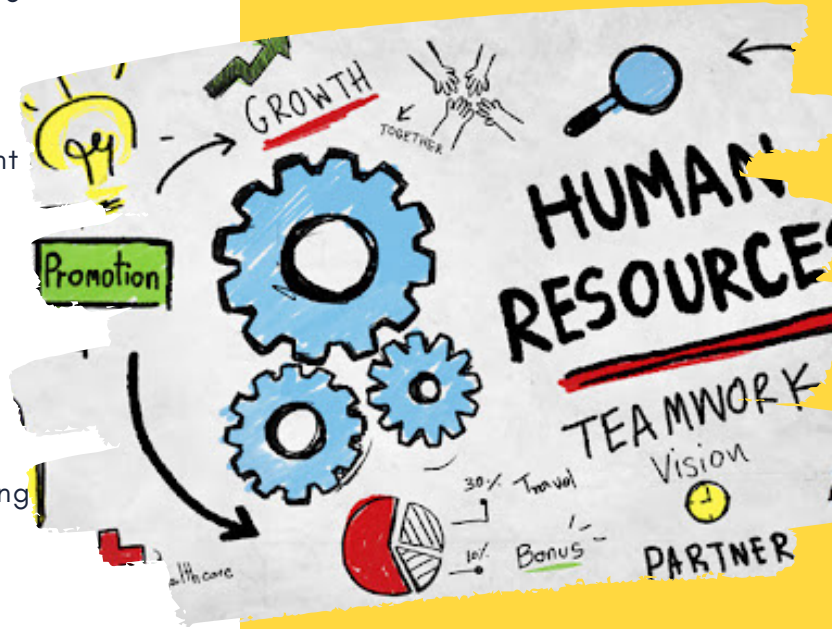

Our purpose is to provide excellent and accurate service and reliable information through financial reporting to ensure we maintain the ability to provide a quality education to all students.

In December, we were able to get our Annual Underground Storage Registration Certificate renewed. This certificate is to certify that our facility at our listed location has fully registered its Underground Storage Tank(s) (UST) with the state of Georgia which is with the Department of Natural Resources and the Environmental Protection Division (EPD).

In March, we had our annual school buses inspection done by the Georgia Department of Public Safety (GPS) for defects or anything that would be considered as out of service criteria. They inspected each bus to ensure that it is safe to transport our students daily. Later this spring, our bus drivers and bus monitors plan to cover emergency evacuation drills that consist of; the reasons to evacuate, the type of ways to evacuate, and instructions when evacuating with our students. As the school year is coming closer to the end, our bus drivers and bus monitors plan on finishing the school year strong by maintaining daily safe student transportation to and from school.

Our internal network infrastructure has been updated by replacing outdated equipment and network switches as well as all old camera hardware. With these upgrades we will reduce the risk of data breaches and cyber threats, ensuring a higher level of network security.

To ensure a smooth testing experience all student Chromebooks software were updated and applications were tested to make sure everything was in working order.

In order to enhance our cyber security, I wrote a grant proposal for round three of the Safer Georgia Schools Grant from the Georgia Department of Education. If awarded, these funds will be used to address cyber security vulnerabilities and enhance our overall cyber resilience. The grant will also support internal and external penetration testing, asset management and technology ticket support. Final notification of grant awardees will be announced in June.

The Stewart County Department for Exceptional Students takes pride in building capacity within our department by participating in professional development opportunities. Throughout this school year, select teachers from within our department have participated in monthly professional development sessions to build their knowledge and skills for the implementation of a new program that we are using, the SLANT System.

The SLANT System is a research based, Orton-Gillingham multisensory structured literacy method. This program is proven as effective reading instruction for all students, but specifically helps students with language based reading difficulties, or dyslexia. The program is also accredited with the International Dyslexia Association and endorsed by the Center for Effective Reading Instruction. As we continue to use this program, our department is excited to see a continued increase in student performance!

MENTAL HEALTH

The Impact of Social-emotional learning (SEL) and Attendance on a child's education

Social-emotional learning (SEL) is a methodology that helps students of all ages to better comprehend their emotions, to feel those emotions fully, and demonstrate empathy for others. These learned behaviors are then used to help students make positive, responsible decisions; create frameworks to achieve their goals, and build positive relationships with others. SEL is beneficial to both children and adults, increasing self-awareness, academic achievement, and positive behaviors both in and out of the classroom. From an academic standpoint, students who participated in SEL programs saw an 11 percentile increase in their overall grades and better attendance. On a more individual level, the skills learned within an SEL program have been shown to help students better cope with emotional stress, solve problems, and avoid peer pressure to engage in harmful activities.

A missed school day is a lost opportunity for students to learn. In this era of increased accountability for states, districts, and schools, the connection between student attendance and learning is being studied more than ever before. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career.

The combination of social-emotional learning and attending school regularly will have a great impact on a child's learning. As a community, we know that there may be some barriers along the way, but as the school social worker, my number one goal is to help parents obtain all resources available to help their children achieve academic success. I look forward to working with parents and community members to ensure that the goal is reached.

SCHOOL NURSE

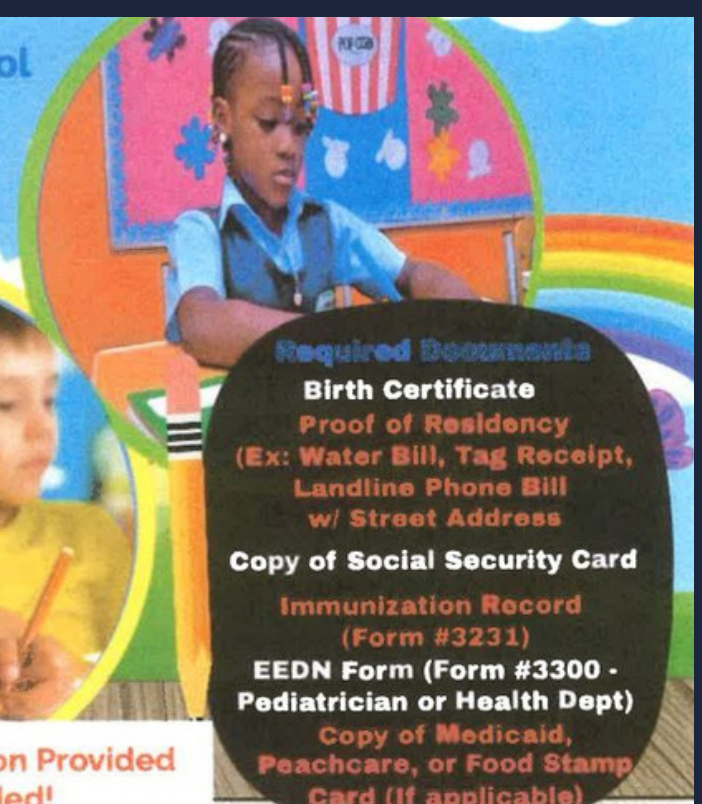
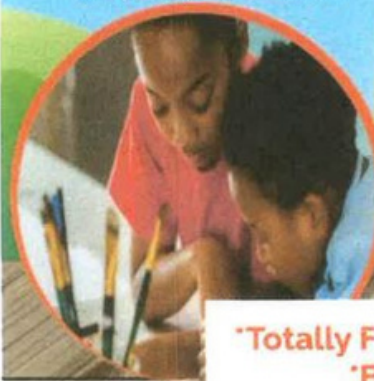

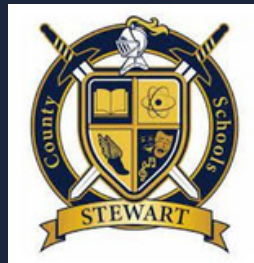
