6. Update by Mr. Alan Jones on projects.

Mr. Jones gave an update of projects starting with the Agricultural site and building. The building package is pretty much completed. The slab has been poured. The interior buildup was started and progress is continuing. They are working on the interior framing, electrical and water is in place. The site contractor said their goal was to be finished by the end of the week.

Mr. Jones stated he would probably do a final walk through tomorrow or Wednesday and he would send the final report to Mrs. Sparkman and Mr. Boring on that project.

Mr. Jones gave a summary of some of the projects that have been completed over the past four years.

First the softball field improvements an overall project budget scope. The initial contract for Angel's Construction was \$372,000.00. During construction there were some field changes for cost savings. The final payment was \$358,000.00 the total project cost was \$382,000.00. Softball Building originally was to be put out for a traditional bid. The numbers were coming in from \$500,000 to \$550,000 range and so the Board wanted to move forward with looking at different means of delivering that building with Brian Turner and partnering with TCAT. With that, you know, the Board gave Mr. Turner up to \$300,000 to get the building constructed. The building was done for \$220,961.00. This project came in well under budget. If you count the site cost, the total building package and design professional fees. The total price was around \$362,000.00. The entire was still less than the original bid for just the building. L

Football locker room renovations, the women's large restroom and the women's small rest and the men's restroom. Total budget approved by the Board was \$185,000.00 for those renovations. Total cost came in at \$147,696.00 for the projects.

Request to look at options for a practice facility for the soccer team and potentially flag football in the future. Several options were discussed.

A motion was made to for Mr. Jones to schedule concept and opinion of probable cost for September for approval by the Board. Construction documents approved to bid by January Board meeting. Contractor under contract in March of 2025
